The first event to utilize the new restrooms was Restaurant Roundup, which happened to be hosting their 10th Annual event. "The newly remodeled bathrooms were a huge hit during our event," said Monica Barbee, event coordinator, Restaurant Roundup. "Having these fresh, clean, updated bathrooms gave a new feel to the entire Rex Baxter. I had a couple of people tell me it was nice to see the bathrooms come out of the 80s and into the 2000s! The renovation cost the Exposition \$ 174,000. Three Amarillo foundations assisted with funding \$65,000 of the project.
