The Fair Staff would like to thank everyone that completed the feedback form, our goal has always been to provide a fun, memorable, learning experience for the exhibitors! It is important to also provide the Buyers in our community with a quality product. The purpose of the feedback meeting is to meet with the leaders and advisors to know the consensus on rules, procedures, and suggestions in order to improve the Fair every year! Below in **bold** are topics that were submitted on the feedback form that could potentially initiate discussion. On page 4 there are comments that were submitted on the feedback form. Suggestions from the meeting will be brought back to the Tehama District Fair Board of Directors.

Suggestions Submitted

Bring back the Group 1, Group, 2 & Group 3 sifting process for Market Animals. The Groups would help create a sale order, reward exhibitors with quality animals, and hold those accountable that do not.

• More Information: The "Group" sifting process was taken out of the State Rulebook and changed to "Market Ready" and "Not Market Ready" the Group process can be brought back to Fairs at a local level.

Have animals that placed higher in their classes be towards the front of the sale.

Adjusting Schedule on Friday due to FFA State Finals, NAL Track & Field Championship

Potential Solution: Starting all classes early on Friday

FFA Novice & Advanced Showmanship

- Current Rule: If an exhibitor has never shown in FFA before they are in the novice class. If they have shown with FFA before they are in the advanced class. (If an exhibitor has previously shown the species in 4-H they are still in Novice) 4-H Classes are based off of age.
- Suggestion: If a FFA Exhibitor has never shown the species before they are in Novice, if a FFA Exhibitor has shown the species before (regardless of the organization) they are in Advanced.

Use Hired Judges for Round Robin, the College Students Don't Have the Confidence Necessary to Remove Someone for Poor Behavior.

Guidelines for a Youth Auctioneer - Should they Sell More than Just Their Animal? Other Exhibitors are not Allowed to Represent themselves on the Auction Block.

Suggestions Submitted

Enforcing Rules & Establishing a Consequence Policy

- Feedback stated that some of these rules were not being enforced: Scooter on grounds, dogs on grounds, uniforms not being correct, aggressive behavior clause during round robin, tear-down procedure, others clipping animals.
- Suggested Solution: Enforcement/Warning procedure

Enforce Rule #17 No Skateboards, Scooters, Motorized Bikes, or Bicycles Allowed on the Fairgrounds.

- Potential Solution: Remind Exhibitors to Read and Abide by all rules in the Exhibitor Handbook at a Club Level AND Remind Exhibitors at the Exhibitor Meeting.
- Potential Solution: Signs on All Gates About What is Allowed.

Uniform Rules need to be Enforced

- Current rule states that an exhibitor cannot enter the ring without the proper uniform.
- Current Uniforms: <u>FFA</u> The official FFA show uniform shall be worn by all FFA exhibitors any by helpers in individual and chapter groups while showing at Fairs and Livestock Shows. The uniform shall consist of white trousers, white dress shirt or blouse, the official FFA necktie or scarf, and FFA Jacket. Hats or headgear of any kind shall not be worn with the official show uniform while showing. Footwear to be closed toed. <u>4-H</u> BOYS 4-H hat green for all ages, worn on the head at all times. White shirt long or short sleeved. Dark green tie with 4-H emblem. White or off-white trousers or navy dark blue jeans/trousers. Belt must be worn if trousers have belt loops. Footwear and belts clean and/or polished. Footwear to be closed toed. GIRLS 4-H hat green for all ages, worn on the head at all times. White skirt or white or off-white slacks, or navy dark blue jeans/trousers and short or long sleeve blouse with 4-H collar. No sleeveless blouses or shirts. Footwear and belts clean and/or polished. Footwear to be closed toed. Long sleeve shirts are mandatory for all Rabbit Exhibitors.
- Potential Solution: Make the 4-H Uniform and FFA Uniform the State Mandated Uniform
 - o 4-H: A plain white shirt with a collar, dark blue, black, or white pants. (Optional: 4-H Tie or Scarf worn under the collar. Official Green 4-H Hat branded with the UC ANR and the 4-H clover logo mark.)
 - FFA: An official FFA jacket zipped to the top, white trousers and black socks, white collared blouse or shirt, official FFA tie or official FFA scarf, black closed toe shoes.
- Potential Solution: Should a Tehama County Organization want to enforce a stricter uniform they could send a representative to be ring side to enforce the uniform.
- Potential consequences for not being in the official uniform: Not Entering the Ring unless in official uniform and a monetary fine if they remove their uniform in the ring.

What triggers a replacement animal for auction?

• Potential Solution: A rule that allows Fair Management to evaluate each scenario on a case by case basis.

Suggestions Submitted

Not Enough Pen Space in Sheep Barn

- Potential Solution: Eliminate Non-Market Classes
- Potential Solution: Eliminate Fitting Areas in Sheep Barn

Pop-Up Tents for Day Camps in the Sheep Barn Leaving Little Room for Fitting Areas

Potential Solution: Divide up the area that does not have pens per club

Change the Sheep and Goat Schedule to Sheep Showing One Day, Goats Showing the Next Day

Something to Consider: All Market Classes need to be on Thursday

Hog Volunteers - Require 1-2 Parets per club in the back, ring, and barn during the show, so the same volunteers aren't there all day.

- Potential Solution: Online sign-ups requiring 1-2 parents per club to help.
- How many people are needed? How long should shifts be?

Poultry Pens Should be Two Birds Instead of Three to Eliminate Parent Handlers in the Show

In Order to Raise Auction Prices, it was Suggested to Limit the Number of Animals per Species with a a Lottery.

Sale Day Etiquette

- Two exhibitors in uniform were asked by a buyer if they could have their seats on the floor at the auction, the exhibitors refused.
- Exhibitors and parents eating lunch before buyers has been served.

Topic Getting the Buyer's Lunch out More Efficiently

- Potential Solution: The caterer is bringing more staff.
- Kid's hanging out lunches were confused and needed more direction.
- Potential Solution: Have a volunteer adult giving the lunches to the exhibitors and giving them direction i.e, start on the floor, then go to the grandstands.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK RULES

2024 EXHIBITOR HANDBOOK

GENERAL RULES

- Tehama County Residents: All Junior Market Animal exhibits and Junior Livestock Auction entries are limited to Tehama County exhibitors. Other exhibitors may exhibit with prior approval from the Tehama District Fair Board of Directors. A junior exhibitor may sell at only one County or District Fair Livestock Auction during the year.
- 2. **Commission:** A sale commission of 7% will be charged by Auction Management on the gross sale price of all sale animals. These funds are to be used to meet necessary expenses in connection with the auction.
- Auction Rules: There will be no buy-back or live pick-up on any animal. It is a terminal sale for all market animals, meaning all animals will be sold and processed for consumption.
- 4. Absence Excusal Review: The legal owner must show and sell his/her own animal in all conformation classes and the sale ring. Any exception MUST BE APPROVED in advance by the Tehama District Fair Board of Directors. Only exhibitor's written explanations will be accepted. Exhibitor written excusal letters are to be delivered or mailed to the Fair Office no later than 5:00 PM, Friday April 5th. Each request will be ruled upon on an individual basis during the April Board of Directors Meeting. Letters can be mailed to PO Box 70, Red Bluff, CA 96080.
- 5. Enrollment Dates: 4-H Members must be enrolled in a Tehama County 4-H Club by October 25, 2023; be 9 years old on December 31st, 2023; and meet the minimum completion requirements by the club due date to be eligible to sell their animals. FFA Members must have enrolled in their respective Tehama County organization by August 31st, 2023, to be eligible to sell their animals.
- 6. Independent Exhibitors must follow all rules outlined in the Independent Exhibitor Packet.
- 7. Ownership Dates: All market animals must be properly tagged by the leader or exhibitor. Market beef 120 days prior to the Fair. Market goats, lambs, and swine 60 days prior to the Fair. Market rabbits and poultry 30 days prior to the Fair. A picture of the tagged animal with the exhibitor and a hair sample (in a clear, plastic bag provided by the Fair Office) must be turned in by the specie ownership date. All animals offered for sale must show an ear tag or leg band that corresponds to the master list.
- 8. **Lost Ear Tags:** Should an animal lose or break their Tehama District Fair ear tag, please contact the Fair Office immediately.
- 9. **Proof of Ownership:** All exhibitors selling an animal must show proper proof of ownership; Brand Inspections or a Bill of Sale showing all brands, marks, breed, date purchased, amount purchased, and signed by the seller to be submitted with entry forms.
- 10. Proposition 12 Certification: All market hogs entered in the Tehama District Fair must be purchased from a certified pork producer that is in compliance with Proposition 12 Animal Confinement regulations. When purchasing a Market Hog, exhibitors must obtain a copy of the producers Certificate of Compliance to turn into the Fairgrounds with the Livestock Entry Form, Bill of Sale, and YQCA Certificate.
- 11. YQCA Program: To participate in a youth livestock program (excluding horse, cavy, and dogs) at any California Fair, all exhibitors 9 years of age and older must obtain annual certification in the Youth for the Quality Insurance of Animals (YQCA) program or a comparable Fair-run program approved by the California Department of Food and Agriculture, Fairs and Expositions Branch. Those not certified are not eligible to participate in a California Fair. Website to complete trainings: www.yqcaprogram.org

- 12. **Quality Standards:** It is the intent of the Division of Fairs and Expositions that the quality standards established for Market Animals be maintained. Therefore, classifications will be subject to change in the event there are changes made in the federal grading.
- 13. All animals deemed "Market Ready" must sell at the terminal auction.
- 14. Animal Arrival: All beef cattle, sheep, hogs, meat goats, and pygmy goats must be in place and on the grounds by Wednesday, May 1st at 6:30 PM. Please enter through the Trinity Gate. Dairy Cattle and Dairy Goat Exhibitors must be on the grounds by 6:00 PM on Tuesday, April 30th for a Health and Registration check. Poultry Exhibitors must enter through Gate #3 by the Shop and Fair Office for a health inspection prior to entering the grounds between 1:00 3:00 PM on Wednesday, May 1st at 6:30 PM. Market Rabbit Exhibitors must be on grounds by 10:00 AM on Thursday, May 2nd. All animals, excluding poultry, can start arriving on the grounds Tuesday, April 30th.
- 15. Weigh-Ins: Large Market Animals for which weight certificates are required must be weighed between 3:00 6:30 PM on Wednesday, May 1st. Market Poultry will be weighed and inspected on Wednesday, May 1st between 1:00-3:00 PM. Market Rabbits will be weighed in front of the judge during the Market Class on Thursday, May 2nd. If any animal fails to meet the minimum weight requirements or is over the maximum allowed weight for the species the following procedure will be followed by the weighmaster: The animal will be removed from the scales, the scales rebalanced, and the animal weighed again if requested by the exhibitor. Under no circumstances shall the animal leave the scale area. All market animals not meeting the minimum or maximum weight requirements for their species will be sifted from the sale.
- 16. Sifting Weight: All livestock species will have a minimum and a maximum sifting weight. Exhibitors will be paid for every pound within those limits. See each species for details.
- 17. Back-Up Animals: Each exhibitor is limited to One Primary Market Animal and Three Market Back-Up Animals of the same species. A "Back-Up" is defined as additional animals that are tagged and listed on the entry form that can replace the primary animal of the same species for any reason. If an Exhibitor chooses to have more than one back-up animal, there will be a \$20 Tag charge for each additional Back-Up Animal (maximum of \$40). All Back-Up Animals must be tagged and have a DNA Sample and Picture on file at the Fair Office by the 120/60 Day Ownership dates. Each Back-Up Animal must be listed on the entry form (free of any entry fees) to be eligible to replace the primary animal. Family Back-Ups are allowed if siblings are exhibiting the same species. Each exhibitor must list the back-up animal(s) on their entry form. If the exhibitor's primary market animal fails to meet weight requirements or fails the veterinary check at weigh-ins the "Back-Up" animal(s) may be weighed. Large Animals: The Back-Up Animal(s) must be on grounds for it to be weighed, after the primary animal is sifted. If the first animal across the scale is NOT sifted, the back-up animal cannot be weighed or unloaded on the grounds. Small Animals: If a pen of three is sifted for weight, defects, or veterinary issues at weigh-ins the exhibitor will have two options; either replace ONE animal in their pen for ONE other animal or the exhibitor may choose to replace the entire pen or another pen. The exhibitor must choose one or the other, they cannot do both.
- 18. **Animal Removal:** Market Animals (Excluding Rabbit and Poultry Meat Pens) will be loaded for release by the Tehama District Fair Staff Saturday, May 4th after 10:00 PM. Rabbit & Poultry Meat Pens will be released Monday, May 6th at 7:00 AM. Breeding projects, tack, and decorations may be released before the opening of the Fair at Noon or after 7:00 PM on Sunday, May 5th.
- 19. Registration Papers: All registration papers must be checked by Wed, May 1st at 6:30 PM.
- 20. **Mandatory Exhibitor Meeting:** All exhibitors must attend the Mandatory Exhibitor Meeting Wednesday, May 1st at 7:00 PM in the Don Smith Pavilion.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK RULES CONTINUED

2024 EXHIBITOR HANDBOOK

- 21. **Auction Requirements:** To sell in the Junior Livestock Auction exhibitors must meet the following requirements:
 - a. Must have shown the project in a Market Class
 - b. Market Beef, Goats, Lambs, and Swine must have placed in Group 1 or 2
 - c. All qualifying Rabbit and Poultry pens will sell.
- 22. Poultry & Rabbit Auction Ring Requirements: All three animals in the meat pen must enter the sale ring. Carts and wagons are allowed to bring the animals into the ring. Other exhibitors are allowed to assist in the handling of the three animals in the ring. Those exhibitors must be entered in the Fair and in official uniform.
- 23. Supervision of Junior Livestock Exhibitors
 - a. Adult supervisors are required for all overnight exhibitors.
 - b. Junior Exhibitors who, in the opinion of Fair Management, fail to conform to acceptable standards of conduct will be removed immediately with exhibits from the Fairgrounds and all premiums forfeited.
- 24. **Health Check**: A health check will be conducted on ALL livestock. Livestock will be inspected for obvious evidence of any active, communicable disease, found to be unsafe, or any other unsightly disease or condition. (State Rule X #3)
- 25. **Medications**: All records of medications administered during the Fair must be given to the Livestock Supervisor.
- 26. **Drug Testing:** Use of Drugs, the use by non-veterinarians* of animal drugs or other substances in any manner other than in accord with the labeling approved by FDA is a violation of federal law. Exhibitor and exhibitor's parents and/or guardians agree that: (1) they are absolutely and completely responsible persons for the care and custody of their animals, (2) the Tehama District Fair shall be entitled to disqualify an exhibitor whose animal tests positive for any drug, even if the exhibitor and the exhibitor's parents or guardians are innocent of any wrongdoing and did not administer the drug, (3) the drug test results of the testing laboratories are final and binding upon the exhibitor and the exhibitor's parents and/or guardians. Even if the source of the drug is unknown, the Tehama District Fair shall be entitled to disqualify the exhibitor. All livestock projects entered in the Tehama District Fair may be drug tested at the Fair's discretion. *Abuse of the extra-label privilege by veterinarians is unethical and is subject to serious consequences such as license revocation.
- 27. **Paylean Ingestion in Hogs:** Paylean must be withheld from market hogs for a minimum of 10 days prior to arrival at the Fair and cannot be administered at the Fair.
- 28. DNA Testing: The Tehama District reserves the right to DNA Test market animals.
- 29. **Safe Handling:** Exhibitors must safely handle and manage their livestock. Unruly animals may be released from the Fairgrounds, all premiums and sale privileges forfeited.
- 30. Aggressive/Abusive Behavior Towards Livestock: The Tehama District Fair highly discourages, does not condone, and will not permit aggressive behavior towards animals. If such behavior is witnessed the first offense will be handled with a warning, a second offense will result in the disqualification of the exhibitor and all entries by show management. All prize money and awards will also be forfeited. Protests against disqualification will not be permitted.
- 31. **Bedding**: The exhibitor must supply all bedding. The first bedding only, will be furnished by the Fairgrounds.

- 32. Clean Stalls: Public access through the barns cannot be restricted by exhibitor's feed, equipment, or personal belongings. Each space used by the exhibitor must be kept clean. The general appearance must always be neat. All stalls and pens must have clean bedding in place by 9:00 AM daily.
- 33. **Feeding Livestock**: Livestock Exhibitors will be admitted in Gate 13 Trinity Lot for feeding purposes from 6:00-8:00 AM. Vehicles are not allowed on grounds after 10:00 PM on Wed. May 1st. Everyone must have an admission pass or wristband to enter the gate.
- 34. **Fitting:** Junior Exhibitors are expected to groom and care for their animal(s) when at the Fair. They shall refrain from accepting assistance from adults unless the Junior Exhibitor is actively engaged, and the assistance is for instruction or safety.
- 35. **Exhibitor Assistance:** Livestock Exhibitors will be allowed one 4-H, FFA, or Independent Exhibitor from a neighboring county to assist with livestock projects while at the Fair. That exhibitor is to check in before the Exhibitor Meeting to receive an admission wristband.
- 36. **Pop-Up Tents:** Pop-Up Tents with walls are not allowed in any livestock area. Pop-Up Tents without walls, made from nonflammable material or treated with a flame-retardant chemical approved by the Office of the State Fire Marshall may be placed around Livestock Areas. Any tent or equipment deemed by Fair Staff to be hazardous, in the way, or blocking fire lanes must be moved.
- 37. **Uniforms:** All exhibitors must wear their official uniform when selling or showing their animals. Those not wearing the entire, official uniform will not be able to enter the Show Ring or Sale Ring. Please see uniform requirements on Page 60.
- 38. **Showmanship:** To compete in a Showmanship Class, exhibitors must also be entered in a conformation or market class. Exhibitors cannot compete solely in showmanship.
- 39. Class Requirements: Three entries by two or more exhibitors constitutes a minimum show class unless otherwise specified. Show management reserves the right to transfer entries or combine division and classes. If it is the opinion of show management that the entries are insufficient to secure adequate competition.
- 40. Junior Livestock Auction checks will be released no later than June 7th, 2024. The exhibitor must be present to sign for and receive the check. Thank you cards for the Buyer and all Add-Ons are required to pick-up the check.
- 41. **Premiums**: Payouts will be Jackpot Style. The office charge per entry will be \$5. For example, an entry fee of \$15 will result in \$10 in the payout pot. Breakdown below.

STATEMENT OF EXHIBIT PRINCIPLES

The Division of Fairs and Expositions believes the mission of competitive exhibits at fairs is to ensure the competition is educational, ethical, and equitable. This will be accomplished in a manner representing the highest integrity and standards of all participants.

Upon submittal and signature of the entry form, exhibitors (Including Agents and Junior Exhibitors' Parents/Leaders/Advisors) acknowledge and agree to the following principles for competition.

- Exhibitors will comply with printed Fair and State Rules and accept all responsibility for their exhibitors.
- 2. Exhibitors will indemnify Fairs & Expositions and the Fair from any loss resulting from rules enforcement.
- 3. Exhibitors must be able to prove their own eligibility and that of their exhibits according to Fair rules and acknowledge that misrepresentation of any kind is prohibited.
- 4. Junior Exhibitors are expected to prepare, manage, and present their own exhibits.
- 5. Exhibitors will conduct themselves with sportsmanship, integrity, and cooperation with all participants.
- 6. In the case of animals:
 - a. Exhibitors will exhibit healthy animals and handle them with care; and
 - b. Exhibit them in their unaltered conformation, except for common husbandry practices; and
 - c. Use all pharmaceuticals, biologics, and other chemicals lawfully and with notification to fair management as it specifies.
- 7. The Board of Directors will not be accountable for loss or damage. Exhibitors must give attention to their articles or animals during the Fair and at the close of the exhibition.

IN FULFILLMENTS OF ITS RESPONSIBILITIES, Fairs and Expositions and the Fair agree to the following principles for competition.

- 1. The Fair will advocate and enforce printed rules.
- 2. In case of rule violations or in practices determined to be unethical with the competitive exhibit program,
 - a. The Fair has the right to deny entry or remove any exhibitor or exhibit that is determined ineligible, or whose presentation is deemed not in the best interest of the Fair, endangers the public, or has violated the rules.
 - b. The Fair shall discipline such exhibitors as deemed appropriate; and
 - c. The Fair shall submit a written report of such discipline to the appropriate governing body of the Divisions of Fairs, regulatory agency, youth, or breed association.
- 3. Fair staff will conduct themselves with integrity, professionalism, and cooperation with all participants.
