

# 2021 St. Charles County Fair

## Open Home Economics Rules and Regulations

### GENERAL RULES

1. Entries will be accepted Monday, July 26, 6:30 p.m. – 7:30 p.m. and Tuesday, July 27, from 8:00-9:30 a.m. (free admittance both times). Judging will take place on Tuesday, July 27th.
2. **Entries will be accepted from St. Charles County and adjoining counties.**
3. Exhibitors are limited to one exhibit per class, unless otherwise specified. However, they may participate in as many classes as they wish.
4. All articles must be the work of the exhibitor. Must be made in August 2020 – July 2021.
5. Danish system of judging will be used for all exhibits. Each qualifying exhibit will be judged according to merit and receive a blue, red, or white ribbon. Only blue ribbon exhibits are eligible for the “Best of Show”, which will receive a rosette ribbon and \$15.00.
6. All decisions of the judges will be final.
7. All entries must remain on display until checkout on Sunday, August 1, 2021. Entries must be picked up on Sunday, August 1, 2021 from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Premium money will be available for pickup on Sunday, August 1, 2021 from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. along with exhibit release. **No Exceptions.**
8. The St. Charles County Fair Board and the members of the Open Home Economics committee are not responsible for exhibits left after 11:00 a.m. Premium money will not be mailed if it is not claimed by 11:00 a.m. on Sunday, August 1, 2021.
9. Violations of any of the above rules will result in forfeiture of any premium money won and future exhibiting privileges.
10. While measures will be taken to provide a secure display area, neither the Open Home Economics committee or the St. Charles County Fair Board will be held responsible for lost, broken, damaged, or stolen articles in exhibits.

**One Entry Per Class Note:** The miscellaneous categories are only for items that do not fit any other category in the Home Economics Listing.

# FOODS

1. No mixes allowed except where stated.
2. Amount required per exhibit is listed.
3. All jars must be clear, standard in size and clearly labeled.
4. All food entries must be made by the exhibitor.
5. All other entries must be exhibited on sturdy non-breakable containers. Specific containers may be listed under the appropriate food category.
6. Only clear wrap may be used.
7. **All food entries will only be accepted on Tuesday, July 27th, from 8:00-9:30 a.m.**

## **Breads**

1. Yeast and Quick breads should be plastic wrapped.
2. Breads are to be exhibited on a sturdy paper plate.
3. An exhibit will consist of ¼ loaf of bread or plate of 6 rolls.
4. Include two samples wrapped separately from the exhibit or placed in plastic sandwich bags.

## **PRESERVED FOODS**

1. All canned goods must be in standard canning jars, sealed with two-piece lids using appropriate heat processing, and less than one year old. Paraffin is not an acceptable seal. Bands should be in place for transporting jars but will be removed for judging.
2. Entries must be labeled with product name, date of preparation, processing method, length of processing time and recipe source. Entries with incomplete labels will be disqualified.

Example of a qualified label:

Snap Beans 7-2002

Pressure canned 10 pounds

25 minutes

University Extension Guide GH1454

3. All Foods must be canned according to 1989 or later USDA, University Extension, Ball or Kerr instructions.
4. Any Sign of spoilage, alteration from standard processing guidelines or lack of label information, will be basis for disqualification of the exhibit.
5. No Food will be sampled by judges.

2. Prints can be cropped to odd sizes. Print size must be no smaller than 5" X 7" and no larger than 8" x 12".
3. Prints must be adhered on top of a single mat board that is not larger than 11" X 14". Prints mounted on foam board or poster board will not be accepted. Mat board can be purchased at a local craft store such as Hobby Lobby, Michael's, etc.
4. Exhibits must be placed in a zip-lock style bag to protect from dust and moisture. Image will be removed from bag for judging and returned to bag for displaying purposes.
5. No framed prints will be accepted.
6. All prints must be original work of the exhibitor.
7. Professional printing is encouraged.
8. Photos entered in the "At the St. Charles County Fair" class, must exhibit photos taken at the 2020 St. Charles County Fair. Take pictures at this year's fair to enter next year.
9. There is a limit of 1 photo per class and a limit of 4 classes per exhibitor.
