Contest Tentative Schedule

Arrival at Gate 1: 7:00 Am- Check in teams and give name tags
7:00-8:00 Am drive to UCONN
8:00-8:10 Set-up and Welcome
8:00-8:30 Team Test- 20 minutes → 25 questions multiple choice
8:30-10:00- Team Event → 10 minutes to prep a 5 minute presentation for the judge → Following National FFA Rubric for the team event
10:00-12:30 Judging: 4 Halter and 2 Performance → Students will judge individually → Reasons classes will be decided ahead of time → 12 minutes for non reasons classes (halter NO tracking) and 14 minutes for a reasons class Halter: 2 minutes for each side 2 minutes close inspection (reasons) Performance: 12 minute class 14 minutes for reason class
11:30-12:00 Working Lunch: Reasons Prep → Students will be given rotations for the afternoon → Lunch is provided (let chair know if any allergies)
Reasons and Identification Rotation schedule- Put on the whiteboards → Identification ◆ 25 items (photos) multiple choice ◆ Individual → Reasons 1 ◆ Halter → Reasons 2 ◆ Performance
Load up to go back to the fairgrounds → Banquet tickets- 1 per kid and 1 for an advisor
