## SALE PROCEEDS WILL BE DISTRIBUTED AS FOLLOWS:

- 25% applied to premiums and scholarships currently offered
- 25% awarded to exhibitor (75% cash/25% scholarship) above and beyond current premiums/scholarships each youth receives
- 20% to establish a restricted scholarship fund open to all youth State Fair exhibitors
- 20% to an awarded scholarship program for youth livestock exhibitors exclusively
- 10% to cover expenses associated with the sale; remaining funds placed in operating account for the following year's sale

## Prospective Buyers & Donors

**Important**—If you are interested in bidding on an animal, please note that you do not take possession of the animal. Sale proceeds are donations in support of the program.

In addition to supporters being able to bid on individual animals, a sale fund has been created. This fund will serve as:

- A mechanism to provide a base price
- An avenue for supporters to donate at multiple levels
