Continued Receipt

- 1. Funds for the Scholarship will be handled by Trinity Valley Exposition (TVE) and will be sent directly to the student at the permanent address provided to TVE. It is imperative that the recipient notify TVE of acceptance by their chosen college or university and meet the requirements specified in the TVE Livestock Show and Rodeo Scholarship policies.
- 2. Continued Receipt of Scholarship Funds: A scholarship recipient will be entitled to the continued receipt of scholarship funds so long as the recipient complies with **ALL** of the following requirements:
 - a. Attend a fully accredited college, university or accredited technical school.
 - b. Enroll and complete a minimum of twelve (12) hours each semester.
 - The lump sum money awarded to the applicant will be divided out equally over 8 semesters.
 - Deadline for applicant to request money for **Fall** Semester August 1st and **Spring** Semester February 1st.
 - Incoming freshmen need to provide proof of enrollment or schedule by the dates listed.
 - c. Complete two (2) semesters work each academic year unless otherwise approved in writing and accepted in advance by TVE.
 - d. Maintain a cumulative grade point average of not less than 2.50.
 - e. In order to request funds, email a transcript with current class schedule to <u>info@tvefair.com</u> with "Attentions Scholarship Committee" for the subject line. Transcripts must include spring and fall semesters of the current school year. Transcripts must include your name and information. This needs to be in PDF format not a picture of the website.
- 3. Recipient must request and receive money from TVE one year from the date it is initially awarded. However, each request shall not exceed the established deadlines: August 1st for fall semester and February 1st for spring semester. Recipient must make at least one request each academic school year. If money is not requested and received within these guidelines, it will be forfeited.
- 4. If you are on pace to graduate early (in less than 8 semesters), on your last semester of the year you are graduating, you can receive the remaining balance that is in the trust on your behalf with a letter from the school stating that you will be graduation early.
- 5. It is the obligation of each scholarship recipient to comply with these rules. If you fail to comply, you will not be considered a qualified recipient and may lose your scholarship funding. It is your responsibility to check the website for any changes to dates or requirements as they may be amended from time to time. We will not send out changes that may be made. If you have any questions please get with us before any deadlines as we may be able to help if it's before the deadline but not after. We will use email as the primary source of contact so please make sure we have the most current email address on file as well as permanent mailing address for checks.
