GOVERNANCE

The State Fair of Virginia and The Meadow Event Park are owned by Virginia Farm Bureau Federation, with the entities falling under the governance of an Oversight Committee (subgroup of the Farm Bureau board) and the Virginia Farm Bureau Board of Directors. The fair's Youth Development Board is a nonprofit organization focused on educational initiatives and youth programs. All other operational activities that are part of the State Fair, and the year-round Meadow Event Park operations, are functions of the Virginia Farm Bureau Holding Corporation.

2023 STATE FAIR OF VIRGINIA®



In 2023 we celebrated our beloved "State Fair of Virginia" by focusing on the unique attributes that each individual participant or fairgoer loves about the fair. As an organization, we embraced the slogan, "Your Fair. Your Way". It is tradition to have a weather event attempt to dampen our spirit, and Tropical Storm Ophelia made for a very challenging opening Saturday! Despite this, our organization showed our resilience once again and dug deep to achieve our mission! Overall, **210,000** fairgoers visited the State Fair of Virginia during its 10-day run.

Highlights included the new Natural Resource educational display initiative, Superhero trading cards featuring ag and forestry leaders from across the commonwealth, new food products and overall increased engagement in both the commercial and exhibitor aspects of the fair.

Scholarship fundraisers saw success, and ultimately, this youth development initiative is at the very heart of our mission. Board members invested time and energy into a very streamlined strategic plan, and the results of this effort will guide us over the next few years. The outcome of the strategic planning discussions clearly highlighted the need for a permanent facility in our Harvest Landing area which can house educational activities on a year-round basis.

Connect producers, teachers, leaders, industry and business in an effort to offer encouragement and recognition to Virginia's youth as they participate in competitions and educational programs.




Three key areas of programming are: Natural Resources; Agriculture; and Arts, Culture and History. Agencies that partnered with programming included:




Annual Contribution to the Endowment Fund from Sale of Champions (20% of the total sale proceeds):

YOUTH LIVESTOCK AWARDED SCHOLARSHIPS

Any youth who participate in the youth livestock shows at the current year's fair are eligible. These include: youth beef, youth sheep, youth meat goat and youth swine shows. Application categories are broken out by age: Juniors (9-12); Intermediate (13-15); and Seniors (16 and older) with four scholarships being awarded in each category.

Judging is based on applicants' State Fair participation, as well as on leadership and community service activities and an essay. Funds allocated for the scholarships represent a portion of proceeds from the current year's Sale of Champions benefit auction.

Deadline: Applications are due January 24 and reviewed by the Scholarship Committee in February. Special recognition of winners is listed on the fair's website and made at the upcoming State Fair.



SKILLS USA COMPETITIONS 2016-2023












ENTRIES 2016-2023







EXHIBITOR AND ENTRY TRENDS 2016-2023







SALE OF CHAMPIONS ANNUAL SUPPORT 2016-2023






STATE FAIR CARES

Through the new initiative, State Fair Cares, The State Fair of Virginia further utilized its platform to offer fairgoers and crafters an opportunity to give back to local communities. The first-ever SFVA Crafters for Children allowed arts competitors to donate homemade items for an online auction benefiting Children's Hospital of Richmond at VCU. In 2023, \$1,100 was raised and donated to CHOR. Additionally, fairgoers received discounted admission during two fair weekdays by bringing donated food, school supplies and winter gloves. The resulting 1,418 pounds of canned food, 215 pounds of school supplies and 59 new pairs of winter gloves were donated to Caroline County food banks and schools.

DAIRY DAYS AT THE FAIR

The State Fair of Virginia partnered with the Federation of Virginia Food Banks to highlight their "Milk for Good" program in which milk from Virginia farmers is purchased and donated to families in need. This project would not have been possible without the partnership of Virginia Tech Dairy Science Club, The Virginia State Dairymen's Association, Dairy Alliance and Farmview Creamery. We also would like to thank Farm Credit for being our presenting sponsor the past two years and for Kroger's sponsorship this year.

Since 2022, over \$17,000 has been raised in the two-year partnership, supporting the donation of 8,100 half gallons of milk for Virginia families in need.

PROGRAM MISSION PROJECTS

NATURAL RESOURCES REVITALIZATION

In 2023, the State Fair of Virginia initiated a three-year design project to intentionally upgrade and revitalize its Natural Resources area with the support of state agencies. The goal of this project was to create an area to transport fairgoers into a creative, imaginative, enriching space to ignite an interest in Virginia's outdoors. The Office of the Secretary of Natural Resources and its state agencies supported this initiative which introduced new "Virginia Outdoors" creative arts competitions, more intentional programming and themed demonstrations. This effort was also supported by funds from the Virginia Farm Bureau Women's Leadership Committee. The committee also aided in a grant application with Corteva which will support the 2024 rendition of our beautification project.





VIRGINIA COOPERATIVE EXTENSION - HORTICULTURE COMPETITIONS

Noticing a decline in horticulture competition entries, SFVA met with key partners at Virginia Cooperative Extension to identify entry barriers and derive solutions to better support and encourage producer participation in horticulture competitions. Through the partnership with Extension to minimalize transportation and fee barriers, the State Fair of Virginia saw a 20% increase in horticulture entries during the 2023 fair.



PROGRAM MISSION PROJECTS

SUPERHERO AG TRADING CARDS

"Superhero" trading cards featuring Virginia's super individuals in Ag and Natural Resources were launched as part of the 2023 State Fair of Virginia Ed Expo. We asked who Virginia's superheroes are, and you delivered with over 100 nominations! We turned 15 incredible individuals across Virginia into modern superheroes— because feeding the world and being a steward of the land is a superpower!
