**All livestock are encouraged to display for the entire six (6) days of the Fair. (check with superintendent for barn space available).**  
 All livestock entries must be made to the **Twin Falls County Extension Office** before 5:00 p.m. **Monday, July 15, 2021.**  
 All livestock and FFA exhibits must be on Fairgrounds before 5:00 p.m. **Tuesday, August 31<sup>st</sup>.**  
 All **Open Lot livestock entries** must be made to the **Twin Falls County Fair Office** before 5:00 p.m. **August 25<sup>th</sup>.**  
 All **cultural entry** forms will be accepted at the **Twin Falls County Fair Office** until Friday, **August 27<sup>th</sup>.**  
 All prize money must be signed for. No entry fee will be charged for entries in the FFA division. All livestock entered in open Lot must follow open Lot rules and regulations. All produce must be taken to the building by 5 p.m., Sunday, **August 29<sup>th</sup>.** Exhibitors must furnish feed and care for his/her own stock. The Fair Management will dispose of all exhibits not picked up for at close of Fair. The exhibitors of all livestock must be owned or have financial interest in stock to receive premium money. All FFA projects must have been properly listed with their local advisor by **June 1<sup>st</sup>.** All winners will receive ribbons as well as cash awards. **FFA members that are showing are required to have a wristband from the Twin Falls County Fair Office. Entries are limited to FFA Chapter members in Twin Falls County.**  
 FFA members will be required to participate in a showmanship Lot consisting of a Junior Lot (grades 8, 9, 10) and a Senior Lot (grades 11, 12, 13). If for any reason there are not enough exhibitors for both Lots, the FFA Superintendent for each individual species will determine if the Junior and Senior Lot will be combined. In any circumstance, the FFA participants will be allowed to show in an exclusive FFA Showmanship Lot. All decisions regarding FFA Showmanship Lots will be directed to the FFA Superintendent for that species.  
**For safety purposes, boots are to be worn, at all times, during this competition.**

### FITTING AND SHOWING CONTEST

- The FFA Fitting and Showing contest shall be divided in two groups:
  - Junior Division shall include students who are currently 8<sup>th</sup> grade, freshman, and sophomores.
  - Senior Division shall include students who are currently juniors, seniors, and who have graduated in the previous school year.
- All animals must be fitted before they enter the ring.
- Dress Code: FFA jackets, white shirt, tie/scarf and dark colored pants. Dairy whites with FFA jackets for dairy and goats.

### CROP EXHIBITS

- Each FFA member may exhibit as many different crops as he/she wishes, but these exhibits must be grown on a farm owned or rented by himself/herself and raised as his/her own project.
- All farm produce shall be the same rules as listed in the Premium book for open Lot exhibits. (Dual Entries in JR/FFA Gardeners require same quantities as FFA.)**
- Each FFA Chapter will receive \$25.00 for showing a display. **Funds will go to FFA Chapter-** Must be entered in Lot to receive.
- FFA Vegetables & Field Crops will be displayed with Junior Exhibits. Exhibits will be judged twice, once in FFA and once in Junior Exhibits, if entered at such.
