EASTERN REGIONAL FFA AGRISCIENCE FAIR CAREER DEVELOPMENT EVENT

The Agriscience Fair allows students to compete with their state winning agriscience project at The Big E. A maximum of 24 spaces will be provided. The space allocated will be 48 inches wide by 30 inches deep (the distance from front to back) by 36 inches high (from floor to top of display, this includes the table and project). It is preferred that Eastern Regional FFA Agriscience Fair Exhibitors display the results of their study utilizing a standard printed poster with dimensions of 36 inches (height) by 48 inches (width). Posters can be created utilizing Microsoft PowerPoint slide format. The display should be stable and free standing on the provided table top. Each participant is responsible for providing backing for the poster. Except for a copy of the written book, no other material may be exhibited with the poster.

ELIGIBILTY

Each state in the Eastern Region of the FFA may send up to **eight** agriscience projects. Projects submitted must have won a State FFA Agriscience Fair or be approved by the State FFA Advisor/Coordinator.

RULES

- All projects must follow the National FFA Agriscience Fair rules found in the National FFA Agriscience Handbook: https://ffa.app.box.com/s/x4rd2h4a6fvwkrf5yogk9jbwwxouehnr/file/289992625953
- 2. Agriscience Fair participants will only be judged on their interview and project display.
- 3. Judging will begin at 10am Friday, September 16, 2022.
- 4. Interview is 20 minutes, 5 minutes for student presentation, 15 minutes for judge's questions.
- 5. To insure fairness, each exhibit will be assigned a display spot by random drawing. A master copy of assigned spots will be available in the Farm-A-Rama office. Please fill out yellow exhibitor's card and hang on clip provided.
- 6. No electronic devices may be used during the judging of the project only the project poster and 1 copy of the written report may be displayed.
