


Our harvest was fruitful; the 2022 Central Washington State Fair achieved record-breaking numbers, brought the community new educational and




Autumn Britt, M.A. Exhibits & Educational Programming Manager

Autumn is a former public school teacher and education specialist with more than 20 years of instructional experience. Autumn joined the Central Washington State Fair team as an artist to paint murals and fair props on the side, but quickly caught the "fair bug" and was brought on full-time to design educational programming and strengthen the fair's connections to students and educators in our community.

"I am so happy to be part of the Central Washington State Fair team and to help grow Yakima Valley's largest classroom. The potential for real, hands-on learning for all students at the fair is inspiring and our team's commitment to our community is something I am excited to be a part of."



Summer of 2022, all eyes were on the Yakima Valley SunDome as restoration took place on the Circle of Light, a trademark feature of the SunDome for nearly 30 years, created by the late Richard C. "Dick" Elliott (1945-2008), a Central Washington artist known for his large-scale installations. Unfortunately, the piece had fallen into disrepair in the decades since installation; at least half of the artwork's colorful reflectors had fallen off. Thanks to funding from the Washington State legislature, long-awaited repairs were completed.

Comprised of nearly 50,000 industrial highway reflectors, the Circle of Light forms a dramatic halo of vibrant, colorful patterns around the Yakima Valley SunDome. It is the largest public art piece in the State Art Collection, a trove of nearly 5,000 artworks managed by the Washington State Arts Commission (ArtsWA). When the legislature approved the funding in 2021, the team at ArtsWA immediately set to work to preserve Circle of Light. No detail was too small: the new reflectors come from the same manufacturer that Elliott used in 1992.

Burton Construction, Inc. handled all removal of the old, decaying reflectors and the installation of their replacements; all work was undertaken with preservation guidance from Architectural Resources Group (ARG). The restoration of the Circle of Light was completed, and a ceremony was held July 25, 2022.

Central Washington State Fair School Supply Drive

In 2022, the Fair held its first "School Supply Drive" benefiting local Yakima Valley schools and non-profit, education-based programs, providing much needed supplies to their classrooms.

The community showed up to support! All in all, Fair guests filled 8 watermelon bins full of supplies to donate, providing thousands of individual items. We were able to package 120 boxes of school supplies, helping more than 35 local schools & organizations.

The Central Washington State Fair saw 249,589 guests come to the Fair in 2022, a 22% increase over 2021. A single-day attendance record of 38,257 visitors was set on Saturday, October 1st. The Fair exceeded historical revenues in many areas, and this resulted in record spending for admissions, food, and carnival.

The Toyota Main Stage Concert Series had two sell-outs: Sawyer Brown and Jeff Foxworthy. The new concert lawn seating area was well-received and by mid-week concertgoers figured out they could bring blankets and lawn chairs to this new concert seating area. The PBR Bull Riding Challenger Series in the Coca-Cola Grandstand was also a sellout.

2022 Agriculture Highlights


Since 1854, Agriculture Exhibits have been a part of the annual Fair. Livestock animals and locally grown crops have been showcased in the barns and the Agriculture Building and community organizations such as Grange and Future Farmers of America have created amazing exhibits detailing their activities. This year was no exception.

While maintaining the traditional exhibits, livestock, and agriculture programming, many new programs were introduced for the 2022 Fair:

Educational Herb Garden - In partnership with Washington State University Extension Master Gardeners, an educational herb garden was planted on the grounds for the 2022 Fair; this garden is located east of the Shattuck Building.

Heritage Garden - Working with the Native Plant Society, a Heritage Garden was started along the east wall of the Modern Living Building showcasing plants native to the Yakima Area.







State Fair Wine Garden - Featured 6 local wineries and their locally produced wines. Proceeds from sales benefited the Central Washington Fair Association Foundation and its mission to support agriculture programming, youth education, and State Fair Park facilities and grounds.

Featured Agriculture Exhibit - Working with multiple organizations and agencies, Fair Staff created an award-winning exhibit titled "Backyard Bounty". This exhibit provided examples for transforming your backyard into a habitat to provide food for your family by working with nature, not against it. The following organizations and agencies participated: Washington State University Extension Master Gardeners, Heritage Garden Program and Native Plant Society, Washington State Department Of Agriculture Pollinator Task Force, Yakima County Noxious Weed Control Board, and Yakima County Solid Waste Division YakimaRecycles.com.

Ag Ed Shed Stage - This presentation stage allowed for individuals and organizations to share information on any topic related to agriculture, food production, gardening, wildlife in your backyard, etc. Presenters included Master Gardeners, Beekeepers, local farmers, basket making, and local agriculture agencies. 1185
