Jody Bezner Named to the Western Heritage Hall of Fame

Family-oriented, philanthropic, dedicated leader, and forward thinker are just a few words to explain why Jody Bezner, owner and operator of Bezner Cattle and Grain in Texline, Texas, is the quintessence of western heritage.

Jody graduated from Texas Tech University in 1963 and was anxious to start farming. In fact, he had wanted to farm since he was 10 years old. In 1965 Jody Bezner and his father, A.J. "Doc" Bezner, purchased farmland in the northwest corner of Dallam County. Prior to purchasing farmland in Dallam County, Jody, his parents, Boots and Doc, and siblings resided in Hereford where they farmed.

Since then, Jody, along with his wife Kay and three sons, have developed their farming and cattle operations. The Bezner family farms corn, wheat, soybean, and irrigated grasslands. Additionally, the family maintains a cow/calf herd, a small feeder cattle operation, and a cattle feeding business known as Bezner Beef feedyard in Texline.

Jody and his wife Kay have been committed leaders in Dallam County and the 4-H program for many years. That commitment goes back many years as the couple first met while attending National 4-H Congress in Chicago. Jody has been honored for his service and leadership at the Dallam-Hartley Bi-County Stock Show, where he is a "top hand" buyer. Jody and Kay have been recognized at the county and state levels for their dedication as volunteer leaders, having received the Friend of Extension Award. Their three sons, Michael, Mitchel, and Stephen, grew up in the 4-H program showing livestock at the Amarillo Stock Show and Tri-State Fair, as well as shows across the state.

The Bezner family represents that "pioneering spirit" the Western Heritage Award was set out to honor. From Jody's parents, Doc and Boots, who were an early part of the fed cattle industry, to Jody and Kay and their sons and now their children: the Western way of life and the values that have made us strong have remained intact and passed down from generation to generation.
