- NO FOR SALE signs may be displayed. The exhibitor is responsible for their own animals and must provide their own water and feed pans. A minimum gallon-size water container must be provided for waterfowl and other large birds. Food and water containers must be fully within the pens.
- If an exhibitor fails to participate in Herdsmanship, premium money will be withheld.
- Exhibitors are required to be present at the time of judging in order to collect premium money.
- Poultry with clipped wings or in poor condition will not be accepted.
- Poultry must be at least 4 months old.
- Entries are limited to 10 birds per exhibitor with no more than two (2) per class. Further, entries may be limited due to available space at superintendent's discretion.
- Animals must be properly cared for and pens cleaned by 8am each day.
- Any person carrying poultry inappropriately will have premium money withheld.
- Trios must be owned by the same exhibitor and may not also be shown as individuals.
- Transport cages may NOT be stored on fairgrounds.
- Poultry will be judged by the American Poultry Assn. Standard of Perfection.
- Crossbreds and commercial will be judged on appearance, condition and cleanliness.
- **Educational exhibits for this department are entered under Department 25, Educational Exhibits**
- All Leased Animals must have a lease agreement turned into the Exhibitors Office by August 5th.

These birds will not be judged in competition but are for exhibit purposes only.

Q – SPECIAL CONTESTS Entries limited to one bird per exhibitor per contest

1. Rooster Crowing Contest

Exhibitor must be present during contest. Birds will be placed in coops in common area and number of crows during a 20-minute period will be counted.

2. Funniest Looking Bird (chosen by public choice)

3. Prettiest Bird (chosen by public choice)

SPECIAL AWARD

High Point 4-H Poultry Exhibitor Award (given in junior, intermediate and senior divisions) will be scored as follows: (you must compete in all portions to be eligible to win this award) *Ties will be broken by the highest score on the knowledge quiz portion of the written test.*
