Purpose:

This competition allows participants to demonstrate knowledge and build skills related to woodworking and the forestry industry while celebrating Virginia's tradition of craftsmanship. This contest offers:

1. Free quality lumber to students
2. Hands-on experience with Appalachian hardwood
3. Recognition of student talent and shop programs across Virginia

Rules and Guidelines:

- Teams must register online by December 12th and secure their bundle from their regional pick-up location.
 - Specific location and pick up support information will be provided after sign up deadline
- Competition is open to all school and youth club groups. Groups are only eligible to receive one bundle per club or chapter.
- Contestants must be 19 years of age or younger to be eligible and compete in the events.
- Projects must be securely held together, freestanding and portable
- Projects will be judged against age group (Middle School vs. High School)
 - Mixed aged groups will be judged in the high school division.
- Projects will be judged within their Farm Bureau District to determine first place for middle school and high school respectively. Regional finalists will advance.

Judging:

- Regional judging committees will be scheduled for visits with groups between April 6 and April 20 to visit and score projects at a designated spot (i.e. school, club meeting, etc.).
- Regional committees, based on the 14 Farm Bureau Districts, will determine their regional winners for first place in middle and high school divisions.
- Pictures of the regional finalists will be shared online through a social media competition to determine overall champions as part of The Virginia Lumber Cup Showcase.

Awards:

- Award value will be announced prior to January 8 pick up deadline. Monetary awards will be awarded to regional winners and top state winners in both the middle and high school divisions.

Display:

- Winners are invited to display their projects at the 2026 State Fair of Virginia at The Meadow Event Park, September 25 – October 4, 2026. Single day tickets will be provided to the winning teams.

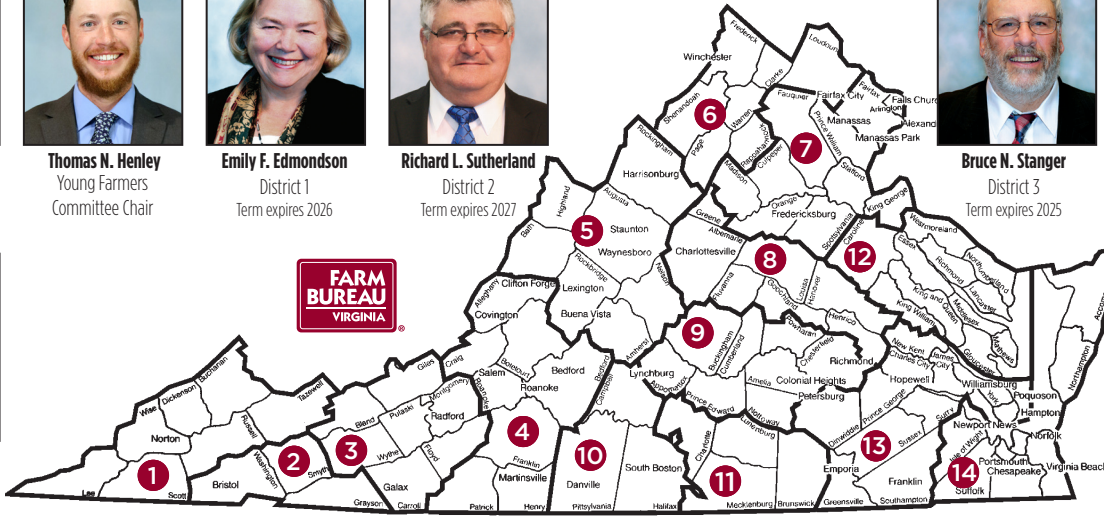
