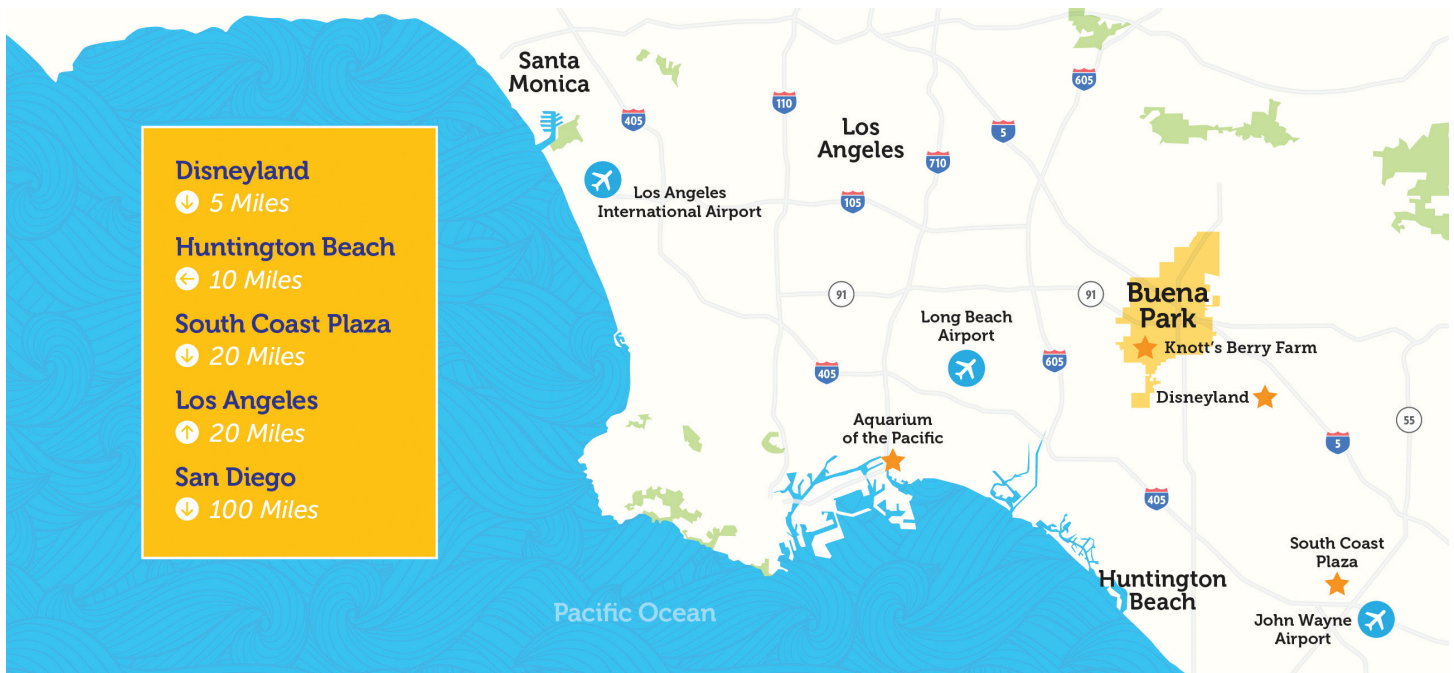

Foodies flock to Buena Park to check out Porto's Bakery and Café, formerly named Yelp's #1 rated restaurant and recently named the Los Angeles Times' Best of the Southland. For Tonkotsu ramen and tsukemen dipping noodles worthy of a MICHELIN Guide Bib Gourmand, visit Ramen & Tsukemen TAO. This unassuming soup shop takes great care in their savory broth, simmering it for over 40 hours to cook it to perfection. Grab a Chicago-style dog at Portillo's or some finger-licking comfort food at Mrs. Knott's Chicken Dinner. Rock out at Rock & Brews, the brainchild of Gene Simmons and Paul Stanley of KISS that offers American classics and over 60 craft brews. Sample award-winning restaurants such as Miss Shabu, one of Yelp's Top 100 places to eat in America, The Cauldron Bar Spirits and Brews or SUP Noodle Bar!

ENTERTAINMENT

Home to 5 of the 7 major attractions in Orange County, Buena Park's world-class entertainment includes Knott's Berry Farm Theme Park, Knott's Soak City Water Park, Medieval Times Dinner & Tournament, Pirates Dinner Adventure, Beach Boulevard Club, Big Air Trampoline Park, John's Incredible Pizza and Ralph B. Clark Regional Park. Most attractions are within walking distance from each other along the one mile stretch of the Beach Boulevard Entertainment Corridor.

EVENTS

Every visit is a new experience with seasonal celebrations all year long. Indulge in over 100 delicious treats during Knott's Boysenberry Festival, catch Snoopy and the Peanuts Gang in a Christmas ice skating show during Knott's Merry Farm, dig for real fossils on Family Fossil Days or catch a free outdoor performance

During October, Buena Park is transformed into the Halloween Capital of the World with over 1,000 menacing monsters at the largest Halloween event in the country, Knott's Scary Farm; family fun at the interactive dinner show, Vampirates; bewitching brews at the witch-themed bar, The Cauldron Spirits & Brews; and trick-or-treating with your favorite Peanut's characters at Knott's Spooky Farm. HISTORY OF BUENA PARK

The story of Buena Park dates back to 1783 when California belonged to Spain, and Pedro Fages was the Governor of this part of the country. He was given permission from the King of Spain to make land grants in California, and gave one such piece of land to Manuel Nieto, ex-corporal of the "Leather Jacket" guards of the Portola Expedition. This piece of land extended from the San Gabriel River to the Santa Ana River, and from the ocean to the road, from San Gabriel Mission. In 1834 Manuel Nieto's land was divided into five ranchos. One of the five ranchos was named Rancho Los Coyotes and totaled 48,806 acres. Buena Park is located near the center of this rancho.

Rancho Los Coyotes is a center of California and American history, for it was here in January 1847, that Commodore Robert S. Stockton and his band of Americans rested in preparation for the battle of the San Gabriel River. The battle was won and the outcome of the Mexican War (1846-48) was settled in this area. The exact location of Stockton's encampment is historically marked near the Los Coyotes Country Club in the Bellehurst area of Buena Park.

In 1885, James A. Whitaker, a wholesale grocer from Chicago, bought 690 acres of the Stearns Rancho, part of what was once the sprawling Rancho Los Coyotes. Whitaker intended to create a cattle ranch, but Santa Fe Railway officials convinced him to use the land for a new town. Whitaker filed his township papers in 1887 in Los Angeles County - Orange County had not been formed - to create the town of Buena Park. The City was not incorporated until 1953. Buena Park first became known as a dairy center and both the Santa Fe and Southern Pacific railroads built depots. The Lily Creamery started operations in Buena Park in 1889. With the exception of a few wineries, the creamery was the first industry in the city.

Over the years Buena Park has made great strides in creating a diverse entertainment area which offers a wide selection of hotels, restaurants, and themed attractions. The City of Buena Park has its own local history park located on Beach Boulevard. Travel back in time by touring the city's Historic District featuring several preserved buildings: The Whitaker-Jaynes House serves as the city's local history museum; the Bacon House is one the oldest surviving structures in the area; the Tice House, a charming cottage and the Stage Stop Hotel, is currently home to the Tourism Bureau for the City of Buena Park. At the Whitaker-Jaynes House, visitors can tour an extensive museum displays including items from the Lynx Women's Softball Team from the 1940's, a wedding dress display, a pictorial history of Buena Park's entertainment venues as well as the Dreger Clock and various photos of the famous clock throughout history.



HISTORY OF KNOTT'S BERRY FARM

In 1920 Walter and Cordelia Knott moved to their 20 acre property located near Highway 39 in Buena Park, California. The young family along with their four kids were determined to be successful farmers and soon enough their crop of rhubarb, asparagus and berries were delicious enough to sell at a roadside stand. Business was booming and Cordelia soon opened a tea room where folks came from miles around to buy her fresh jams and jelly. Their good luck continued when a family friend, Rudolph Boysen and Walter Knott created the boysenberry—a cross between a raspberry, loganberry and blackberry. Highlighting their signature new berry, Cordelia expanded her tea room and began making homemade biscuits, fried chicken dinners and boysenberry pies. As the restaurant grew in popularity so did the long wait times, which led to the creation of Knott's Berry Farm's first attraction – Ghost Town. Since 1934, over 20,000,000 guests have eaten at Mrs. Knott's Chicken Dinner Restaurant and it continues to serve the same famous menu – chicken, biscuits, and boysenberry pie. Over the years, the Knott family continued to develop Knott's Berry Farm into the one of the most popular amusement parks in America. In December of 1997, after 78 years of ownership by the Knott family, Knott's Berry Farm was acquired by Cedar Fair, L.P., owners and operators of family-oriented entertainment park brands coast to coast

NEW DEVELOPMENTS IN BUENA PARK

FIESTA VILLAGE

Fiesta Village in Knott's Berry Farm is getting an overhaul, transforming it into a space that celebrates the Hispanic roots of Southern California. New dining options, a marketplace reminiscent of Olvera Street in Los Angeles, and more will come to life in summer 2023. The foodie paradise will include an entirely new quick-service tacos and burritos option in the former Casa California space. Papas Mexicana will sell tried and true carne asada fries, among other delicious eats. La Papa Loca is being turned into Cantina Del Sur, where guests can order various specialty drinks. Last but not least, a taco stand dubbed Taqueria Fiesta will be on deck for a quick bite as guests go from attraction to attraction.

KNOTT'S BERRY FARM HOTEL

The Knott's Berry Farm Hotel will undergo a multi-million-dollar renovation that will pay homage to Walter and Cordelia Knott's humble beginnings and their contributions to the City of Buena Park through an immersive storyline. Every inch of the hotel will be touched by the remodel, from a brand new lobby to a revamped outdoor event space. Renovations begin in late 2022 and will continue into 2023.

MONTEZOOMA: THE FORBIDDEN FORTRESS

For over 40 years, Montezooma's Revenge at Knott's Berry Farm has delighted guests from around the world and will continue to do so for many to come – with a twist. A randomized launch sequence has been added to the coaster, leaving guests with a completely unique ride experience every time they get on the attraction. The indoor queue will show the remains of those who weren't lucky enough to make it out with Montezooma's gold. GAUCHO GRILL

At Gaucho Grill you'll be transported to the Argentinian mountains, where as the name suggests, Gaucho's grills up the best Argentinian steaks. HILTON AT THE SOURCE OC

Construction is being completed in early 2023 for a Hilton hotel in Buena Park offering modern guest rooms, a rooftop pool, and an on-site restaurant. The stylish new hotel will be connected to The Source OC, a shopping venue with innovative dining and entertainment experiences. Entertainment options include CGV Cinemas – featuring state-of-the-art 4DX and luxury cinema, and Olympic Golf Zone – with cutting edge screen golf.
