While most fairs in North America are funded, at least in part, by government subsidies or tax dollars, we operate as a not-for-profit, growing only with the support of our guests and our community. In turn, and in thanksgiving, we are proud to give back to the Town of West Springfield. Since the inception of The Big E/West Springfield Trust, our monetary contributions have totaled more than \$4.2 million, benefiting youth, elderly and educational programs. Last year, ESE donated \$236,423 to the fund for future disbursements.

As we embark on our 104th year, we do so with a renewed commitment to attracting unique, high-quality exhibits that both entertain and educate; booking well-known celebrity talent to delight; and improving our facilities for the safety and comfort of our guests. This is all done with the underlying goal of continuing to deliver a caliber of attractions that will not only spark joy, but further weave our organization into the tapestry—or should I say Tartan—of the Town of West Springfield.

Past grant recipients have included the West Springfield Public Schools and Town Departments including the Council on Aging, DPW, Fire and Police. **Notably, \$100,000 was donated to The West Springfield Public Library Building Fund**. In addition, local organizations like historical groups, veteran organizations and countless sports teams have also been beneficiaries.



Additional Contributions — more than \$165K

- Our Coliseum hosts the **West Springfield High School graduation** each year, free of charge to the Town.
- Three West Springfield High School seniors are the recipients of \$1,000 **Big E scholarships.**
- The West Springfield Boys & Girls Club receives an annual donation of \$4,500 from ESE. Area Boys and Girls Clubs have been deemed the philanthropic partner of Hooplandia.
- We play host to four Family Concerts **on the Village green**, providing necessary staffing, insurance, security, power and trash removal.
- Free Parking to all Town residents for non-Fair shows.
- ESE supports the **West Springfield St. Patrick's Day committee** and offers its Coliseum, rent-free, to build the Town's float.
- Students enjoy free admission to The Big E each year on West Springfield Day.
- **The Parish Cupboard** was the recipient of more than 1,000 pounds of premium beef which fed hundreds of our region's homeless and those in need throughout the year. ESE purchased the steer at the 4-H Beef Auction at The Big E.


