Scott Hindman, president, called the meeting to order, once everyone had enjoyed the delicious meal prepared by board members. Guests for the evening were Potter County Commissioners H. R. Kelly, Robert Annual Meeting Ruiz and John Coffee. Board nominees moved to member status were Snuffy Boyles,

Kashion Smith and Peggy Detten. Nominees to the board were Bret Begert, Casey Minutes from the 2021 Annual Meeting were approved and seconded. Bradshaw, Casey Gahagan, Doug Hight and Adam Rivera. President Hindman gave a brief financial report for our auditor, Jeff Jackson, of Wilson Haag PLLC. Jim Allison delivered great news that youth and open livestock entries were around 2,500. Dr. Bob Robinson reported how well the scholarship fund is doing and that we have 11 area students currently on scholarship. Kim McKinney reported that the junior board was made up of 4-H and FFA members from 11 counties, and they put in over 750 hours. Hayden Foreman, Canyon, was named 2021 Volunteer of the Year. Hayden is active on the Horse Committee. Proposed bylaw changes were approved by members present. Updates were made to clarify voting members of the officer team, CEO duties within the officer

team and to increase the maximum number of board members from 130 to 150.

Amarillo Tri-State Exposition Earns Honors



The Tri-State Fair & Rodeo was again nominated for the Medium-Size Rodeo of the Year award by the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association (PRCA).

The top five nominees in 15 categories were voted on by all top PRCA contestants, participating contract personnel, and dues-paying rodeo committees. The Tri-State Fair & Rodeo competed in the medium-size market, determined by total added money. Belle Fourche, South Dakota; Arcadia, Florida; Jackson, Mississippi; and Cave Creek, Arizona, rounded out the nominees on the ballot. Belle Fourche was awarded the honor during the annual PRCA Convention in December at the South Point Casino in Las Vegas.

In early January, the Texas Association of Fairs and Events (TAFE) recently presented eight marketing awards to the Amarillo Tri-State Exposition for the advertising campaign developed to promote the Tri-State Fair & Rodeo. The

plaques were presented at the TAFE Annual Convention and Trade Show in Galveston, Texas.

The Fair received six first-place honors and two second-place awards. The Fair competes in the attendance category of 100,001-250,000 attendees. First-place honors included the categories of best live TV news coverage, radio commercial, follow-up sponsorship program, promotional advertising-outdoor, event poster and program/brochure/flyer (four-color). Second-place awards included best social media photo and media guide.

The TAFE marketing awards program recognizes excellence in marketing campaigns that promote fairs and events. TAFE is an organization of over 200 Texas fairs and festivals and approximately 200 associate members that supply goods and services.
