While reminiscing about the year 2013, it became very clear to me the role we play at State Fair Park.

When all is said and done, it is the memories created that will stay with us. Memories of a high school basketball player who makes the winning shot at the State WIAA Tournament; families watching their seniors graduate from one of the seven high school graduations in the SunDome; the first bite of a corndog; a first ride at the fair...or even a first kiss. These create lasting memories.

Maybe it's one of the 30 fundraising groups like Young Life and Davis High School who work so hard during our Fair raising close to \$500,000 for their group's needs. Those monies might go to help provide better living conditions for the less fortunate, or provide a scholarship to a talented student or support a youth program.

In addition to creating memories, State Fair Park is a significant economic generator. Just under 500,000 people attended various events in 2013. Year end reports show that 108 groups utilized State Fair Park facilities and 15,258 hotel room nights were generated. Another vital statistic is 2,500+ jobs are created or retained as a result of all of the activities on the grounds. State Fair Park plays an important and vital role in and for the people of the Yakima Valley.

2013 Fair Recap "

"the Original State Fair of Washington"

Even with ten days of less than desirable weather, Fair fans still poured through the gates. "The weather really does affect our attendance. In all my years here I have never seen inclement weather like we had this year on virtually every day of the Fair." said President and General Manager, Greg Stewart. The 2013 Central Washington State Fair finished about 11 percent down in attendance compared to 2012.

Even with the blustery weather, the rock group Styx performed to a standingroom-only crowd at the opening Saturday night concert. Other entertainment throughout the week included Riders in the Sky, Plain White T's, Sean Kingston, Kutless, Lonestar, Williams & Ree, and Sawyer Brown. On the final Sunday, Tex-Mex singer Bobby Pulido played to another packed crowd.

Over 500 photos were on display in the International Photo Salon staged in the Ag Building. The photos, collectively, represented 59 countries with the highest number of entries coming from Hong Kong! The second year of educational S.T.E.M. (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) exhibits sparked curiosity from thousands in the Washington State Building.

"Food is still the number one reason people give for coming to our Fair. We had more than 60 food booths with many unique items that you can only get once a year." said Stewart. Food is followed by entertainment, animals, and midway rides in popularity.

Once again, with Legend's Casino as our presenting sponsor, an array of promotions and discounts were provided to Fair patrons. A new, major Fair sponsor...
