- Any animal showing symptoms of disease of any kind will not be allowed admittance into the show room.
- All stock must have a permanent, legible earmark. There will be tattooing @ \$2.00 each and a registrar available at the show for your convenience.
- Each exhibitor, family, or rabbitry will be limited to 40 rabbits.
