2021 Rules and Regulations

All Pre-Junior Miniature Hereford Show exhibitors shall understand and abide by these rules and regulations as set forth by the Miniature Hereford Breeders Association in order to participate.

1. Eligibility for Entry
 - a. To be eligible to exhibit, the Pre-Junior youth must be 3 years of age but not 9 on Jan. 1 of the show year. Junior youth must be 9 but not 22 on Jan. 1 of the show year.
 - b. Exhibitors must be current active members of the Miniature Hereford Breeders Association. Siblings may share family membership.
 - c. Steers and heifers must be registered in the AHA and meet height restrictions in order to participate.
2. Rules and Regulations – General rules and regulations of individual shows apply to this division as well as those listed.
3. Ownership
 - a. Ownership of all animals must be established by Aug. 1, 2021.
 - b. **Animals must be in the name of the exhibitor.**
4. Possession, Care and Feeding
 - a. Animals entered must be in the possession of the exhibitor no later than Aug. 1, 2021. The exhibitor is responsible for the general custody, care and feeding of their animal when possible, or to help when it is not possible to care for the animal unassisted. Family members and fellow participants may help with these tasks.

- b. All animals in this division must be completely broke to lead for the safety of the exhibitor and others in the show ring. Animals not deemed fit will be removed from the show ring and disqualified from the competition.
5. Fitting of Animal
- a. All animals will be fitted and be presented in a proper condition for a beef show. Exhibitors are encouraged to help in any way that is safe and possible for them to do so, but not endanger either themselves, their animals or others in the process.
 - b. Alteration of conformation and structure by prohibited substance or unethical fitting is prohibited. Any violations of this rule will result in immediate disqualification without recourse.
 - c. The injection, use, or administration of any drug that is prohibited by Federal, State or Local Law or any drug that is used in a manner prohibited by Federal, State or Local Law will result in immediate disqualification without recourse.
 - d. Any physical or physiological attempt to alter the natural musculature or weight by use of injections or ingested material not conducive to the continued health or marketability of beef carcasses or for deception will result in immediate disqualification without recourse.
 - e. Every participant in consideration of their entry being accepted by the show, specifically represents that no animal entered is misrepresented in any way except trimming of feet and blocking of hair.
6. Official weight & height
- a. The weight and height recorded at the time of check-in will be the official weight and height of the animal.
7. Check weight & height
- a. The MHBA reserves the right, at its discretion, to check the weight and height of any animal.
8. Showing of animals
- a. Participants in this division are required to show their animals. Participants under the age of 5 will be required to have parental, sibling or other participant accompaniment in the show ring.
 - b. All participants may have parental, sibling or other participant accompaniment in the show ring.
 - c. Participants are to handle the majority of the showing and the use of the show stick. Assistants may help in the control of the animal.
9. Show harness
- a. All Pre-Junior and Junior exhibitors will be required to wear a show number harness for each animal shown in a class. These harnesses hold the number in place in plain sight.
10. Showmanship
- a. Any exhibitor who shows unassisted may compete in this class.
 - b. Animal must be owned and entered by participant to show in this class.
11. Safety
- a. The purpose for the Pre-Junior steer classes is to offer the opportunity to young cattlemen and women to participate in cow shows despite their lack of age required to show in a Junior Show. In many cases, these young people have spent HOURS at the barn with their parents and siblings working "show calves". To go to a show and not be allowed to participate can be boring and tiresome for those with less than developed attention spans. Although the rules and regulations have been set, safety is the most important factor in this event. We want these young agriculturalists to enjoy their showing days, from the

beginning on up, so please, make sure the children and animals are prepared to participate. Animals can be unpredictable, but the more time the exhibitor spends with the animal prior to the show, the better you can expect it to cooperate when the surroundings change.

12. Animal Health

- a. Animals entered must be within the guidelines of the Livestock Health Requirements. Make sure your animal has all the required paperwork completed in order to enter and participate in the show.

Brand inspections are required from areas within Brand Inspection Areas. Please check carefully the guidelines for each show, as they are similar but somewhat different.

SPECIAL RULES FOR OPEN MINIATURE HEREFORD SHOW:

1. Entries must be registered with the American Hereford Association. Animals with “pending” or “applied for” registrations are not eligible to show. Registrations must be recorded with American Hereford Association at the time of entry and must be on record at the time of show.
2. Entries are subject to provisions and rules for showing as set forth by the AHA Board of Directors and are subject to supervision of the MHBA.
3. All exhibitors must be current members of the MHBA in order to be eligible to show.

4. All entries may be measured and weighed. Maximum height to be shown in these classes is frame score 1 (one) on the extended graph of the MHBA Miniature Hereford frame score chart, 45 inches on mature females and 48 inches on mature bulls. Any animal exceeding the height limit will not be eligible to show.
5. All horned and polled Miniature Hereford cattle will show together.
6. Any animal without a legible tattoo will not be eligible to show.
7. Drench guns may not be used in any stall/pen, aisle or walkway. Stomach pumping, drenching tubes or any other method (by esophagus) is prohibited.
8. Cow/Calf classes. Any cow, regardless of age with a calf at side must show in the cow/calf classes. Calves must not exceed 270 days of age at the day of judging and be nursing.
9. Any person found to be misrepresenting their entries or not abiding by show rules may be disqualified from the show and not permitted to show.

6. **ETHICS:** See Livestock Department Rules.
7. **ELIGIBILITY:** Any regularly enrolled 4-H or FFA members are eligible to show. (See Livestock Rules)
8. **NUMBER OF ENTRIES:** No limit *(See General Rules)
9. **OPEN SHOW:** Youth exhibitors are permitted to enter the Open Show when separate entries are made and proper Open Show fees are paid.
10. **REGISTRATION:** Animals entered in this department must be registered in the records of their respective breed association (in the name of the exhibitor) on or before June 30, 2021. An official date recognized by the Show will be the date the papers were entered in the record book of the Association. Animals will be sifted at the time registration papers are checked. All Junior Breeding Beef Heifers must be in place by 4 p.m. Friday, Sept. 17, 2021; process, check registration papers between 1-4 p.m. Friday, Sept. 17, 2021. Original registration certificates must be available for inspection at time of processing. Sifted animals will not be allowed to compete in the Show. Heifers with incorrect registration papers or tattoos or other identification problems will be sifted. This information must be in order on arrival at the Show. The feeding and fitting period for junior beef heifers shall begin no later than June 30, 2021. If date on the certification is later than June 30, 2021, the entry will be eligible to show, **provided the exhibitor has in hand a letter from the association involved stating registration application was received in the association office before June 30, 2021.** Bred-and-owned Heifers are a partial exception to the aforementioned ownership date: Bred-and-owned heifers must be recorded with the respective breed association and exhibitor have in hand (at check-in time) a valid, original certificate of registration dated on or before Aug. 16, 2021.
Definition: Exhibitors of bred-and-owned heifers must be the breeder and the first and continuous owner of the animal entered. "Breeder" is defined as the recorded owner of the DAM at the time of service. "First Owner" is defined as the recorded owner of the DAM at the time the calf is born.
Sponsored Entries: Youth exhibiting animals sponsored by other shows or organizations which are retaining the registration papers must obtain a copy of the registration papers, or the papers themselves. In case of copies, both sides of the papers must be copied and presented to the Superintendent. The name of the show or organization must be officially shown on the papers by letterhead or official seal/logo.
11. **FITTING/SHOWING:** See Livestock Department Rules.
12. **BREED DIVISIONS AND CLASSES:** Six or more heifers of any single breed will validate a separate breed or division show. If less than six heifers of any one breed are processed at the show during paper check, they will show in the Other Registered Breeds Division. Miniature cattle will not be considered a separate breed. In the event miniature cattle wish to show in the Jr. Heifer show, they will show in the appropriate age division with full size cattle of that breed. Below is a suggested list of standardized classes for all breeds in the Youth Heifer Show. However, depending on the number of entries in any one breed division, Fair Management reserves the right to combine age classes and breed divisions as are deemed necessary. All management decisions concerning class breaks are final, without recourse to the Fair.
13. **PREMIUMS:** Fair Management reserves the right to alter the amount of premiums offered for class placing based on the number of animals entered.

14. **BEDDING:** Wood shavings for the first bedding. Additional wood shavings may be purchased at the Bill Cody Arena Office for \$10 per bag.

15. **TIE-OUTS:** For 2021 will be sand only. No hay or other bedding material will be allowed in the tie-out area.
