YOUTH LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

- One (1) – Five (5) Day Admission wristband free with a minimum of an \$10.00 entry fee, this includes large and small animals.
- Exhibitors entering more than one (1) youth livestock department and an open class department will receive a wristband; no passes will be issued. Youth exhibitors entering in more than one department first half will be reviewed for pass allotments.
- One (1) Infield Parking Pass, for exhibiting half, per family, regardless of how many departments you are entering.....Free
- If more parking credentials are needed, they must be purchased.
- **Parent Discount Passes – First Half ONLY.** Parents may purchase a maximum of ten (10) passes at \$10.00 each; **only ten (10) passes may be purchased for youth exhibitor(s) per household, regardless of how many households are involved.** A Parent Discount Pass form is located on website at and must be submitted with payment on or before September 23rd. This offer will not stand as of September 24th. This is for youth livestock exhibitors only.
- **Exhibitor Restock Permit – 1st and 2nd half.** A temporary parking pass is available for parking behind the barns between the hours of 6:00am to 10:00am for unloading hay, straw, equipment etc. All vehicles must be removed from inside the grounds, to a parking area by 10:00am or they will be towed away. Please indicate on the discount passes form if you wish a permit. The permit is good only for the driver's admittance. Each passenger in the vehicle must have an admission pass.

FIRST WEEKEND RECEIVING:

Animal entry through Gate 11.

FIRST WEEKEND RELEASING:

Sunday, September 26th - see "Changeover" below. **Note: Subject to Change** All released cattle must be out of the barns by 10:00pm. Release for long hauls (500 miles & over): See Department Superintendent for arrangements.

CHANGEOVER:

Note: Subject to Change. Barn G will be closed on Sunday, September 26th @ 6:00pm; Banner line will go up at 6:00pm. To assure guest safety no access will be allowed in the livestock area once the banner line has been installed. We are hopeful that we may clear the barn and livestock areas of fairgoers by 6:00pm, at which time exhibitors may finish hauling their tack and decorations. Please do not start dismantling any displays or decorations until 5:30pm. Once this procedure is completed, we will have a general release with an estimated release time of 6:30pm. Please keep in mind that this depends on getting the barn areas cleared of fairgoers in a timely fashion. You will be informed by your Superintendent of a definite release time once management (Livestock Administrator, Joe Niemann) feels it is safe for everyone. Long hauls will be given consideration for an earlier release if it is safe to do so. Gators and drivers will be available to assist you in hauling your tack and/or display items.

MED -WEEK JUDGING: September 26 – 30, 2021

For Animals already entered into 1st or 2nd Half.

SECOND WEEKEND: Sept 30th – October 3rd

SECOND WEEKEND JUDGE: TBD

SECOND WEEKEND RECEIVING:

Thursday, September 30th @ 2:00am, or as soon as the barns are cleaned. Animals must be in place for Veterinarian Inspection by 10:00am. Animals arriving prior to 6:00am will be held in a holding area, unless prior arrangements with the Superintendent have been made. Wednesday night arrivals can be arranged with Superintendent before fair. Wednesday night arrivals will be held in holding area overnight and will not be able to enter the grounds until Changeover is complete.

Note: Subject to Change Animals will begin leaving on October 3rd @ 6:30pm. Same procedures as Changeover will apply.

OPEN BEEF CATTLE DEPARTMENT GENERAL RULES

Please also read the General Rules and Regulations of the Fair & Livestock Entry Requirements, with the following requirements:

- Bulls, one (1) year & older must be shown with a nose ring and two lead ropes. Bulls, one (1) to two (2) years must have a temporary nose ring when out of their barn stall.
- There must be at least ten (10) animals and two (2) exhibitors to qualify to be judged as one (1) breed. If not, the animals will be judged in "Other Breeds". If your breed is not listed and there are ten (10) or more animals, a separate category will be established.
- If your breed is listed, and you have less than ten (10) animals, that category will be eliminated, and the animals will be judged under Other Breeds.
- Only one (1) entry per exhibitor in each group class.
- Champion classes are not eligible for premiums.
- All entries must be full blood & papered unless otherwise noted.
- Classes must have at least two (2) in a class to qualify for premiums. A class with less than two (2) will be combined with the next appropriate class.
- Original registration papers must be available for examination; tattoos must be legible.
- Loading and unloading inside the barns is prohibited.
- Cattle are not to be walked out on to the track for loading. Cattle may only be loaded into trailers parked in the designated area behind the barns (east end) during the appropriate haul-out times.
- Cattle are also not allowed to tie up in the wash racks during haul-in. All cattle must be tied in the tie-out area. The wash rack is strictly to be used for washing only.

NOTE: Programs are not available for Beef Shows. Each individual Breed Association will be responsible for their own Program Booklets.

- All entries must be purebred or full blood.
- Entries in the group classes must also show in an individual class.
- Animals will enter the show ring in ascending order according to age, youngest to oldest.
- Classes with fewer than two entries may be dropped and any entries in that class may be placed into the adjoining class closest to that entry's age.
- Females with calf at side will show in Class 11, regardless of age. The calf may not be more than 240 days old when shown and calves more than 120 days old must be registered with their Association. Must be natural calf and cow must be wet.

- Pair of Heifers – must be owned by one exhibitor or family and have been shown in individual classes.
- Pair of Bulls - must be owned by one exhibitor or family and have been shown in individual classes.
- Pair of Calves – two (2) calves, both sexes must be represented and must have been shown in one of the following classes: 1, 2, 3, 4, 12, 13, 14, or 15. Must be owned by one (1) exhibitor.
- Produce of Dam – two (2) animals, either sex from one (1) dam, to be shown in individual classes to be eligible, may be owned by more than one exhibitor.
- Junior Get of Sire – three (3) animals by one (1) sire, both sexes represented and shown from the following classes: 1, 2, 3, 4, 12, 13, 14, or 15. May be owned by more than one (1) exhibitor.
- Get of Sire – four (4) animals by one (1) sire, shown in above classes, both sexes represented. May be owned by more than one (1) exhibitor.
- Best 5 Head – five (5) animals either or both sexes represented. May be owned or co-owned by exhibitor or family.

DIVISION 22 SCOTCH HIGHLAND Second Weekend

AHCA Rules for sanctioned shows:

- Exhibitors must be members in good standing of the American Highland Cattle Association or the Canadian Highland Cattle Society.
- All animals must be owned by the exhibitor and registered with the American Highland Cattle Association or the Canadian Highland Cattle Society.
- Registration papers must be presented to show officials of AHCA representatives upon request.
- Tattoos must be legible and correspond to registration papers.
- Use of hormones or steroids in animals exhibited is prohibited.
- Breeding cattle may not be dehorned.
- Exhibitors agree to abide by the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics.
- No clipping or blocking of Highland breeding stock is allowed. Trimming of hair on belly, for purpose of leveling the bottom line is acceptable in the area between the front and back legs.
