


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Directions to the Fairgrounds: The South Florida Fair is located off Southern Boulevard in West Palm Beach, FL, 1.5 miles west of the Florida Turnpike and 1 mile east of 441/SR7.

From I-95: Exit #68 at Southern Blvd. Go west approximately 7 miles to Sansbury's Way. Exhibitors Gate 4/6 is on Sansbury's Way, south of the amphitheatre.

From Turnpike: Exit #97 in West Palm Beach. Go west 1.5 miles to Sansbury's Way. Gate 4/6 is on Sansbury's Way, south of the amphitheatre.

INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS & EXPOSITIONS (IAFE) NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers or absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following are list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership, and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of, consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the laboratory, to which it is sent, is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.





5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only, and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expos and any special notices to members.
11. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

5C-4.0015 Definitions.

For the purposes of this chapter the following definitions shall apply:

- (1) Accredited Veterinarian. A veterinarian licensed in the state of origin and accredited by the United States Department of Agriculture, Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (USDA, APHIS) to perform certain functions of the federal and cooperative-state-federal programs in accordance with the provisions of Title 9 Code of Federal Regulations 9 CFR §161.1 (JAN 2018), which is hereby incorporated by reference and available online at <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10035>.
- (2) Animal(s). This term shall include: be as defined in Section 585.01(10), F.S., which provides that the term "animal" shall include wild or game animals whenever necessary to effectively control or eradicate dangerous transmissible diseases or pets which threaten the agricultural interests of the state.
- (3) Authorized Representative. An employee of the state or federal government, or a licensed veterinarian accredited by the USDA, who is authorized to conduct animal disease control and eradication activities.
- (4) Commercial Production Swine. Swine that have been subjected to and found negative on their most recent annual brucellosis and pseudorabies tests and have been continuously managed with adequate facilities and practices to prevent exposure to any transitional or feral swine and so recognized by state animal health officials.
- (5) "Domestic animal" shall include any equine or bovine animal, goat, sheep, swine, domestic cat, dog, poultry, ostrich, emu, rhea, or other domesticated beast or bird.
- (6) Exhibition. Any premises displaying or presenting livestock to the general public for an animal exhibit or animal show at an event sponsored by the state or county.
- (7) Group. One or more Animals maintained on the same premises or in contact with one another.
- (8) Horse. Any horse, mule, ass, zebra or other equidae.
- (9) Isolation. Separation of individual Animals by a physical barrier in a manner that assures one Animal does not have access to the body, excrement, or discharges of another Animal; does not share a building with a common ventilation system; and is not within ten feet of another Animal.
- (10) "Livestock" means grazing animals, such as cattle, horses, sheep, swine, goats, other hoofed animals, ostriches, emus, and rheas which are raised for private use or commercial purposes.
- (11) Market Class. An exhibition class consisting of finished fed Animals that are isolated and housed separately from all Animals not designated for slaughter immediately following the exhibition.
- (12) Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI). A legible record or certificate made on an official form from the state of origin or from the USDA, or a Department-approved electronic format, issued and signed by veterinarians licensed and accredited in the state of origin for the purpose of certifying the Official Individual Identification, test requirements, and health status of specific Animals for movement, exhibition, and other designated purposes.
- (13) Official Individual Identification. An individual Animal identification that uniquely identifies the Animal, the owner, the premises where the Animal was identified and the state in which the Official Individual Identification was applied and:
 - (a) For Cattle:

1. Is approved by the United States Department of Agriculture in accordance with 9 C.F.R. §86.4(a)(1) (2013), as incorporated in Rule 5C-31.006, F.A.C.; or

2. Is submitted to and verified by the Department as meeting the requirements for Official Individual Identification such that state officials can determine the herd in which the Animal was officially identified.

(b) For Livestock Other than Cattle:

1. Tattoos and registered brands such as ear, tail-web or flank tattoos, breed registration tattoos when accompanied by breed registration papers; or an official breed registration brand when accompanied by a brand registration certificate;

2. Official leg or wing bands for poultry;

3. Color digital images or notarized color photographs of the Animal, signed by an Accredited Veterinarian; or

4. Implanted electronic chips with a unique number that is recorded in a single, central database.

(14) Official test. A test conducted by a method approved by Department rules for the specific disease and Animal species.

(15) Poultry, Domestic Fowl or Ratites. Chickens, turkeys, quail, pheasants, chukars, peafowl, guineas, ratites (limited to ostriches, emus and rheas) and waterfowl that are propagated or maintained for commercial or breeding purposes.

(16) Segregated. To maintain a Group of Animals separate from another Group of Animals in such a manner as to prevent physical contact between Animals of the two Groups.

5C-4.0016 Applications, Cards, Forms, Other Official Documents Required and Fees.

(1) USDA. Equine Infectious Anemia Laboratory Test VS Form 10-11 (MARCH 2014). An official USDA, APHIS, VS form required for submitting samples and reporting results of Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) tests. Equine Infectious Anemia Laboratory Test VS Form 10-11 (MARCH 2014) is hereby incorporated by reference and can be found online at <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10036>.

(2) Division.

(a) Official Certificates of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI). These certificates are provided only to Florida-licensed Accredited Veterinarians and may be obtained as provided in subparagraph 5C-4.0016(2)(a)1., F.A.C. Depending on species and purpose (sale or movement), the following are Florida-recognized OCVI:

1. Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, FDACS-09000 Rev. 06/17; for use with all species, in association with movement or sale. Cost is \$65 per book of 25 certificates. Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, FDACS-09000 Rev. 06/17 is incorporated by reference in Rule 5C-24.003, F.A.C.

2. Official Equine Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, FDACS-09002 Rev. 04/17; for use with equine, in association with movement or sale. Cost is \$65 per book of 25 certificates. Official Equine Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, FDACS-09002 Rev. 04/17 is incorporated by reference in Rule 5C-24.003, F.A.C.

(b) Equine Interstate Passport Card, FDACS-09207 Rev. 08/18 is incorporated by reference in subsection 5C-3.003(5), F.A.C., is an official card provided by the Department to the Horse owner, which certifies the existence of an official negative EIA test within the previous 12 months and a valid Florida Official Equine Certificate of Veterinary Inspection for interstate movement for exhibition purposes in states which accept the card. The document is valid for six (6) months provided the conditions in paragraphs 5C-3.003(5)(a)-(f), F.A.C., are met. The Equine Interstate Passport Card is not acceptable for change of ownership purposes. It may be applied for by submitting an Application for Equine Interstate Passport Card, FDACS-09219 Rev. 12/09, to the Division with the associated fee of \$15.00 for the first equine and \$5.00 for each additional equine on the same application. Application for Equine Interstate Passport Card, FDACS-09219 Rev. 12/09 is incorporated by reference in paragraph 5C-3.003(5)(e), F.A.C.

(c) Negative EIA Test Verification Card, FDACS-09160 Rev. 08/18, is an official document provided by the Department to the Horse owner to show proof of a negative EIA test within the previous 12 months, for purposes other than change of ownership. The document is valid for 12 months from the date the blood was drawn and is renewable annually with an associated fee of \$5.00 per application (Card). The Negative EIA Test Verification Card may be applied for by submitting the Application for Negative EIA Test Verification Card, FDACS-09206 Rev. 10/05. Negative EIA Test Verification Card FDACS-09160 Rev. 08/18 is hereby incorporated by reference and can be found online at <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10037>. Application for Negative EIA Test Verification Card, FDACS-09206 Rev. 10/05 is hereby incorporated by reference and can be found online at <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10038>.

(d) Equine Event Extension, FDACS-09051 Rev. 03/06, an official document provided by the Department to the Horse owner, which certifies the existence of an official negative EIA test within the previous 12 months and a valid Florida Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. Equine Event Extension, FDACS-09051 Rev. 03/06 is incorporated by reference in subsection 5C-3.003(5), F.A.C. The document is valid for six (6) months provided the conditions in paragraphs 5C-3.003(5)(a)-(f), F.A.C., are met. It may be applied for by submitting the Application for Equine Event Extension, FDACS-09078 Rev. 09/17, to the Division as referred to in subsection 5C-3.003(5), F.A.C., with the associated fee of \$10.00 for

the first equine and \$5.00 for each additional equine on the application: Application for Equine Event Extension, FDACS-09078 Rev. 09/17, is hereby incorporated by reference in paragraph 5C-3.003(5)(e), F.A.C.

5C-4.0017 General Requirements, Exemptions and Limitations.

(1) Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI) Required. Animals presented for exhibition purposes in Florida, unless specifically exempted, must be accompanied by an OCVI issued by a veterinarian accredited in the state of origin.

(a) The OCVI must be complete including the breed, sex, and registration number, and the Official Individual Identification of each Animal.

(b) Results of a specific test requirement or herd accreditation, certification or validation number for each Animal must be recorded on the OCVI with the date of the test or herd accreditation, certification or validation.

(2) Expiration of Required OCVI.

(a) For Florida-origin Animals an OCVI is valid for 90 days from the date of issue; or until the expiration date of any required tests, whichever is the earliest date.

(b) For Animals imported into Florida for exhibition purposes only, the OCVI is valid for 30 days, except that, for an equine imported into Florida using a current Equine Interstate Passport Card, FDACS-09207 Rev. 07/05, or equivalent from the state of origin signed by the State Veterinarian or chief animal health official, the OCVI will be extended to the date of expiration of the Equine Interstate Passport Card or its equivalent of the state of origin.

(3) Exemption to Required OCVI. An OCVI is not required for Animals originating in Florida and entered in Market Classes provided that Animals are Segregated from other Animals and the pens are occupied only by the Animals in a Market Class. Pens used for Market Classes must not be reused until after cleaning and disinfecting.

(4) Inspection Required. Prior to immediate acceptance at an exhibition, all animals presented for exhibition must be visually inspected by an Authorized Representative for:

(a) The required Official Individual Identification of the Animal; and

(b) Clinical signs of disease including, but not limited to: caseous lymphadenitis, blisters/ulcers around the mouth, nostrils, coronary band, pinkeye, pox, scabies, lice, ringworm, atrophic rhinitis, or multiple warts that are clearly visible; and

(c) Evidence of compliance with Animal tests and OCVI requirements, where required.

(5) Animals Rejected for Exhibition.

(a) Any Animal in noncompliance with Animal tests and OCVI requirements, or

(b) Any Animal not meeting the Official Individual Identification requirements, or

(c) Any Animal which is suspected of having or showing clinical signs of dangerous transmissible, contagious or infectious disease on visual inspection, or any Animal which is known to be exposed to such diseases must be:

1. Immediately withdrawn from exhibition and returned to the place of origin, or

2. Examined by a Florida-licensed Accredited Veterinarian at the owner's expense within 24 hours, who certifies by a signed, written statement, that the Animal is free of dangerous transmissible, contagious or infectious disease and pests.

5C-4.001 General Requirements and Limitations.

Rulemaking Authority 585.002(4), 585.08(2)(a), 585.145(2) FS. Law Implemented 585.08(2)(a), 585.145(1), (2) FS. History–New 7-1-71, Amended 8-7-77, 9-30-80, Formerly 5C-4.01, Amended 4-17-89, 1-19-95, 6-4-95, Repealed 6-21-06.

5C-4.002 Cattle or Bison.

(1) OCVI Required.

(a) Florida-origin cattle or bison moved for exhibition must be accompanied by an OCVI dated not more than 90 days prior to exhibition.

(b) Cattle or bison imported from other states for exhibition must be accompanied by an OCVI dated not more than 30 days prior to exhibition.

(2) Test or Certification Required.

(a) Tuberculosis.

1. Florida-origin cattle or bison may be entered for exhibition without a tuberculin test.

2. Imported dairy cattle may be entered for exhibition provided they have a negative caudal fold tuberculin skin test within 60 days prior to the date of the exhibition; except that, dairy cattle from an Accredited Herd as defined in Bovine Tuberculosis Eradication, APHIS 91-45-011 (Jan. 2005) and originating in Tuberculosis-Free States, are exempt from this test requirement. Bovine Tuberculosis Eradication, APHIS 91-45-011

(Jan. 2005) is hereby incorporated by reference and available online at <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10086>.

3. Imported beef cattle or bison may be entered for exhibition without a negative caudal fold tuberculin skin test provided they originate from Accredited Tuberculosis-Free States or Herds. Otherwise, they must meet the requirements in subparagraph 5C-4.002(2)(a)2., F.A.C.

(b) Brucellosis.

1. Test Required. Cattle or bison, six (6) months of age or older, must have evidence of a negative brucellosis test within 30 days prior to the date of exhibition.

2. Exemption from Required Brucellosis Test.

a. Steers and spayed heifers; and

b. Cattle or bison originating from a Certified Brucellosis-Free Herd as defined in 9 CFR §78.1 (JAN 2018), which is hereby incorporated by reference and available online at <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10040>, or a Brucellosis Class Free State or Area which when certified, the OCVI must show the certified herd number and the date of the last herd certification test; and

c. Cattle or bison from non-quarantined herds originating from Class A State or Area provided that the cattle are under 18 months of age.

(b) Swine imported for exhibition must comply with the importation requirements set forth in Rule 5C-3.007, F.A.C.

(2) Tests or Certification Required for Breeding Swine.

(a) Brucellosis.

1. Swine imported for exhibition must comply with the importation requirements set forth in Rule 5C-3.007, F.A.C., Florida origin swine six (6) months of age or older must be negative to an official test for brucellosis within 90 days prior to exhibition, or

2. Originate from a Validated Brucellosis-Free Swine herd as defined in 9 CFR §78.1 (JAN 2018), which is incorporated by reference in Rule 5C-4.002, F.A.C., or

3. Originate from a Commercial Production Swine Herd as defined in subsection 5C-4.0015(4), F.A.C.

(b) Pseudorabies. Swine imported for exhibition must comply with the importation requirements set forth in Rule 5C-3.007, F.A.C. Florida origin swine six (6) months of age or older must be negative to an Official Test for pseudorabies within 90 days prior to exhibition, or

1. Originate from a Qualified Pseudorabies-Free Herd as defined in 9 CFR §85.1 (JAN 2018), which is incorporated by reference and available online at <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10043>, or

2. Originate from an Approved Commercial Production Swine Herd as defined in Rule 5C-21.018, F.A.C.

(3) Exemptions. Swine for exhibition as Market Class swine are exempt from the OCVI and test requirements provided that all swine in the class go directly to slaughter following the exhibition.

(4) Isolation. Breeding swine returning to the farm from exhibitions must be Isolated from other swine for at least 30 days before being returned to the herd. Breeding swine for exhibition must be maintained in Isolation between exhibitions or move directly between exhibitions.

5C-4.004 Poultry, Domestic Fowl or Ratites.

(1) OCVI Required. An OCVI is required for Poultry, Domestic fowl or Ratites for movement into Florida, but not specifically for exhibition. However, Poultry, Domestic fowl or Ratites presented for exhibition without an OCVI, must be inspected as provided in subsection 5C-4.0017(4), F.A.C.

(2) Test or Certification Required. All poultry or domestic fowl entered for exhibition must originate from Pullorum-Typhoid Clean flocks or hatcheries, as provided in 9 CFR §145 (Jan. 2018) and §147 (Jan. 2018), or have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to exhibition. 9 CFR §145 (Jan. 2018) and §147 (JAN 2018) are hereby incorporated by reference and available online at <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10045>.

(1) OCVI Required.

(a) Florida-origin goats or sheep presented for exhibition must be accompanied by an OCVI dated not more than 90 days prior to presentation, except lamb or kids less than three months of age and accompanied by their dam.

(b) Goats or sheep imported into Florida for exhibition must be accompanied by an OCVI completed within 30 days prior to exhibition.
(2) Identification. All goats or sheep entered for exhibition purposes must have an Official Individual Identification in accordance with the Scrapie Eradication Uniform Methods and Rules, APHIS 91-55-079, June 1, 2005, except lambs or kids under three months of age with official identification as defined in paragraph 5C-4.0015(13)(b), F.A.C., or accompanied by their dam. Scrapie Eradication Uniform Methods and Rules, APHIS 91-55-079, June 1, 2005, is hereby incorporated by reference and available online at <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10161>.

(3) Test or Certification Required.

(a) Tuberculosis Test. All dairy goats six (6) months of age or older imported for exhibition purposes must originate from an Accredited Tuberculosis-Free Herd as defined in 9 CFR §77.5 (Jan. 2018), or have had a negative caudal fold tuberculosis test within 90 days prior to exhibition. When originating from Accredited Tuberculosis-Free Herds, the OCVI must show, the accredited herd number and the date of the last herd accreditation test.

(b) Brucellosis Test. All dairy goats six (6) months of age or older imported for exhibition purposes must originate from a Certified Brucellosis-Free Herd as defined in 9 CFR §78.1 (Jan. 2018), or have had a negative brucellosis test within 90 days prior to exhibition. When originating from a Certified Brucellosis-free herd, the OCVI must show the certified herd number and the date of the last herd certification test. Bovine Tuberculosis Eradication, APHIS 91-45-011 (JAN 2005) is hereby incorporated by reference in subparagraph 5C-4.002(2)(a)2., F.A.C.

(c) Exemption From Test Requirements. There are no tuberculosis or brucellosis test requirements for meat type goats or Florida-origin dairy goats.

(a) An original owner's copy of a VS Form 10-11 (March 2014);

(b) A laboratory certified copy of a VS Form 10-11 (March 2014);

(c) A legible photocopy of a VS Form 10-11 (March 2014);

(d) An Equine Interstate Passport Card, FDACS-09207 Rev. 07/05, or equivalent of the state of origin signed by the State Veterinarian or chief animal health official; which may be applied for by submitting the Application for Equine Interstate Passport Card, FDACS-09219 Rev. 12/09;

(e) A Negative EIA Test Verification Card, FDACS-09160 Rev. 07/05, or equivalent of the state of origin signed by the State Veterinarian or chief animal health official; which may be applied for by submitting the Application for Negative EIA Test Verification Card, FDACS-09206 Rev. 10/05, or

(f) A Department-approved electronic EIA form containing clear, color digital images.

(3) Exemption to Test Requirement. A foal under six (6) months of age accompanied by its dam which has met the EIA test requirement is not required to have an EIA test.

ANIMAL WELFARE POLICY

The purpose of the South Florida Fair's Livestock Committee is to address all issues of animal care including:

- Appropriate care and management of animals while on the South Florida Fairgrounds by exhibitors.
- Educational programs for exhibitors and the general public.
- The philosophy of the South Florida Fair in regards to animal care and management.
- Handling expressions of concern for animal care from the public.

PHILOSOPHY STATEMENT

The South Florida Fair is an animal welfare advocate requiring the humane treatment of animals. Animal welfare advocates continue to expand their knowledge base about animals, their behavior, and their management as science and technology dictate. Animal welfare advocates celebrate the bond between animals and humans.

IN CONTRAST, animal rights activists seek to sever any bond between humans and animals. Most animal rights activists believe animals should only be admired from afar, without human intervention. A large fraction of the movement is also pushing for animals to be given the same rights and status as humans. Animal rights activists fundamentally believe animals should not be utilized to feed, clothe, assist, entertain, or benefit humans.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ALL EXHIBITORS

1. All entries and awards in all livestock departments shall be subject to the rules and regulations published in the premium book. Each exhibitor must complete, in its entirety, an entry form, W-9 and submit online to receive premium monies. A paper entry form is not required if you have submitted successfully online.
2. Entries close: December 1 for paper entries. A \$10.00 fee will be collected per exhibitor for paper entries mailed in, paper entries must be **POSTMARKED BY DECEMBER 1**. All fees must be paid at time of submission. *If fee is not included, entry will be returned.* **ALL** online submissions will have an extended deadline until **Midnight December 13**. No emailed or faxed entries will be accepted. Any entries received without required entry fees will be returned.
3. Substitutions for up to two (2) animals will be accepted at check-in. **This does NOT apply to Market animals.** These substitutions must be on a paper entry form and show the deleted and substituted animals. If the exhibitor does not have the appropriate paperwork, the substitutions will not be accepted. **ALL STUDENTS ENTERED IN THE SOUTH FLORIDA FAIR YOUTH SHOWS MUST HAVE COMPLETED THE ETHICS TRAINING WORKSHOP OR HAVE A CURRENT ETHICS NUMBER BEFORE JANUARY 1 TO SHOW AN ANIMAL AT THE SOUTH FLORIDA FAIR.**
4. All animals must have a current and valid health certificate upon arrival. All warts must be removed prior to arrival on fairgrounds.
5. Special rules for the special needs exhibitors will apply.
6. Youth exhibitors cannot be under the age of 8 or over the age of 19 as of January 1 current year, depending on the animal they are showing (see rules per livestock). Youth exhibitors must also be attending school or be enrolled in a certified home school program. Youth exhibitors who have graduated from high school or obtained their high school G.E.D. are not eligible to compete in youth shows (unless breed show rules supersede). **MARKET PROGRAM PARTICIPATION REQUIRES PROOF OF SCHOOL ENROLLMENT.**
 - a. Protest Procedures: All protests must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$100.00 cash or certified check, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such a protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to Show Committee within twenty-four (24) hours after the occasion for such protest. Protest must be signed by three

exhibitors.

b. Order of hearing or protest: 1. Show Chairman. 2. Action by Show Chairman. 3. Final action by Livestock Committee.

c. All rules and regulations that have been properly protested to the Show Chairman and the Livestock Committee shall be subject to the following penalties:

1. Loss of premium money.
2. Loss of awards.
3. Suspension from showing that animal as deemed necessary. Penalty may be for one, two, or three shows, or as long as deemed necessary for the offense.
4. Suspension of the exhibitor.

Failure to adhere to each show's specific rules shall also be subject to these penalties. Specified protest procedures must be adhered to by all exhibitors.

7. Disqualifications: Any exhibitor who has been disqualified from competition in any livestock show or has premiums withheld or withdrawn on the grounds of rule violation(s), will not be allowed to compete in other shows. This shall include, but is not limited to, disqualification for fraud, misrepresentation, unethical fitting or deception. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation, and depending on the basis of the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is completed. No complaint or appeal that a judge overlooked an animal, will be considered. If any exhibitor, in any way, whether in person or by their representative, interferes with the judge(s), or shows any disrespect to them or to show officials, the existing show may excuse him/her from the ring and exclude him/her from further competition; premiums that may have been awarded may also be withheld. If an animal is disqualified after having won awards or premiums, the animals placing below him may be moved up at the option of the Livestock Committee, to fill the vacated position.
8. Effective August 17, 2000, the Board of Trustees of the South Florida Fair and Palm Beach County Expositions, Inc. voted there would be absolutely no animal sales to the public, with the exception of those amended by the Board, during the annual Fair. Rules and regulations have been revised to reflect this Fair Board action.
9. The IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics, the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services guidelines for Admission of Animals for Exhibition and the South Florida Fair shall govern the competitions at the South Florida Fair.
10. Except as otherwise permitted by law, NO DOGS are allowed in any exhibit building unless they are properly identified as service dogs, or scheduled for a demonstration or competition.

The Florida State Fair, along with many other Fairs throughout the State of Florida, believes that every youth exhibitor should receive proper training and information for raising and showing a youth animal project.

It is important that the exhibitors understand:

- The purpose of youth livestock projects
- The importance of ethics in youth livestock projects
- Proper animal handling and management
- The difference between animal welfare and animals rights
- Be prepared to be an ambassador for animal agriculture

The Youth Livestock Show Ethics and Animal Care Workshop is designed to certify students to meet the mandatory certification requirements that will be in effect for the 2022 Florida State Fair. Certifications are valid for three (3) Fair seasons, not 3 calendar years.

BEEF CATTLE SHOWS - RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Owners are responsible for care, management and feeding of their own animals. If not, there will be a \$15.00 per day charge per animal. There will be no animal sales at the South Florida Fair, other than those selected for the Youth Market Auction.
2. Animals must be shown in their respective age classes and exhibited accordingly in their classes by age.
3. Cattle will be bedded on sand, plus initial bulk shavings will be provided.
4. Registration numbers must be entered on Fair entry forms. Copies of registration papers must be uploaded along with entry. If registration papers are pending, upload a note for pending.
5. Tack space will be assigned as space allows per exhibitor.
6. Exhibit area and tie-out area must be cleaned of all materials, except sand, before release form and premium voucher are issued.
7. There must be at least five animals of the same breed, and at least three different exhibitors entered to hold a show.
8. Only service dogs are permitted on grounds.
9. No water tubs are to be placed in aisles. No hoses will be allowed across aisles.
10. Entry forms must be filled out completely. Indicate if you plan to make entries in group classes, but it is not necessary to name the animals which make your group until after judging of the individual classes. Entries in group classes must have been exhibited previously in individual classes. Please indicate sire/dam's name and registration number.
11. All breeds must comply with breed association rules. Please see the respective breed association websites for rules and regulations.
12. All animals must have a suitable halter and be **DOUBLE** tied in the bedding areas. **Neck ties required.** All animals must be halter broken to be exhibited.
13. Neither the local interests participating in the sponsorship of the show, nor any of the personnel, shall be responsible for any accidents or errors that may occur. However, every effort will be made to provide for the safety and comfort of the exhibitors and their cattle.
14. Tampering with any animal, such as injecting with a foreign substance, etc., is prohibited. The use of tranquilizers on show animals after arrival at the Fair is considered a form of tampering.
15. Beef cattle must be in the barn by specified times on check-in days.
16. **CATTLE WILL BE RELEASED BY BARN BOSS.**

Additional youth rules:

17. **ALL STUDENTS ENTERED IN THE SOUTH FLORIDA FAIR YOUTH SHOWS MUST HAVE COMPLETED THE ETHICS TRAINING WORKSHOP OR HAVE A CURRENT ETHICS NUMBER BEFORE JANUARY 1 TO SHOW AN ANIMAL AT THE SOUTH FLORIDA FAIR.** NOTE: While most Florida fairs have adopted this ethics program, the rules governing the exhibitors differ from fair to fair. 19. Youth exhibitors must show their own animals in both the show and showmanship. Youth exhibitors cannot exhibit more than two animals per class and must have ownership of the animal(s) for at least 30 days prior to the show, unless otherwise stated in their respective breed association rules.

YOUTH DAIRY CATTLE SHOW FITTING AND GROOMING CONTEST

Thursday, January 27, 2022 • 6 p.m.

Eligibility: (age as of January 1, current year)

1. There will be a Junior, Intermediate and Senior Contest: JUNIOR: 8-11 Years, INTERMEDIATE: 12-14 Years, SENIOR: 15-18 Years
2. The Fitting and Grooming Contest will be held in the Livestock area. Youth participating in the Youth Dairy Show on SATURDAY, January 29, 2022, are eligible for the contest. Participants do not have to own animal they are clipping, however the animal being used MUST be entered in the show.
3. Awards will be provided by the South Florida Fair.

Rules & Regulations:

1. Each participant must furnish one dairy animal to be used. While there are no age requirements on the animal, it is suggested that the animal be at least a junior yearling.
2. The animal must be clean and dry upon entering the ring for the contest.
3. Since nose tongs will not be allowed in the contest, all animals are required to be clipped from, and including, the head and upper half of the neck, before entering the ring. The remaining part of the animal MUST be unclipped. Hooves should be trimmed as well.
4. Grooming chutes are not required, however, use is encouraged. Grooming chutes are not supplied by the Fair.
5. Each individual will have 1 1/2 hours to complete clipping of the animal.
6. Any help from outsider to an individual will result in an immediate disqualification.
7. Any questions concerning rules and regulations should be directed to the show superintendent. All decisions will be made by the superintendent and the committee.
8. Anyone not cooperating with the superintendent or committee will be disqualified and forfeit any prize money or award.

Scoring:

A team of two to three judges will evaluate each entrant and the animal. Each animal will be inspected before entering the ring. Observation during the contest and final evaluation of the groomed animal will be accounted for as a part of selecting the winning participant.

Scorecard:

(20 PTS) 1. Condition and thriftiness: Showing normal growth, being neither too fat nor too thin.

(30 PTS) 2. Grooming: Hair properly groomed and clean. The hide soft and pliable. Hair dressing should not be used in excess. Hooves trimmed and shaped to enable the animal to walk and stand naturally.

(30 PTS) 3. Clipping: The hair is properly clipped to show the animal to the best advantage. The hair is well blended and areas are free of clip marks. The animal has an overall smooth appearance.

(20 PTS) 4. Cleanliness: Hair and switch are clean and free from stains. Hide and ears are free of dirt, and legs and feet are clean.

Entry Information and Rules:

1. Entry fee is \$20.00, CASH ONLY, at the time of registration. Entry forms will be available at the dairy check-in beginning at 1 p.m. on January 27. The show must have a minimum of 20 head entered in order to proceed.
2. All livestock rules, general, local, state and those associated with the South Florida Fair Dairy Show, will also apply to the Jackpot Show - including dress code. There will be no animal sales at the South Florida Fair, except at the Youth Market Auction.

ADGA RULES SHALL GOVERN

All rules and regulations of the South Florida Fair and IAFE will be observed. These rules can be found online and in the Ag office.

Health Requirements specified in the General Rules and Regulations found in this book, must be met. Doe(s) must be free of contagious and/or infectious diseases and/or external parasites including ringworm, lice, and signs of caseous lymphadenitis, as well as its clinical symptoms defined as enlargements of the lymph nodes, whether draining or not. Presenting an unhealthy animal at arrival, subject to the ruling of the South Florida Fair and/or the State Veterinarian, results in herd disqualification. For further rules and regulations that must be adhered to see 5C-4.005 Goats & 5C-4.007 Sheep in the

FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE & CONSUMER SERVICES Rules of the State of Florida CHAPTER 5C-4 in the front portion of the Premium Book.

A registration or recordation certificate is required for animals six months of age or older. A duplicate application stamped by ADGA, or the original certificate is required for animals under six months. Animals without papers cannot be shown. Animals may not be entered in any name other than that of the owner of record. ADGA Leases are recognized as valid ownerships for the South Florida Fair. A copy of the original lease agreement must be submitted with the entry form.

Champion Challenge: Permanent Champions must have their certificate updated by ADGA with the CH or GCH designation before showing in the Champion Challenge Class. (REMINDER: ANY alteration to a registration or recordation certificate except as made by the ADGA office renders the certificate NULL AND VOID).

Clipping: No full body clipping! Exhibitors are responsible for immediately cleaning clipping area.

Tattoos: ADGA rules state animals must be tattooed before registering or recordation with ADGA. All dairy goats must have legible tattoo that matches the tattoo on the registration or recordation certificate, or stamped duplicate application certificate. Should the judge find an unreadable tattoo or one that does not match the animal's registration certificate, or stamped duplicate application, premium money and awards will be forfeited. The animal will not be permitted to show in any other classes.

HORNS: All dairy goats (including kids) must be dehorned, disbudded or naturally polled. No disbudding or de-horning, is permitted on the South Florida Fairgrounds.

Entry Form Deadline - December 1, 2021 - Paper Entry

Each owner/exhibitor must completely fill out a separate official entry form, including class numbers and official ID's for each breed. Group class entries must be entered along with regular classes.

Online entry will have an extended deadline of December 13 at midnight.

Paper entries must be postmarked (not metered) or hand delivered to the South Florida Fair on or before December 1, 2021.

Entry Fee: Flat Rate of \$15.00 per animal. No fees for Group Classes. Fees must accompany entry form. A paper entry form is not required if

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you have submitted successfully online.

Entries close: December 1 for paper entries. A \$10.00 fee will be collected per exhibitor for paper entries mailed in, paper entries must be POSTMARKED BY DECEMBER 1. All fees must be paid at time of submission. ALL online submissions will have an extended deadline until Midnight December 13. No email or faxed entries will be accepted. Any entries received without required entry fees will be returned.

Substitutions: May be made through January 20, 2022. Please contact Show Chairperson regarding your change requests.

No ADDITIONS will be accepted after Entry Form Deadline: December 1, 2021.

Refunds: No refunds will be distributed.

Animal Registration Check-in: ADGA rules state: The document for that animal to be shown must be handed to the Show Official who shall **READ** it and **COMPARE** its information to what's on its entry form and **VERIFY** the information on both.

NOTE: ABSOLUTELY NO FOR SALE SIGNS PERMITTED. Penalty for a posted FOR SALE sign will be immediate removal of said exhibitor and animals. No animal sales at the South Florida Fair, except at the Youth Market Auction.

General Information: ALL pens will have a clean sand base or rubber mat. Bedding is provided.

No pen take down required for release. Feed, hay, and other debris must be raked up and removed from the pens by the exhibitor.

Pre-Show Milk-Out None. Over distended udders will be severely discriminated against by the judge. Milk must be disposed of in an area designated by the South Florida Fair.

Exhibitor Dress Code for all Shows

All persons entering the show-ring and handling dairy goats in any classes shall be: clean, neat, and well groomed. Clean white shirt (can have farm name, logo and/or colored trim). Long white or black pants or skirt. Closed toe and heel shoes. If showing in many classes during the day, a change of show uniform may be necessary.

Exhibitor uniforms or attire NOT ACCEPTABLE (Will be ENFORCED): tight fitting knit shirts, pants, leggings, and/or leotards, tank tops, muscle shirts, halter tops, bare midribs, spaghetti straps, tube tops, see through, fish-net or any other transparent clothing, sandals, thongs, flip-flops, slide-ons, bare feet, open toe shoes, shorts or skorts of any kind, chore clothing, hats or caps of any kind, sunglasses.

The owner is responsible for care management and feeding of his or her own animals. Pen and tack space must be clean and sanitary at all times. All aisles to be cleared at all times.

Gate: It is the exhibitor's responsibility to make sure their animals are presented at the gate on time and in the correct class.

No dogs are allowed in the housing barn or show-ring unless they are properly identified as service dogs, or scheduled for a demonstration or competition.

Parents are responsible for the actions of their children. Unacceptable conduct, as determined by the South Florida Fair and the Livestock Committee, will result in expulsion from the grounds, forfeiture of premiums, and /or being barred from future participation in the South Florida Fair.

All goats for the Jackpot MAY arrive on January 20 between Noon and 4 p.m. and January 22 between 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. All Jackpot Goats will be weighed in at 4 p.m. on January 22, 2021.

Showmanship will be held on January 23 in the Agriplex arena, followed immediately by the Jackpot Goat Show. All market goats will be released by the Barn Boss after the shows. The show must have a minimum of five head entered in order to proceed.

Market Goat Show - Rules and Regulations

1. All animals must have an Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (health papers), issued by an accredited veterinarian, at time of check-in. Animals must be free of lice and are subject to the health requirements of the State of Florida. There will be no animal sales at the South Florida Fair, except at the Youth Market Auction.
2. All decisions made by the judge and show committee will be final.
3. All goats or sheep entered for exhibition purposes must have an official individual identification in accordance with the National Scrapie Eradication Uniform Methods and Rules, APHIS 91-55-066, June 1, 2005.
4. Animals must be does or wethers; no bucks will be allowed to show except Pygmy Goats.*
5. All wethers/market goats must have their milk teeth in place at the time of showing.
6. Wether/market goat classes will be divided according to weight and sex.
7. Number of classes and weight breaks will be determined by the show committee.
8. Any wether/market goat showing evidence of testicular tissue will be ineligible to show except Pygmy.
9. Exhibitors shall be responsible for the security, safety and care of their animals. Exhibitors are responsible for cleanup before being released.
10. Wethers and does are eligible for the show. Wethers and does will be shown separately. Winners from individual classes in both divisions will be brought back together to compete for the top five overall individuals.
11. Bracing goats is allowed.



ALL ENTRY FORMS, W-9, COPY OF BUYER LETTER AND BUYER CONTACT SHEET WILL BE SUBMITTED ONLINE. **Paper submissions are NOT accepted!** Please UPLOAD two pictures of the exhibitor and their animal. Two pictures are required, one of each side of the animal.
Steers must meet the 1000-pound minimum for check-in at the Fair in January. Steers must be 22 months of age or less at final weigh-in.
4. Upon SUBMITTING the entry form, the exhibitor agrees to abide by the IAFE (International Association of Fairs & Expositions) National Code of Show Ring Ethics and the rules listed in this book and online by the South Florida Fair.
5. Only one large market animal per exhibitor, and exhibitors must have a major role in the feeding and caring program of the animals. Exhibitor can only show their own animal, including showmanship.
6. Each exhibitor must write a minimum of **FIVE** buyer letters with **TWO NEW BUYERS**. 

1. Entries: ALL entries to be completed online by December 13.
2. A \$10.00 fee will be collected per exhibitor for paper entries mailed in. Paper entries must be POSTMARKED BY DECEMBER 1. All fees must be paid at time of submission. No email or faxed entries will be accepted. Any entries received without required entry fees will be returned. Substitutions for up to two animals will be accepted at the check-in table. These substitutions must be on a paper entry form and show the deleted and substituted animals. If the exhibitor does not have the appropriate paperwork, the substitutions will not be accepted.
3. The Open Poultry Show includes all adult exhibitors. The Youth Show includes all students. Exhibitors must also be attending school or enrolled in a certified home school program. Exhibitors who have graduated from high school or obtained their high school G.E.D. are not eligible to show in the Youth Show.
4. All birds must be owned by the exhibitor at least 90 days prior to the Fair, and each exhibitor or family member must CHECK IN AND COOP their own birds. NO DROP OFFS WILL BE ALLOWED!
5. Check-in for poultry exhibitors is from 2 - 5 p.m. on THURSDAY, JANUARY 13, 2022. Birds may be removed on Sunday, January 30, 2022 after the close of the exhibit. Tear down is not required. Early removal of exhibits shall result in loss of ribbons, premiums, and future showing privileges. There will be no animal sales at the South Florida Fair except at the Youth Market Auction. **Change out of birds is allowed on January 23 before 10 a.m.** if birds have been tested.
6. Showmanship birds check-in at 11 a.m. on January 16 (day of Showmanship) and may go home directly after showing. Birds may not co-mingle with exhibit birds.
7. All entries will be entered as singles in the following classes: COCK: Male bird, 12 months of age or older. COCKEREL: Male bird, under 12 months of age. HEN: Female bird, 12 months of age or older. PULLET: Female bird, under 12 months of age. EXOTIC FOWL: Turkeys, Peacocks, Pheasants, Guineas - all ages. WATERFOWL: Ducks, Geese - all ages. PIGEONS & DOVES
8. All eggs become the property of the South Florida Fair.

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3RD ANNUAL SOUTH FLORIDA FAIR 2022 OPEN MARKET RABBIT AND MARKET PEN COMPETITION

The single market rabbit is a rabbit, any gender, ideally between three and a half pounds and five and a half pounds. They must not be older than 70 days.


Premiums are: 1st place: \$50, 2nd place: \$35, 3rd place: \$20, 4th place: \$10, 5th place: \$5

Grand Champion in each category will be awarded an additional \$50 if there are more than five exhibitors in their category.

Market rabbits are judged for body type, condition, and uniformity by the American Rabbit Breeders Association (ARBA) Standard of Perfection. Their type must be meaty, with prime muscle condition. The market pen should be uniform in size, all the same color (if possible), and all the same breed.

The judges will balance the characteristics of type, condition, and uniformity in deciding which is the best entry.

The market pen and single market rabbit competition is a demonstration of the participant's ability to breed and raise (or purchase and raise) a market animal of ideal size and quality.

2022 SOUTH FLORIDA FAIR EQUINE EXHIBIT RULES

- 1. ALL HORSES MUST COMPLY WITH FLORIDA STATE RULES FOR ADMISSION OF ANIMALS FOR EXHIBITIONS, 5C-4.008. SEE GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS, ALL EXHIBITORS, IN FRONT OF PREMIUM BOOK.**
2. Display tables are available to horse-related organizations on a first-come, first-served basis. Display tables will be assigned after all requests have been submitted to the **Horse Committee**. In the case of more requests than tables available, a waiting list will be developed with consideration given to those clubs that were first on the previous year's list. The purpose is to promote specific breeds or organizations for equestrian benefit and/or education of the public. No advertising or fundraising by any organization that has not applied to be a booster for the **Equine Exhibit**.
3. Stalls are available on a first-come, first-served basis. A stall card must be on each stall relating to the horse in that stall. Card must include breed, owner, and emergency information. A COPY OF THE COGGINS MUST BE DISPLAYED ON STALL PER STATE AG INSPECTOR (owner address and private info may be redacted). Stalls must be cleaned out by exhibitor after every use, and are available at management's discretion.
4. Only exhibitors with completed signed release forms are permitted to handle or work any horse exhibiting on the fairgrounds. Anyone found in violation of this rule will be excused from the fairgrounds and any future activities in the same show year.
5. Exhibitors are responsible for acquiring exhibitor passes and trailer parking passes. Passes will not be issued until a completed and signed release form is submitted to the **Horse Committee**.
6. A vehicle towing a horse trailer is eligible for a parking pass and may park in the designated trailer parking area, if space is available. Vehicles not towing a horse trailer, with or without a parking pass, must park in general public parking areas.
7. There will be ABSOLUTELY no riding, walking, racing or standing of horses, mounted or not, in or around horse stall area, spectator area, inside show midway, entertainment area or ROADWAYS surrounding the horse exhibit area.
8. NO member of the fair-going public is permitted to ride or handle any horse on the fairgrounds.
9. No riding of horses with just a halter or rope unless part of an exhibition.
10. Mistreatment of animals is NOT allowed. The **Horse Committee** will take proper action against violators.
11. Exhibitors must remain with your horse while it is in the horse area, unless arrangements are made and approved by the **Horse Committee**.
12. Stalls in horse area must be cleaned regularly by exhibitor and as soon as your horse is removed at the end of your show. Aisles of the exhibit must be kept clean and clear of obstacles as required by fire safety.
13. No horse with visible signs of illness, fever, lameness, or unhealed injuries shall be exhibited. Only horses in good general health are allowed. Horse must be in show condition.
14. Proper show attire is required, to include proper footwear; no sandals or bare feet are allowed at any time. Speed events are NOT exempt.
15. Horses must be under control at all times.
16. NO DOGS will be allowed in or around horses, exhibitors, or the public, unless they are properly identified as service dogs, or scheduled for a demonstration or competition.
17. While performing, announcing, or manning a display table, or while having contact as an exhibitor with the fair-going public, an exhibitor may not possess or consume alcohol or be intoxicated or under the influence of drugs or other intoxicating substances. This rule will be strictly enforced, and violators will be dealt with immediately.
18. Youth participating in the Fair must be accompanied by a parent or supervising adult while in the horse area. Youth 16 years of age and younger must have and wear a proper safety helmet and footwear to the exhibit. Parents or supervising adults will be held accountable for the action of the youth entrusted in their care.
19. EXHIBITORS MUST ABIDE BY ANY AND ALL SPECIAL RULES POSTED IN THE HORSE TENT AREA.
Any violation of these rules and/or any conduct dangerous to people or horses will subject the individual to immediate dismissal from the fairgrounds and jeopardize any future activities in the horse exhibit. Any unethical action is considered a violation of these rules.

The South Florida Fair sponsors ribbons and premiums for 4-H youth competitions.

All 4-H premium vouchers must be cashed during the Fair. No vouchers will be accepted after the annual Fair ends.

Judging is based on the Danish system and the decisions of judges are final. Exhibitors are measured against defined standards, not against other exhibitors.

4-H members are also encouraged to participate in the other activities taking place at the South Florida Fair. There are community service and competitive opportunities in the areas of poultry, rabbits, horticulture, livestock, and several others. Please refer to the rest of the Premium Book for more details regarding the dates, times, rules, and regulations in these areas.

EXHIBITS

RULES FOR 4-H PROJECT EXHIBITS

1. Open to any Palm Beach and Broward Counties 4-H member 5-18 years of age who is officially enrolled by November 1 of the current 4-H year.
2. Youth must be enrolled in to exhibit entry. All entry information must be submitted to the 4-H office. Food entries must be **registered by 4 p.m. on Monday, November 24, 2021. General Exhibits must be registered by 4 p.m. on Monday, January 3, 2022.**
3. A 4-H member may enter no more than one exhibit per category including food and nutrition, for a total of eight exhibits. The only exception to this is vegetables. A youth may enter up to three different types of vegetables in the vegetable category, each as a separate exhibit. All exhibits must be entered by an individual, not a group.
4. All exhibits must be educational in nature, representing topics youth have learned from their project areas.
5. Project areas and their categories are listed on the following page.
6. All non-food exhibits must have an exhibit card securely attached and clearly printed or typed. The card must include name, club, exhibit category, and 4-H age.
7. Items must have been made or grown during the current 4-H year with the exception of horticulture exhibits.
8. All horticulture exhibits must have been planted or re-potted before October 13 of the current 4-H year. Horticulture exhibits must include both the common and scientific name of the plant(s).
9. All vegetable exhibits must have been planted or re-potted before December 1 of the current 4-H year.
10. In order to receive a Fair premium, youth must present their projects at designated judging event.

11. Food and nutrition exhibits must be accompanied by a recipe on a 3x5 inch card. Include name, club, category, and 4-H age on card.
12. For cookie, brownie, bar dessert, roll, and muffin entries, there must be six items on a plate for judging.
13. Food entries are limited to those for human consumption only. The exception is cake decorating. Either real cakes or styro foam forms may be used.
14. All food, vegetable, and cake decorating entries will be exhibited through photographs taken by 4-H staff during judging.
15. "Cake Decorating" is categorized under "Food & Nutrition."
16. Entries are not to exceed 11 inches in diameter or 14 inches in height. Collections may not be larger than 16x16x12 inches.
17. Drawings on lined notebook paper will not be accepted.
18. No live animals can be exhibited except in designated areas.
19. All photo entries must be mounted on cardboard, foam core or similar backing for display. Non-mounted photos will not be accepted.
20. Video vignette submissions must be between 1-6 minutes. Longer video requires prior approval from 4-H Agent.
21. Fair management and the Cooperative Extension Service are in no way responsible for exhibits while on display at the South Florida Fair.
22. All items must remain in place until the closing of the Fair at 8 p.m. All exhibits must be removed by February 2. Exhibits may be removed by the individual or an assigned club representative.

RULES FOR POSTER AND SCIENCE EXHIBITS

1. A single poster board or a single science board may be submitted in any of the exhibit categories below. Each entry will represent one exhibit.
2. Posters must be educational in nature, depicting information gained from a specific project.
3. Posters must be no larger than 24x36 inches.

Additional Rules for Science Boards:

1. Science boards must be on tri-fold boards, and must not exceed 36" x 48" in size.
2. School science fair tri-fold project boards will not be accepted unless the subject matter directly relates to the youth's 4-H project area.

RULES FOR 4-H CLOVERBUD EXHIBITS

1. Open to any Palm Beach & Broward County 4-H member 5-7 years of age who is officially enrolled as of November 1 of the current 4-H year.
2. Each member may only exhibit eight items following the rules listed in the previous sections.
3. Each member will receive feedback from the judges and a participation ribbon but not premium money, or a numerical judging result.
4. Cloverbuds are encouraged to enroll in the Discovering 4-H project.

The South Florida Fair Scholarship program's purpose is to encourage young people to pursue a higher education and/or trade. These scholarships will be paid as described in each category listed below. The South Florida Fair will award the following scholarships to qualified applicants selected by the Scholarship Committee. The Committee has the right to amend scholarship amounts as it deems necessary. Scholarships must be used within a 5-year period from date of award or will be forfeited back to the South Florida Fair.

9. Two letters of recommendation are required.
10. High School Transcript is required.
