- Vocational education is education that prepares people for a skilled craft as an artisan, trade as a tradesperson, or work as a technician. It is instruction intended to equip people for industrial or commercial occupations. It can be obtained either formally in trade schools, technical secondary schools, or in on-the-job training programs, or more informally, by picking up the necessary skills on the job. It is designed for learners to acquire knowledge, skills and competencies specific to a particular occupation or trade or class of occupations or trades. These projects need to show that the exhibitors have demonstrated mastering the skills in their chosen field.
- Vocational Education projects are for individuals 9 to 18 years old as of January 1st.
- Exhibitors **MUST** enter a individual still exhibit **ALSO** to participate in the Vocational Education class and the Siskiyou Golden Fair. If the exhibitor has entered a Market Animal along with the Vocational Education Project, only **ONE** still exhibit is required.
- Exhibitors are **REQUIRED** to sign up for “barn duty” in the project area to be available to oversee the projects and answer questions.
- Projects must have an informational card turned in with the exhibit identifying themselves, their project and their affiliation – 4H, FFA, Grange, Independent. This card **MUST** be removable from the project.
- Receiving a blue ribbon and deemed consumer ready will be eligible for the auction administered by the 10th DAA Junior Livestock Auction Committee.
- All exhibitors entering a vocational education product must attend the 10th District Junior Livestock Auction meeting prior to the fair and sign up for “barn” duty at the designated project area.
- Eligible entries must be declared by noon on Friday of the fair at the Livestock Office.
- One (1) project per exhibitor in this category will be eligible for the live auction in addition to a livestock entry in the live JLAC Auction. A 3% sale commission will be assessed for all live auction entries.
