
The focus of the State Fair Youth Development Board is to:

Connect producers, teachers, leaders, industry and business in an effort to offer encouragement and recognition to Virginia's youth as they participate in competitions and educational programs.




Three key areas of programming are Natural Resources, Agriculture, and Arts, Culture and History. Agencies that partnered with programming included:

2022 SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

Since 2013, the State Fair of Virginia Scholarship Program has awarded \$732,570 via 2,069 individual scholarships.


196 individual scholarships totaling \$65,450









2022 SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

YOUTH LIVESTOCK AWARDED SCHOLARSHIPS

Any youth who participate in the youth livestock shows at the current year's fair are eligible. These include: youth beef, youth sheep, youth meat goat and youth swine shows. Application categories are broken out by age Juniors (9-12); Intermediate (13-15); and Seniors (16 and older) with four scholarships being awarded in each category.

Judging is based on applicants' State Fair participation, as well as on leadership and community service activities and an essay. Funds allocated for the scholarships represent a portion of proceeds from the current year's Sale of Champions benefit auction.

Deadline: Applications are due January 23 and reviewed by the Scholarship Committee in February. Special recognition of winners is listed on the Fair website and made at the upcoming State Fair.










ENTRIES 2015-2022





EXHIBITOR AND ENTRY TRENDS 2015-2022






BLACK TIE & BOOTS








EDUCATIONAL EXPOSITION - "ED EXPO"
