### 2015 Fair Recap The Original State Fair of Washington

Almost perfect Fair weather during late September and early October helped boost attendance at the 2015 Central Washington State Fair to 319,351. An increase of 1.35% over 2014!



The 2015 Fair enjoyed beautiful early fall temperatures that reached the 70's and 80's every day, with pleasant evenings, allowing fairgoers a chance to stay and enjoy all the attractions. On the final Saturday an all-time one day record

of 57,261 people streamed through the gates, and on the final Sunday another 49,731 came to the Fair to get one last chance to see the animals, ride the rides, enjoy the entertainment, and eat the unique fair foods.

"We think everyone definitely found their happy," said Stewart, referring to the theme of the 2015 Fair, which was *"Find Your Happy!"*.

Food lovers found unique tasty treats at over 60 different food booths, and thrill seekers were entertained all ten days by the dozens of midway rides and games presented by Butler Amusements.

The other big draw was the entertainment on the Budweiser Stage and the Coca-Cola Grandstand. On opening Friday the Fair presented the country group Parmalee, followed by the rock band Blue Oyster Cult on Saturday, and Latina songstress Graciela Beltran on Sunday. On Tuesday, legendary pop group the Beach Boys drew a huge crowd. Other entertainment throughout the week included John Anderson, Loverboy, Maddie & Tae, and Eric Burdon and the Animals. On the final Sunday, Norteno band Conjunto Primavera drew the largest crowd of the Fair.

Big crowds also took in two days of NW Extreme Late Model Series Sprint Car Races on the opening weekend, and both the Monster Truck show and two days of Demolition Derby had full houses on the final weekend. Other attractions that drew interest were the mega exhibit Discover the Dinosaurs, the All-Alaskan Racing Pigs, some new busker acts including Statue Man and Manfred the Talking Horse, along with the exotic animals at Walk on the Wild Side and more than 200 farm animals at Barnville.

The Fair offered new sounds on the Pacific Power Stage including Ty Herndon and the following tribute bands: Barracuda – The Essential Tribute to Heart; Hell's Belles, an all female AC/DC band; and Country Artist Tributes of Kenny Chesney, Jason Aldean and Toby Keith.

Fair dates for 2016 are September 23 to October 2.

### Central WA State Fair receives International Advertising Recognition

The Central Washington State Fair received a prestigious Award of Distinction for Communications from the International Association of Fairs and Expositions (IAFE) for their television commercial "Find Your Happy" which featured Amy the pig going to the Fair and looking for her "Happy".

The commercial was created by Yakima advertising firm Smith, Phillips & DiPietro, and produced by Breakout Productions of Yakima. Winners are selected from the membership of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, which has over 1,200 members from around the globe.

• The 18th Reading Roundup Program grew by 14% with participation from 6,985 students in grades K through 5 reading 2,415,082 minutes total! Participating students earned a discounted Fair pass.

- The Farm-to-Fork Series in the Ag Building featured food presentations including honey extracting and honey cooking techniques from the Central WA Beekeepers Association as well as handmade meatballs from the Washington Cattlewomen.

### South Korean Display during the Fair

Visiting from 5,000 miles away, 25 South Korean delegates assembled an interactive Fair display in the Ag Building showcasing samples of green tea, explaining their South Korean cultural history, and taught Fair attendees how they have been producing green tea for over 1,000 years.

This was the second year that the Central Washington Fair Association has been in partnership with the Green Tea Festival officials.
