NEW THIS YEAR! The Tehama, Shasta, & Glenn Horse Show Saturday, May 31st has been restructured as a youth-only event, divided into three distinct areas of competition centered on education: **1. Educational Competition - Tack Identification 2. Interview and 3. Horse Show Events**

GENERAL RULES

1. **Age Restrictions:** Competition is limited to three age divisions Junior Ages 9-10, Intermediate Ages 11-13, and Senior Ages 14-18.
2. **ONE DAY SHOW** for the Tehama & Shasta District Fairs
3. Use the **ONLINE FORM** for all horse show entries
4. **Areas of Competition** 1. Educational Competition – Tack Identification 2. Interview 3. Horse Show Events. Contestants will compete and earn points in all three areas of competition. The top three-point earners in each age division will earn a scholarship.
5. **Points:** Points will be awarded in each area of competition 1st Place – 10 Points, 2nd Place - 8 Points, 3rd Place – 7 Points, 4th Place – 6 Points, 5th Place – 5 Points, 6th Place – 4 Points, 7th Place – 3 Points, 8th Place – 2 Points, 9th Place – 1 Point
6. **Scholarships** All scholarships will be awarded the day of the competition.
7. Exhibitors in the horse show departments will comply with the provisions of the Horse Protection Act of 1970 (P.L 91-540) and rules adopted by the United States Secretary of Agriculture to carry out its provisions.
8. **Required Dress Code:** White collared shirt.
9. **Stalls** available by request at \$30.00 per stall and payable with entry fee. The number of stalls required must be on the entry form. Bedding must be supplied by the exhibitor. SHAVINGS ONLY. Tack stalls available at \$30.00 per stall as space allows. Stall assignments made by Fair Management.
10. **Ownership:** 4-H Rules apply in regard to ownership requirements
11. Three entries by two or more exhibitors constitute a minimum horse show class unless otherwise specified. Show management reserves the right to return entries, transfer entries, combine divisions or classes, and/or cancel any division or class in which, in its judgement, the entries are insufficient to secure adequate competition.
12. The age of the exhibitor on January 1st shall be maintained through the next calendar year for the Junior Mount classes only.
13. **All exhibitors must wear helmets in all mounted events.**
14. Show will be governed by American Horse Show Association (AHSA) Rules and will refer to the AQHA Rulebook if needed.
15. Horses shown from trailers on Saturday must enter from Trinity Avenue to Gate #7
16. **Absolutely NO dogs allowed on grounds.**
17. All Stalled horses must vacate the Fairgrounds by Sunday, June 1st.
18. **Practice & Clinic:** Informational day and clinic date TBA.

- Riders will be required to wear ASTM/SEI approved equestrian helmets.
- For horse show purposes the age of the individual on January 1st shall be maintained throughout the year and must be listed on the entry form.
