- 4. In my 1950 remodel, Denny Graves painted a mural of ballet dancers in a Cinderella motif on my wall. I also received an added cry room for noisy children.
- 5. I was once the Garland Pharmacy, but now I'm more frocks and jewels.
- 6. As a C.M. Brown owned movie theatre on Main St., I had a pipe organ and a cooling system. Now, if you like it hot and spicy you might like me.
- 7. I was renovated in 2010 to look more like my old self. In the early 1900's I was Handley's Drug Store, but now you don't need a prescription to get your morning fix.
- 8. I was a quilt shop for over 20 years, but now I like to "get down!"
- 9. I have been a Ford Store and a Dodge-Plymouth dealership but now I'm a bit Wild with a side of Grace.
- 10. We are the longest continually operating business in downtown, and we aren't just for farmers.
