- 1. Any animal fresh under 2 years of age must be shown in the 2-year-old class.
- 2. All dairy animals must be in place by 8 pm, Tuesday.
- 3. No limit on animals per exhibitor.
- 4. Division Letters B-F will be showing rotation with Division A on Friday in the Activity Center.
- 5. Any grade animals may be tied in open class barn.
- 6. Dairy Exhibitors must show their own animals in the Showmanship Contests and must be enrolled in the project.
- All exhibitors must complete one of the following: 1) Attend any scheduled county wide dairy project meeting <u>OR</u> 2) If offered attend any dairy judging / evaluation practice for area animal science days <u>OR</u> 3) Exhibit at Wisconsin State Fair as a Junior Exhibitor.
- 8. All animals shown in Activity Center should enter from the south entrance and exit through the west entrance.
- 9. All rules and regulations on page 55 and 56 are required.

- 1. A spring calf is one born in March, April, or May of exhibit year.
- 2. A winter calf is one born between December 1 of the year preceding the exhibit year and February 28 or 29 of the exhibit
 - 3. A fall calf is one born between September 1 and November 30 of the year proceeding the exhibit year.
 - 4. A summer yearling is one born between June 1 and August 31 of the year proceeding the exhibit year.
 - A spring yearling is one born between March 1 and May 31 of the year proceeding the exhibit year.
 A winter yearling is one born between December 1 of the second year preceding the exhibit year and February 28 or 29
 - 6. A winter yearing is one born between December 1 of the second year preceding the exhibit year and February 28 of 29 of the preceding exhibit year.
 - 7. A fall yearling is one born between September 1 and November 30 of the second year proceeding the exhibit year.
 - 8. A 2-year-old is one born between September 1 of the third year preceding the exhibit year and August 31 of the second year proceeding the exhibit year. A 2-year-old includes a yearling that has freshened.
 - 9. A 3-year-old is one born between September 1 of the fourth year preceding the exhibit year and August 31 of the third year proceeding the exhibit year.
 - 10. A 4-year-old is one born between September 1 of the fifth year preceding the exhibit year and August 31 of the fourth year proceeding the exhibit year.

DAIRY REGULATIONS (Grade versus Registered)

- 1. All registration papers must be checked and it is your responsibility to get them to the Superintendent by Thursday 10 p.m.
- 2. All purebred animals or grades QIH grades must have registration papers proving 87.5% Holstein ancestry by June 1 of the fair year. (Including Red and Whites Holsteins). EXCEPTION: March-May heifer calves must be registered by July 1.
- 3. An animal may not be shown in a class in which they are not entered.

Miss Quality Contest

To be held at 1:00 PM before Junior Cow Show on Friday

Contest is open to all Junior Exhibitors enrolled in the Dairy project with registered or grade dairy cows. Eligible animals must be on a processed DHI testing program. Cows on Profitest are not eligible. Cows must be identified with an official number (i.e. registration or official ear tag) that corresponds to the identification reported on the cow's DHI record. Animals pre-entered or entered by noon on Wednesday of fair are eligible to participate in the Miss Quality Contest and if selected, the corresponding auction. Each exhibitor entering the contest must submit a minimum of two (2) names and addresses of potential buyers with their entry. Entries must be accompanied by either an Udder Health Management Cow List or an Individual Cow Record (ICR) at check-in.

The animal in each class with the lowest lactation Average Linear Score (two test minimum for lactation 1 animals) will be declared the winner.
