Walker County Fair Association Scholarship Application Information

Deadline for all Applications: Complete Applications must be turned in at the WCFA Rental Office during regular business hours on/before April 20. Also, a representative will be available at the WCFA Workday to collect, if needed.

General Requirements: Applicants must be:

- 1. Living and/or attending school in Walker County
- 2. Accepted for admission to an accredited college, vocational/technical school, or other institution of higher learning.
- 3. A member of 4-H, FFA, or FCCLA in Walker County and former exhibitor in the Walker County Fair
- 4. Graduating seniors

Applications must be typed and submitted with the following required documents in order behind the application.

- 1. Current high-school transcript showing class rank and grade-point average.
- 2. SAT, ACT, or TSI scores
- 3. Copy of letter of acceptance from an accredited college, vocational/technical school, or other institution of higher learning.
- 4. Letter of recommendation from a high school academic teacher
- 5. Letter of recommendation from a county extension agent, Career Technology teacher, or Walker County Fair Board Member
- 6. Record of Walker County Fair Association activities and accomplishments, with dates of participation, **in resume form** (*should not exceed two pag*es)
- Record of high school organizations, extracurricular activities, honors or special recognitions, church, and community service activities, with dates of participation, in resume form (Include FFA, FCCLA, and 4-H activities and honors – (should not exceed two pages)

8. Required Essays:

- A) What does "an investment in youth through community involvement" mean, and how has participation in the Walker County Fair Association impacted you? (<u>should not exceed one</u> <u>page</u>)
- B) Describe your future plans and career goals, in 250 words or less.
- C) Explain how you would benefit as a scholarship recipient, in 250 words or less.

Please do not submit extra information.

One WCFA scholarship applicant will be selected by the Scholarship committee to be the official applicant submitted for the Walker County TAF&E (Texas Association of Fairs and Events) scholarship.

The following committee sponsored scholarships require additional information.

WCFA General Scholarships:

Must have a minimum grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or equivalent.

WCFA Past President's Memorial Scholarship: no additional requirements

WCFA Rodeo Committee Scholarship:

- Must have a minimum overall grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale or equivalent.
- Must have been a Walker County resident for the past two years.
- Must provide proof of being a member of a sanctioned Rodeo Association for two of the past four years; and/or have been an exhibitor in the Walker County Fair for at least two of the past four years.

Jane Moorman Memorial Scholarship: no additional requirements

WCFA Rabbit Committee Rhonda Fairchild Scholarship:

- Applicants for this scholarship must have been a member of the rabbit club for the past two years.
- Write an essay that explains how you feel raising rabbits over the years has helped you as an individual and how this experience will benefit you in the future.

If you are <u>only</u> applying for a rabbit club scholarship, you are exempt from writing any other essay.

Robbie Alexander Scramble Heifer Scholarships:

• Applicant must have participated in the WCFA Scramble Heifer program.

Brennen Rushing Memorial Scholarship:

- Applicant must have plans to attend a trades school. ex: Welding, Diesel Mechanics
- Applicant must submit Trades School Program acceptance letter

Baked & Canned Goods Scholarship:

o Applicant must have participated in the WCFA Baked & Canned Goods Contest
