JUDGING: Items will be judged, and then displayed during the Fair.

SYSTEM OF JUDGING: Danish

ENTRY FEE: \$10.00 will be charged. You will need to manually add the fee (Floriculture Entry Fee). One (1) fair admission ticket will be given to each exhibitor who pays the \$10.00 fee. No crossovers to other departments.

AWARDS: Best of Division will receive a Rosette.

PREMIUMS: Blue - \$4.00 Red - \$2.00 White – Ribbon Only

We would like to encourage all gardeners, skilled or beginners, to bring your floral entries to the 2023 Fair. This show is for anyone who loves to grow flowers. Please share them with the community.

FLORICULTURE DEPARTMENT RULES

Please also read the CWSF Rules and Regulations. All rules and regulations as stated apply to all exhibitors and entries.

- Competitions are offered for amateur adults, youth, and professional adults.
- Entry registration must include: Division, Color and Class number, if required.
- Containers will be furnished for Chrysanthemums, Dahlias, Flower Specimens, Glads and Roses. Containers for all other classes must be furnished by the exhibitor and should be plainly marked with name taped on the bottom of the container. The Fair management will not be responsible for the loss of containers or accessories.
- Specimens must be grown by exhibitor. Exhibitors are encouraged to change their flowers (specimens or designs) to keep the show looking fresh. Any deteriorated specimens will be removed and destroyed.
- Designs are to consist of naturally grown materials. No plastic flowers. Accessories permitted in designs.
- Competition is open to the public, all ages.
- Any flowers brought after specified deadline may be left for exhibition only if space permits.
- **If an entrant has over 15 entries, please bring them at least ½ hour before end of receiving time(s).**
- Whenever possible, flower exhibits should be named on entry form. If unsure of name, contact Superintendent and/or clerk for assistance.
- Professionals may not enter in Adult Floriculture Classes—may only enter in Professional Class Floriculture. A professional is a person who engages in any aspect of the floral industry as a livelihood rather than as a hobby. Professionals are required to pre-enter online – please see Professional Divisions for details.

Helpful Hints for Exhibitors:

- ❖ Make a list of possible entries early so they will be well-groomed at entry time. Entries should be free of dust, mildew & insect damage.
- ❖ Dahlias and Chrysanthemums need to be in proportion with height and size of bloom. Dahlias need foliage to accompany bloom.
- ❖ Glads should be 1/3 bloom, 1/3 bud, 1/3 closed.
- ❖ Roses need to be in bud ¼ to ½ open.
- ❖ Specimens need to be one blooming stalk or three items with one flower per stem.
- ❖ Potted plants need to be clear of dried foliage.

Requirements:

- Blooms should be named where possible.
- Disbud entries should not show any side buds.
- Spray is one lateral of a plant bearing a number of flowers on one stem.
- No less than 3 blooms to stem.
- You may enter as many flowers as you would like, but each must be a different type, variety, or color.
- Must describe entry completely on form.

Classes:

1. Single – daisy like flowers – one (1) bloom disbudded.
2. Anemone – flowers like single, but with a rounded crest of deeper colored petals – one (1) bloom disbudded.
3. Quill – petals straight, long, and tubular – one (1) bloom disbudded.
4. Spider – petals long and tubular with hooked ends – one (1) bloom disbudded.
5. Spoon – petals spoon-shaped – one (1) bloom disbudded.
6. Garden Decorative, one (1) bloom reflex disbudded.
7. Garden Decorative, one (1) bloom incurve disbudded.
8. Garden Decorative, three (3) blooms, same color disbudded.
9. Garden Decorative, three (3) blooms, mixed colors.
10. Anemone, one (1) spray.
11. Cactus or Carnation, one (1) spray.
12. Spoon or Quill, one (1) spray.
13. Pompon – small, stiff, almost globular flowers – one (1) spray.
14. Spider – one (1) spray.
15. Garden Hardy – one (1) spray

DAHLIAS
1ST HALF SHOW DIVISION 303
2ND HALF SHOW DIVISION 304

Requirements:

- Must have attached foliage (at least one pair of leaves).
- Must be disbudded.
- No open centers except in novelties.
- Dahlia stems should be 3 different lengths.
- Dahlias will be judged on the following: Color, substance, form, size according to variety, stem & foliage, and bloom condition.
- You may enter any of the classes below and any number per class if the color and size is different. Example: Formal Decorative, 8" or over, color red and Formal Decorative, under 8", color red.

Classes:

1. Formal Decorative – any size, one (1) bloom – ray florets flat, partially revolute, or partially involute. Petals uniform and regularly arranged, tending to recurve toward the stem.
2. Informal Decorative – any size, one (1) bloom – ray florets twisted, or curled, or wavy.
3. Straight Cactus – any size, one (1) bloom – ray florets revolute for more than ½ their length; pointed, straight, or recurved, radiating in all directions from the center.
4. Semi-Cactus – any size, one (1) bloom – ray florets broad at base, straight, incurved, or recurved; with ray florets revolute for up to ½ of their length.
5. Lacinate – the split should be in proportion to the ray floret length – an overall fringed effect.
6. Water Lily – fully double and symmetrical petals.
7. Miniatures – any form – three (3) blooms.
8. Best Basket of Miniatures – any form.
9. Collarettes – open centered with a single row of uniform evenly spaced compound ray florets in a flat plain surrounding the disc flowers – three (3) blooms.
10. Mini Ball – three (3) blooms – fully double flowers, ball-shaped or slightly flattened at face.
11. Pompon – fully double flowers similar to ball but more globular and smaller in size – three (3) blooms.
12. Ball – fully double flowers, ball-shaped or slightly flattened at the face; ray florets are blunt, rounded or indented – larger than 3" – one (1) bloom.
13. Novelty – Dahlias with characteristics differing from any other form presentation – three (3) blooms.
14. Peony-Flowering – open-centered with two or more rows of ray florets surrounding the disc flowers.
15. Anemone – with one or more rows of ray florets surrounding a center of elongated tubular disc florets
