She plans to dedicate her life to helping people around her and inspiring them to be the best version of themselves. Her teammate for all mounted functions will be *Dixie*, an AQHA mare that Mary describes as having "equal amounts of sass & class!"

WPRA to Recognize St. Paul Rodeo as a Winner of a 2022 Justin Best Footing Award

This award is determined by votes by the WPRA membership and Circuit Directors and represents their members' voices saying "thank you" for a job well done. The WPRA recognizes the top three rodeo committees in all 12 circuits as well as the most improved ground committee in each circuit. Committee awards provided by Justin include cash bonuses (ranging from \$350-\$1,000), plaques and, at certain award levels, a pair of Justin exotic boots. 

NEW PREMIUM SEATING IN SECTION "F"



It was October 1962 on Columbus Day when St. Paul experienced a cyclone windstorm with winds to 130 miles per hour which demolished one of our bleacher sections. In the spring of '63, that section was replaced under direction from then SPR President John McKillip, Sr. It is now 60 years later...and we have John's grandson, Director Sam McKillip, in charge of the construction project to replace those bleachers to the new and much improved section F. The Board of Directors are making plans for this to be phase one of replacing sections F and G, with section G plans to be in the near future.

Section F will offer premium stadium seats (\$60) in the lower rows and bleacher seats with backs (\$40) in the upper rows. Additional wheelchair accessible seating will also be integrated at the base of the west side. Plans are also designed for a cover to come later.
