- Tyler is home to famous football players Earl Campbell and Patrick Mahomes.



- Stanley's BBQ opened in 1958 and has been featured on the Texas Monthly Top 50 BBQ Restaurants.

- Tyler State Park and Lindsey Park offer top mountain bike courses.



- Tyler is home to three institutions of higher education - Texas College, Tyler Junior College, and The University of Texas at Tyler.

- Tyler Candy Company has been producing peanut patties, peppermint sticks, divinity, peanut and pecan logs, peanut brittle and coconut bars candy since 1941.

- Tyler is a regional medical hub with UT Health East Texas Medical Center, CHRISTUS Trinity Mother Frances, and a new Health Medical School, offering advanced healthcare for East Texas and beyond.



- Greenberg Smoked Turkeys started in Tyler in 1938.

- Tyler is home to Cavender's, John Soules Foods, Tyler Candle Co., Janie's Cakes, Sanderson Farms, Trane, and Brookshire Grocery Company.

- Tyler receives an average of 242 days of sunshine, 46.66 inches of rain, and 65 degrees average temperature year-round.

- Tyler hosts multiple popular events: Red Dirt BBQ & Music Festival, Azalea & Spring Flower Trail, Fresh 15, Rose City Airfest, and the Texas Rose Festival.


• *Bergfeld Shopping Center* - The oldest shopping center in Tyler features various unique boutique stores located in one convenient walkable area.
