Since 2009, the Amarillo Rodeo has been nominated for medium-size Rodeo of the Year by the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association five times.

The top five nominees in 15 categories were voted on by all top PRCA contestants, participating contract personnel and dues-paying rodeo committees. The Tri-State Fair & Rodeo competed in the mediumsize category, determined by total added money. Belle Fourche, South Dakota; Coleman; Estes Park, Colorado; and Stephenville rounded out the nominations. Belle Fourche was awarded the honor in December.



Tri-State Fair & Rodeo Awards & Honors at annual TAFE Convention

The Texas Association of Fairs and Events (TAFE) recently presented 12 marketing awards to the Amarillo Tri-State Exposition for the advertising campaign developed to promote the Tri-State Fair & Rodeo. The plaques were presented at the TAFE Annual Convention and Trade Show in Galveston.

The Fair took home three first-place honors, six second-place awards and three third-place awards. The Fair competes in the attendance category of 100,001-250,000 attendees. First place honors included the categories of best radio commercial, promotional advertising-outdoor and social media photograph. The second place awards were for best newspaper ad-color, newsletter, media guide, multi-page material, social media campaign and follow-up sponsorship

program. Third place awards received by the Fair were for best magazine ad, promotional poster and TV commercial.

The TAFE Marketing Awards program recognizes excellence in marketing campaigns that promote fairs and events. The TAFE is an organization made up of over 200 fairs and festivals and approximately 200 associate members who supply goods and services.

Additionally, Virgil Bartlett, general manager of the Exposition was inducted to the TAF&E Hall of Fame during the annual convention.

Bartlett has served as manager of the Amarillo Tri-State Exposition and the Tri-State Fair & Rodeo since March 2001. The Exposition suffered from antiquated infrastructure and lack of vision. "With the help of our board of directors, volunteers and fair attendees, we have been able to turn things around at the fairgrounds. People tend to



see us as the nine-day Tri-State Fair & Rodeo, but actually we are here year-round promoting Amarillo and the facilities here at the Exposition grounds," said Bartlett. "With the money that is raised each year at the fair and rodeo (annual fundraiser for the Exposition) we have the ability to upgrade our facilities and continue to make Amarillo a place that people from across the U.S. want to hold their event at."

Bartlett is also active in the Randall County 4-H Program and has been awarded the prestigious State 4-H Alumni Award and TAFE Manager of the Year.
