


 Best of Show exhibits stand out. This was a three-sided display.

 Sometimes the simplest things are the most fun.











 Displaying exhibits – try to make it interesting!






 Signage doesn't have to be expensive or large. White boards can be used year after year.





 Recognizing your sponsors is important to show community involvement.






 Simple signs help in many ways. These clearly explain what the ribbons mean, that anyone can enter, and how many did.

 Great way to get community involvement.






 WSDA goes to the fair too! Do you invite local government to your fair?

 Here's a fun way to extend a knowledge test to more than just exhibitors.






• Kids with disabilities shine at the fair and are proud to exhibit.
