GOVERNANCE

The State Fair of Virginia and The Meadow Event Park are owned by Virginia Farm Bureau Federation, with the entities falling under the governance of an Oversight Committee (subgroup of the Farm Bureau board) and the Virginia Farm Bureau Board of Directors. The fair's Youth Development Board is a nonprofit organization focused on educational initiatives and youth programs. All other operational activities that are part of the State Fair, and the year-round Meadow Event Park operations, are functions of the Virginia Farm Bureau Holding Corporation.

2024 STATE FAIR OF VIRGINIA®



In our 2024 guest survey, 75% of fairgoers stated that the State Fair of Virginia® was an important family tradition. Thank you for your role in keeping this tradition alive! We are grateful for the 225,000 guests and partners who joined us September 26-October 5, 2024, to celebrate – "Where Home Grown Happens!"

Participation in our Ed Expo program increased. We celebrated a new partnership with Maola Milk, redesigned the layout for home arts competitions to make the space more visually welcoming, and continued the enhancement of the Natural Resources educational display area! Twelve new Ag Superheroes were named, and Gov. Glenn Youngkin visited the fair and thoroughly enjoyed participating in the Sale of Champions!

Our board, staff and partners dedicated a tremendous amount of time to a study of Sale of Champions structure. The study came at the request of junior livestock show constituents, and the main goal was to increase the percentage of sale funds that were directly allocated to youth livestock exhibitors. The efforts resulted in percentages being restructured prior to the 2024 event. We added a video interview segment to the scholarship evaluation process, and it further highlighted the incredible skills and passion of our youth participants. Our focus continues to be on increasing engagement and securing permanent infrastructure to house educational programming.

We will continue to measure success as follows:


The focus of the State Fair Youth Development Board is to:

Connect producers, teachers, leaders, industry and business in an effort to offer encouragement and recognition to Virginia's youth as they participate in competitions and educational programs.




Three key areas of programming are: Natural Resources; Agriculture; and Arts, Culture and History. Agencies that partnered with programming included:

2024 SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS





YOUTH LIVESTOCK AWARDED SCHOLARSHIPS

Any youth who participate in the youth livestock shows at the current year's fair are eligible. These include: youth beef, youth sheep, youth meat goat and youth swine shows. Application categories are broken out by age: Juniors (9-12); Intermediate (13-15); and Seniors (16 and older) with four scholarships being awarded in each category.

Judging is based on applicants' State Fair participation, as well as on leadership and community service activities and an essay. Funds allocated for the scholarships represent a portion of proceeds from the current year's Sale of Champions benefit auction.

Deadline: Applications are due January 22, 2025 and reviewed by the Scholarship Committee in February. Special recognition of winners is listed on the fair's website and made at the upcoming State Fair.


4-H AND FFA NON-LIVESTOCK COMPETITIONS 2016-2024

*Student numbers were impacted in 2024 due to the impact of Hurricane Helene which prevented several Southwest Virginia schools and competitors from attending.










ENTRIES 2016-2024














SALE OF CHAMPIONS


