General Exhibits:

Exhibitors in Open/Youth Home Arts, Floriculture, Valley Produce, & 4-H General: Processing Fee of \$10.00 will be charged. One (1) pass will be assigned to each exhibitor that pays the \$10.00 fee. For the \$10.00 fee, exhibitors may enter as many exhibits as they wish within the Modern Living Building (Foods, Threads, Crafts). Ag Building, you may enter as many as you wish in Valley Produce and Floriculture. Please see Photo and Fine Arts for their fees. No cross over between buildings. The Livestock Department is not included in this program.

YOUTH LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

- One (1) – Five (5) Day Admission wristband free with a minimum of an \$8.00 entry fee, this includes large and small animals.
- Exhibitors entering more than one (1) youth livestock department and an open class department will receive a wristband; no passes will be issued. Youth exhibitors entering in more than one department first half will be reviewed for pass allotments.
- One (1) Infield Parking Pass, for exhibiting half, per family, regardless of how many departments you are entering.....Free
- If more parking credentials are needed, they must be purchased.
- **Parent Discount Passes – First Half ONLY.** Parents may purchase a maximum of ten (10) passes at \$8.00 each; **only ten (10) passes may be purchased for youth exhibitor(s) per household, regardless of how many households are involved.** A Parent Discount Pass form is located on website at and must be submitted with payment on or before September 23rd. This offer will not stand as of September 24th. This is for youth livestock exhibitors only.
- **Exhibitor Restock Permit – 1st and 2nd half.** A temporary parking pass is available for parking behind the barns between the hours of 6:00am to 10:00am for unloading hay, straw, equipment etc. All vehicles must be removed from inside the grounds, to a parking area by 10:00am or they will be towed away. Please indicate on the discount passes form if you wish a permit. The permit is good only for the driver's admittance. Each passenger in the vehicle must have an admission pass.

All livestock are required to enter online. Please use this Exhibitor Guidebook as your reference when completing your entries. You will enter online at: <https://fairfun.fairwire.com>.

EQUINE DEPARTMENT GENERAL RULES

Please NO Smoking, NO alcohol, and NO dogs in the barns.

Also read the General Rules and Regulations of the Fair & Livestock Entry Requirements, with the following requirements:

- Horses must be led from the barns to arenas. Riding is not allowed to or from arenas at any time. Failure to obey this rule may forfeit premiums earned. Durand Arena gates must be closed and latched at all times. If you are using the arena during non-competitive, non-scheduled times, please make sure the gates to the arena are closed and latched.
- Adverse treatment – absolutely no ill-treatment of your animal will be allowed. If observed doing so, you will be requested to leave, and premiums will be pulled.
- Post entry and class changes will be accepted for one hour prior to the beginning of the day's show, and ½ hour following each show session.
- Entries: Entries submitted without proper registration papers or without classes listed, or without correct amount of fees will be returned and must be corrected and resubmitted. No stalls will be reserved without correct fees for stalls and classes entered on the entry forms.
 - All classes must be paid for prior the end of Fair. Entry fees cannot be taken out of premiums received.
 - Entries are accepted on a "first come basis". The number of horses that can be accommodated at the Fair is limited.
 - Once full, a waiting list will be started, and entries will be taken from this list in order as cancellations are received.
 - Entry form is not valid until signed by owner, and if a junior owner or rider, by parent or guardian.
 - Please PRINT your name on the entry form clearly.
 - Age of rider is required on entry form (all ages, all entrants). Rider's age is noted "as of Jan. 1st of the current year."
- Credentials: Credential packets will be issued from your Superintendent at the livestock meeting depending on first or second half of Fair.
- Registration Papers: Grade (Unregistered) horses ARE ALLOWED in any classes that are NOT breed specific. Grade horses are NOT to be shown in Halter classes. Photocopies of registration papers or breeding certificate for each animal entered, showing the CORRECT OWNER, animal's SIRE and DAM must accompany the entry form or the entry form will be returned.
 - Exception: For horses under one year of age, a confirmation paper showing that registration is being applied for or a signed statement explaining that the animal is eligible for registration and it has been applied for is acceptable, providing the name and number of the sire and dam are included. The Paint/Pinto sections require registration in at least one of the Pinto or Paint Associations.
- Stabling:
 - All stalls and tack rooms will be assigned on a first come/first serve basis with last year's location given first priority if possible.
 - Exhibitors wishing to stable together MUST submit their request on the entry form. Requests and locations are not guaranteed.
 - No sleeping in the barns is allowed. No exceptions.
 - Grooming and tacking up must be done in stall or designated stall for that purpose; must not be done in the aisle-way during time the Fair is open to the public. This is very dangerous and must be discontinued. Premiums may be withheld if this occurs and a fine of \$25.00 each time will be assessed. This is a dangerous practice.
 - No switching of stalls without permission of the superintendent.
 - One horse per stall except mare with a sucking foal (this must be designated on the entry blank).
 - Exhibitors who end up bringing fewer horses than they have rented stalls for will have the stalls reverted back to the Fair. The stalls will then be offered to those people on the waiting list before being made available to the original exhibitor for storage. Such offers can take place up through 9:00 am, Wednesday before Fair begins. NO REFUNDS on any stalls after the entry deadline.
- Tack room fee:
 - Tack rooms are \$10.00 per user (shared or single occupancy) and your request for a tack room must be noted on your entry form.
 - There are approximately 30 tack rooms available and they will be assigned on a "first come basis". Management reserves the right to assign more than one exhibitor to a tack room.
 - No refunds of any tack room fee after the entry deadline.
- Bedding: livestock will use straw and shaving this year. Barns B, C, and D will use shavings. Barns F, G, and H will use shavings unless prior arrangements have been made. Barn I will use straw and shavings.
- Weanling and Suckling Foals: Must be four months of age by Fair time in order to be entered. Sucking foals (accompanied by their dam, which also must be entered in the Fair, and still nursing) may be of any age. However, owners should be aware of the risks involved in exposing a young animal to a large number of other horses.
- Championship and Best of Breed Classes: Horses winning first and second place in regular halter classes must show in the Championship class or forfeit all prizes previously won. All Champion and Reserve Champions MUST show in Best of Breed or forfeit all prize money previously won.

- Other Requirements:
 - No riding in the arena with a halter, horses must be in a bridle.
 - Horses are not to be led or rode out of designated areas. The designated areas are from the horse barns to the crosswalk, Durand, and warm up arenas. No horses are to be beyond Barn D to the south and Barn B to the north.
 - Please stay out of the cattle area.
 - Get of Sire Class requires 3 get. Produce of Dam requires 2 produce.
 - Exhibitors must scratch classes at the show office, not at the paddock in gate unless it is an emergency.
 - Patterns will be posted one hour before each class.
 - **Equine Rule: "Once the exhibitor 18 years and younger enters the arena, they are required to wear an ASTM/SEI (American Society for Testing and Materials/Safety and Equipment Institute) riding helmet, properly secured at all times. All mounted riders 18 years and younger going to and from the arena must wear an ASTM/SEI riding helmet that is properly secured at all times. This rule includes all show times, warmups, leading, carts, and free riding.**

EQUINE DEPARTMENT CLASS RULES

All classes will follow the Central Washington State Fair and Washington and Oregon State Association Breed Rules, and use USAE Standard Rules as a guideline, unless otherwise stated. Breed rules only apply to respective breeds and not to open or equitation classes.

Classes with less than three (3) entries may be combined or canceled and premiums paid accordingly. Exhibitors are urged to use caution when entering restricted classes to be sure your entry is eligible as entered (i.e. novice, maiden, limit, green, etc.). Entry in a class for which the horse is not eligible may be reason for forfeiture of all prize money earned.

- In the Western section, snaffle, or hackamores (other than mechanical) will be allowed on horses 5 years and under and may be shown in any Western Class and be ridden with two hands.
- Horses shall be considered one year old on the first day of January following the date of foaling.
- A Green horse is one that has not shown prior to December 1 of the previous year.
- A Maiden horse is one that has not won first place in the division shown prior to January 1 of current year.
- A Novice horse is one that has not won (3) first place ribbons in the division shown prior to January 1 of the current year.
- A Limit horse is one that has not won (6) first place ribbons in the division shown prior to January 1 of the current year.
- A Junior horse is one that is 5 years and under as of January 1 of the current year.
- A Senior horse is one that is 6 years or older as of January 1 of the current year.
- Multiple registered horses may cross enter in breed classes, but only the class with the highest points awarded will be counted towards Hi-Point (more than one cross-entered class may not count for Hi-Point).
- Costume classes: a 3x5 card with information for costume must be submitted to the horse show office, written legibly, describing what the costume represents. No award without the description for the announcer.
- To retain the newly created classes requested, at least 5 entries must participate during the scheduled show.
- Mini/Pony Classifications: Mini A must be under 34" and Mini B must be 34" – 38".

- All classes with age specifications will count for High Point for that age division except for Costume, Championship, Green, Maiden, Amateur/Owner, Limit, and Novice.

YOUTH EQUINE RULES

Please refer to the all previous Equine Department Rules, in addition to the following:

- Open to all youth, ages 18 and younger, including 19, if birthday is after January 1, of present year.
- 4-H Youth may enter all classes including the ones that are not designated "4-H".
- Exhibitors must choose one of the primary breeds for each horse entry, for the entire fair. No crossovers.
- Washington State Horseman Association and Oregon State Horsemen Association rules will be followed with Central Washington State Fair rules to take precedence. Washington State and 4-H Gaming Rules will be followed.
- Registration Papers: Papers are required for halter classes that call for specific breed, and for the Light Horse Registered Breeds Class. No papers are required for the grade horse classes. Copies of registration papers for each horse entered, showing current owner, sire, and dam, must accompany the entry form.
- Stallions: No stallions allowed in the Youth Shows.
- Classes: A class with less than 3 entries may be cancelled or combine at discretion of management. Classes may be split at the discretion of management. No chaps allowed in the bareback classes.
- Championship Classes: Horses winning 1st and 2nd in a halter class must show in the championship class or forfeit all prizes previously won.
- Schedule Changes: If it becomes necessary, changes will be made in the schedule and PA announcements made and notice posted.
- Snaffle bits or Bosals: Allowed only on Junior Horses (five years and younger).
- Grooming: Horses must be groomed and outfitted in their stalls, not in the aisle way.
- Exhibitors: You may leave on Friday, Monday, or Tuesday for any school obligations as long as your animal projects are provided for.
- Age Classifications: The age you were as of January 1 of the present year. Age must be entered on the entry form. General Rules and Regulations apply.
 - Open Youth & 4-H Senior: Ages 14 to 18
 - Open Youth & 4-H Intermediate: Ages 11 to 13
 - Open Youth & 4-H Junior: Ages 8 to 10
- Judging: Classes will be judged and paid on the Danish System.
- 4-H Premiums: 4-H horse entries must have project form signed and sent with entry form to receive premiums. Premiums are paid on the Danish System for 4-H.
- High Point Awards: All classes except halter classes and fun classes will count for High Point Awards. In case of ties, there will be a call back to a ride-off to determine the winner.
- Arena: Horses under saddle or bareback during schooling time must be ridden with a bridle, no riding with halters.
- Passes: Passes should be ordered and paid for at the time you enter. RV Space should also be reserved and paid for at time of entry. Wristbands will be issued to all youth exhibitors.
- Herdsmanship: Barns and aisles must be kept clean at all times. If this is not carried out your premium may be pulled. This will be done at the discretion of the superintendent and/or management.
- Costume Classes: A 3x5 card with information for costume must be submitted to the livestock office, written legibly, describing what the costume represents. No award without the description for the announcer.

Release for long hauls (500 miles & over): See Department Superintendent for arrangements.

FIRST WEEKEND CHANGEOVER:

Note: Subject to Change Barns will be closed on Monday, September 27th @ 6:00pm; Banner line will go up at 6:00pm. To assure guest safety no access will be allowed in the livestock area once the banner line has been installed. We are hopeful that we may clear the barn and livestock areas of fairgoers by 6:00pm, at which time exhibitors may finish hauling their tack and decorations. Please do not start dismantling any displays or decorations until 5:30pm. Once this procedure is completed, we will have a general release with an estimated release time of 6:30pm. Please keep in mind that this depends on getting the barn areas cleared of fairgoers in a timely fashion. You will be informed by your Superintendent of a definite release time once management (Livestock Administrator, Joe Niemann) feels it is safe for everyone. Long hauls will be given consideration for an earlier release if it is safe to do so. Gators and drivers will be available to assist you in hauling your tack and/or display items.
