New Changes To the Swine Show and Auction

- There will **NOT** be a tagging day at the fair grounds for tagging and identifying the pigs. Each Exhibitor will be required to work with the Warren County Extension Office and make an appointment to check out the taggers, get and pay for the tags and tag your own pigs. The Warren County Swine Superintendents are willing to help anyone that needs help with the tagging of your pigs. Please watch the upcoming 4-H newsletter on the tagging and identification process.
- A photo **will be required** to be uploaded in the 4-H online identification process.
- Each swine exhibitor will be allowed to show a maximum of 6 pigs with no more than 2 pigs in any class.

- Pigs must have been shown in the Swine Show to be eligible to sell
- There will **NO LONGER** be a Pen of Three class for swine at the Warren County Fair.
- All pigs will be brought to the fair, vet inspected on the trailer, checked in and weighed in on Tuesday, July 27, 2021 from 6-8 pm. Please be patient with us as we get everyone through this process and stalled.
- All pigs must weigh between 210 310 pounds or they will **NOT** be able to show and will leave the fairgrounds on Tuesday evening.
- Each Exhibitor should be prepared to pen 3 pigs per pen.
- Warren County Produced (WCP) class winners will be represented in the final drive of their respected division.

You will be given a yellow card with your pig's tag # that will represent in the final drive

- The Swine Show and Auction will be held in the main big show ring.
 - This will require all pigs to be able to walk to the show ring and back for the show and the auction.
 - There will be some educational workshops/clinics available to you, to help you with this process before the fair.
 - Swine Clinics to be held on April 24th and June 26th 9:30 at the Fairgroundsbig showring

General Swine Rules:

To be eligible for exhibition in Market Swine Show, market pigs must weigh at least 210-310 pounds at the time of weigh-ins. All pigs, Market and Breeding, will be weighed only once, unless there is an obvious mechanical problem with the scale. The weigh-in weight will also be the official sale weight.

Pigs must have been farrowed on or after January 1st of current year.

Due to the limited number of pens available and the amount of pigs entered, the following rules must be followed:

- 1. Each exhibitor will be allowed to show a maximum of 6 pigs, which can be any combination of crossbred or purebred market or breeding animal.
- 2. Each exhibitor should be prepared to pen 3 pigs per pen.
- 3. The swine superintendents will have the right to reallocate pens among exhibitors if there are pens that are not being utilized by exhibitors to the extent of three pigs per pen. The number of pens that each exhibitor is assigned will be at the discretion of the Swine Superintendents.

4-H and FFA Market Swine

The buyers of the market hogs strongly encourage a voluntary 14-day withdrawal of any drug that has a withdrawal time limit.

Superintendents will have final approval and can dismiss hogs from fair and/or sale.

Non-Terminal show animals that are not going through the sales must be designated within an hour of show being completed. Exhibitor needs to tell Superintendents where hog is going after it leaves Fairgrounds. Those animals that are not going to be in the sale will be released at 9:00 p.m. Sunday night. Animals must be removed by 6:00 a.m. Monday morning if not going through sale.

Each exhibitor may exhibit a total of 6 pigs of any combination in the Crossbred Market Divisions or Purebred Market Division, or Breeding Gilts. These pigs may be barrows or gilts or any combination of each. If entries exceed the capacity of the swine facility, the number of pigs each exhibitor may be adjusted accordingly.

A maximum of (6) pigs may be show by each exhibitor. These can be any combination with a maximum of 2 pigs in any class.

Scale tickets will not leave the scale area.

County Fair Weigh-In/Check-In:

Check-in/weigh-in for all pigs will be Tuesday of the County Fair starting at 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Hogs will be vet checked before leaving trailer. Hogs will be weighed after vet inspection and penned. Vet Inspection form must be turned in at the scale.

- 1. Superintendent will verify ear notch tag and photo with 4-H Online. Uploading photos of ear notch/tag is required in 4-H Online for all hogs.
- 2. Photo, tag and ear notch must match swine that was entered in 4-H Online before May 15th of current year. Pigs will not cross scale until paperwork is complete and submitted: Drug affidavit and original purebred registration forms, and scale ticket filled out. If

no purebred papers are present, the pig can show down to crossbred. Registration papers must be in their original paper form and in the family name or the youth's name.

3. Any discrepancies between the pigs ear notch/tag/photo and 4-H Online information at weigh-in will result in disqualification. Your pig will be marked with livestock paint and walked through the scale, IT WILL NOT BE WEIGHED. The animal will go home by Tuesday night.

The Market Pigs, will be divided by weight into approximately equal classes.

Fair entries will be made by number of pigs and by entering σ department division class with ear tag number for each possible entry. A Breeding Gilt entry must designate specific gilt and tag.

All Market division swine weighing 210-310 pounds can be sold at the auction and sent directly to a slaughter establishment from the exhibition. No pigs can be sold in the Auction that have not been exhibited.

There shall be no coloring agents or powder used on hogs while at the fair. The use of either is strictly prohibited. Pigs found in violation will not be shown or sold.

Quarantined animals or animals from quarantined herds cannot be exhibited.

HF556 also say that the sponsor of the exhibition will need to submit a report to the IDALS (Iowa Dept. of Ag and Land Stewardship) on a form developed by IDALS stating where swine came from and where they will return after exhibition so that is some additional responsibility for fair board, Swine superintendents, fair vet, etc.

Warren County Produced Eligibility Statement (copies available from fair secretary): Animals must be born, produced and raised in Warren County. Producer must be a Resident of Warren County. Animal must be purchased directly from Warren County Producers. Form must be completed and turned in at Fair Entry Week.

All Warren County Fair 4-H and FFA Exhibitors will wear the official Warren County Fair exhibitor t-shirt tucked in, and in its original form while exhibiting (Exception-horse exhibitors).

Purebred Market Pigs

Registration papers are required for purebred animals in the original physical paper form. If no purebred papers are present at the time of weigh-in, the pig can show if properly entered down to crossbred. Registration papers are required prior to weighing. The original purebred papers MUST be in the family name or youth name - NOT the breeder name.

Pigs may be either barrows or gilts. The Purebred Registration Numbers are to be recorded on 4-H Online by May 15th.

4-H and FFA Swine Showmanship

Swine Showmanship (No entry fee required)

- Showmanship classes are limited to currently enrolled 4-H & FFA members.
- 2. Showmanship classes will be held at the beginning of the Swine Show.
- 3. All Swine Exhibitors are eligible to enter Swine showmanship classes.
- Exhibitors must use their own animal that will be exhibited during the Swine show that day.
- 5. All Showmanship exhibitors must wear their respective 4-H or FFA show shirts.
- Exhibitors are eligible to enter the classes by bringing their eligible animal to the Swine Show staging area when the grades are announced.
- 7. Divisions are based on school classes on September 1 of the previous calendar year.
- 8. Divisions are:
 - a. Junior: Grades 4-6
 - b. Intermediate: Grades 7-9
 - c. Senior: Grades 10-12

d. Master Swine Showmanship: previous division showmanship winners only.

- A Champion and Reserve Champion will be named in each division.
 a. Ribbons, Trophies, and Plaques will be awarded as available.
- 10. An Exhibitor may compete within each age division more than once. However, an exhibitor who wins a division (Jr., Int., Sr.) will not be eligible until they reach the next age division, but can show in the master swine showmanship class. Exhibitor may show in one showmanship ONLY.
- 11. An Exhibitor may compete in any, and all, Showmanship classes, i.e., Beef, Swine, Sheep, Dairy, Horses, Goats, etc., in which they have exhibited an eligible animal during the current fair, and meet all other requirements of that division.

Registration papers are required for Purebred Gilts in the original physical paper form. If no purebred papers are present at the time of weigh in, the pig can show down to crossbred. The original purebred papers must be in the family name or youth name -NOT the breeder name.

Exhibitor will receive the carbon copy of their scale ticket at weigh in.

County Fair Weigh-In/Check-In:

Weigh-in will be Tuesday 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

- 1. Superintendent will verify ear notch and photo tag with 4-H Online. Uploading photos of ear notch/tag is required in 4-H Online for all hogs.
- 2. Tag and ear notch and photo must match swine that was entered in 4-H Online before May 15th of current year. Pigs will not cross scale until paperwork is complete and submitted: Drug affidavit original purebred registration forms and scale tickets filled out. If no purebred papers are present, the pig can show down to crossbred. Registration papers must be in the original paper form and in the family name or the youth's name.
- 3. Any discrepancies between the pigs ear notch/tag and 4-H Online information at weigh-in will result in disqualification. Your pig will be marked with livestock paint and walked through the scale, IT WILL NOT BE WEIGHED. The animal will go home by Tuesday night.

All breeding gilts must be weighed and ear tagged.

Breeding gilts will be judged on conformation, soundness, and maternal traits that indicated long-lived productive sows.

A maximum of 6 pigs may be shown by each exhibitor. These can be any combination with a max 2 pigs in each class.

Quarantined animals or animals from quarantined herds cannot be exhibited.

Swine must be inspected before leaving trailer weighed and penned.

Breeding gilts will NOT be sold in the Market Pig Auction. They may be taken home, moved to a purchasers herd, or taken to slaughter by the exhibitor. Must follow quarantine guidelines.

The superintendents need to know where those Breeding Gilts are being taken after they leave the fairgrounds. Designate within 1 hour of show completing.

Breeding classes divided by weight. Enter by department, division, class and ear tag number. Classes will be split by weight.

Exhibitor must have signed up for Breeding Gilt class at Fair Entry time. Breeding or Market designation will be stated at fair weigh-in with the Superintendents. See Market Swine for procedure. How even gilts must be signed up under both a Market and Breeding gilt at fair entry time to be able to make a division designation at fair weigh-in.

There shall be no coloring agents or powder used on hogs while at the fair. The use of either is strictly prohibited. Pigs found in violation will not be shown.

HF556 also say that the sponsor of the exhibition will need to submit a report to the IDALS (Iowa Dept. of Ag and Land Stewardship) on a form developed by IDALS stating where swine came from and where they will return after exhibition so that is some additional responsibility for fair board, Swine superintendents, fair vet, etc. Breeding gilts may only show in one division. (cannot show same pig in Market Division).

First place class winners will show for Champion Crossbred or Champion Purebred. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand will be selected.

Breeding gilts will be dismissed from the fair at 9:00 p.m. on Sunday evening and must be removed by 6:00 a.m. Monday morning.

All Warren Country Fair 4-H and FFA Exhibitors will wear the official Warren County Fair exhibitor t-shirt tucked in and in its original form while exhibiting. (Exception-horse exhibitors)

A double entry fee will be charged for any changes made after entry week (the week following entry week).

Swine will be required to have the following:

Showing at the Warren County Fair:

- A USDA tag
- Ear Notches
- Photo of Ear Notches
- Additionally, if going to the Iowa State Fair, a DNA tag/punch is required.
- Photos that need to be uploaded in 4-H Online and tagging are the responsibility of the 4-H families/exhibitor.
- Address and Premise Id of where the Pig is kept needs to be entered in 4-H online

The Tagging kits are available at the Extension Office and will be available for pick up. They will need to be returned within 48 hours after you pick the kit up.

USDA tags are \$2 each and DNA tags are \$8 each. Tags needs to be paid for when picked up.

To request a tagging kit, please reserve your time on this JotFrom: 2021 Swine Tagging Kits (jotform.com). You will be able to reserve a time on either a Monday or Thursday. You will pick up the kit from the Warren County Extension Office at your registered time. We ask that you return the kit within 48 hours to ensure turnaround time for the next appointment. If you need help in tagging your pigs, please contact the Extension Office or a Swine Superintendent, as we would be happy to assist you.

If a Pig loses a tag: re-tagging procedures will apply.

Re-tag Form and Procedure

If your pig loses a 4-H or DNA tag, a Warren County Fair Superintendent must be present at the time of a re-tag to witness, reinstall the tag, and obtain signatures on a triplicate form with one copy going to the Extension Office, one copy to the Fair Office, and one copy to the Exhibitor.








The easiest method of reading ear notches is looking down on the pig's head from behind the ears. The right ear will be on your right side while the left ear will be on your left side. This method helps avoid mixing up the pigs right and left ear.

Examples for Reading Ear Notches:



Ear Notches

Ear notching is done on new born baby pigs for the purpose of identification. The pig's right ear is used for the litter number. All pigs in the same litter should have the same ear notch in the right ear. The pig's left ear is used to show individual identification for each pig in the litter. Every pig in the litter will have a different notch number in the left ear. Ear notches are read with the litter number (right ear) first followed by the individual identification number (left ear) read second.



The standard ear notch system will consist of a standard set of numbers and notches located in specific areas. Standard notches in the pig's right ear are the 1 notch located on the bottom of the ear near the pig's head. Meanwhile the 3 notch is located on the side of the ear close to the tip. The 9 is located on the outer half of the top of the ear while the 27 notch is located closest to the head on the top of the ear. The largest notch number is the 81 notch which is located at the tip of the ear. Any combination of the standard notches can occur with no more than two notches of any one number. For example 3 +3 = 6 and you never see 3 + 3 + 3 = 9. This does not exist and neither does 81 + 81. There is only one tip on an ear, so there can only be one 81 notch. The right ear has a maximum number of 161 (81 + 27 + 27 + 9 + 9 + 3 + 3 + 1 + 1 = 161)

Standard notches on the pig's left ear are are the 1 notch located on the bottom of the ear near the pig's head. Meanwhile the 3 notch is located on the side of the ear close to the tip. The 9 is located on the outer half of the top of the ear. The maximum number of the left ear is 26 (9 + 9 + 3 + 3 + 1 + 1 = 26). Yet, it is highly unlikely you would have 2011 pigs born in a litter.


When referring to right and left on a pig, we do so from the pig's perspective. Therefore the pig's right and left are the same as yours if you are standing in back of the pig, and right and left seem reversed if you face the pig (as in the picture to the left).

The pig's right ear is called the litter ear. It is similar to a last name. When a sow has a litter, all pigs in the litter receive identical notches on the right ear. Just like children in the same family have a common last name.

The left ear in pigs is like the first name for humans, every pig in the litter gets his own unique notch in the left ear.

Instead of names though, pigs are identified by

numbers. The number scheme is illustrated below.



Here to the left we see the relative quadrants of the ear: the 1, 3, 9, 27 quadrants, and an 81 may be notched at the very tip of the ear.


As you can see, two notches are allowed in each quadrant. All numbers in the right ear are added to make the litter number. All the numbers in the left ear are added to identify the individual pig within that litter.

With this system every number from 1 through 161 can be created on each ear.

Now lets look at some notching examples.




This is the 30-4 pig.

On his right ear there are two notches: one in the 27 position, and one in the three position. Add them together and we find he is part of the #30 litter.

On the left ear a three and a one notch have been made. 3 + 1 = 4 so he was the fourth pig in the litter.

His notch is 30-4. If we search the rest of the herd, we know that any pigs with 30 in their litter (right) ear are this pig's littermates (siblings). For example the 30-7 pig would be a littermate.



Here we have the 82-9 boar.

The litter ear adds up to 82 and the individual, or pig ear, is obviously 9.



Premise Id Number

Why do we need this Premise Id Number and the address of where the pig is housed to be entered into 4-H online?

As Swine Superintendents, we are **required** by the Iowa Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship (IDAHLS) to report information about the exhibitor and the pigs that show at our Exhibition. We are required to report the Exhibitor's Name, Address, and phone number. **We are also required to report the tag # and the address of where the pig is housed.** At this time, we are not required to report the premise id of where the pig is housed, but it could be required in the future. We also must report the name and address of where each pig went after the sale. This is a lot of information to gather, so with your help of filling in the address of where the pig is housed and premise id in 4-H online, it will help us to fill out this report after the show is complete.

Swine exhibition report required. The sponsor of the swine exhibition shall electronically submit to the department the approved report form within five business days after the conclusion of the exhibition. The form includes the name of the exhibition and the address and telephone number of its location; the name, address, and telephone number of the veterinarian: the date that the exhibition occurred; the name, address and telephone number of the swine; and the address and telephone number of the swine; and the address and telephone number of the swine; and the address and telephone number of the premises from which the swine came from and was moved to after the exhibition if such premises is a different premise.

How to Obtain a Premises Identification Number (PIN) or Location Identifier (LID) - State Specific Information:

A premises identification number (PIN) or location identifier (LID) is a unique code that is permanently assigned to a single physical location. PIN or LID registration is administered by each State and allows animal health officials to quickly and precisely identify where animals are located in the event of an animal health or food safety emergency. A PIN or LID is required to purchase official animal identification tags.

Identification Number Application

Once you have registered your premises you will receive a premise id card along with a letter from our office with a user id and password to access your account online or you may contact our office. Certain information in your account can be modified as your account and premises may change over time. We recommend that you provide updates to your account to keep information as current as possible. Some changes, such as status, sale, or transfer of premises, can only be made by IDALS; you will need to notify us when these changes occur.

**Please remember to bring your binder with all your important documents in it to Swine weigh-in

- When you arrive at the fairgrounds, there will be a line of trailers forming for the check-in. Stay in your vehicles and a Superintendent will bring you the necessary forms to be filled out.
- You will be given:
 - Vet Inspection sheet
 - Scale Tickets and Instruction Sheet

Both should be filled out before you are checked-in and inspected by the vet.

- Please note that if you have a sick/hurt pig on your trailer, the vet could send all pigs on that trailer home and not let them be allowed to show.
- Pigs will be inspected by the vet on the trailer. The signed Vet inspection sheet will be turned in at the scale.
- Pigs will have tags, notches and registration papers checked by superintendents and 4-H/FFA staff, while the pigs are on the trailer.
- Once all check in is done, you will unload and go to the scale for weighin. Scale tickets need to be filled out completely before you weigh your pigs. Scale tickets will not leave the scale.
- After you are done weighing your pig Putney Auction will be there to take a picture of you and your pig as you leave the scale.

- Superintendents will be available to help with stalling your pigs in the assigned pens.
- Superintendents will assign pens after the Pre-Fair Picnic.
- No tack of any kind will be allowed to be unloaded while weigh- in is taking place. This will prevent congestion and confusion when stalling pigs. You are welcome to bring your tack before or after the weigh-in.
- Feel free to decorate your pens you could showcase the producer you purchased your animal from, the buyer that bought your animal last year, etc. or just decorate your area for fun.

We ask that you please be patient during this process as we all work together to make check-in and weigh-in go as quickly and smoothly as possible.

Swine Show Day

Sunday, August 1, 2021

We will start with showmanship at 8:00 am with the show to follow.

Showmanship:

- 1. Showmanship classes are limited to currently enrolled -4-H & FFA members
- 2. Showmanship classes will be held at the beginning of the Swine Show.
- 3. All Swine Exhibitors are eligible to enter Swine showmanship classes.
- 4. Exhibitors must use their own animal that will be exhibited during the Swine show that day.
- 5. All Showmanship exhibitors must wear their respective 4-H or FFA show shirts.
- 6. Exhibitors are eligible to enter the classes by bringing their eligible animal to the Swine Show staging area when the grades are announced.
- 7. Divisions are based on school classes on September 1 of the previous calendar year.
- 8. Divisions are:
 - a. Junior: Grades 4-6
 - b. Intermediate: Grades 7-9
 - c. Senior Grades 10-12
 - d. Master Swine Showmanship: previous division showmanship winners only.
- 9. A Champion and Reserve Champion will be named in each division.

a. Ribbons, Trophies, and Plaques will be awarded as available.

- 10. An Exhibitor may compete within each age division more than once. However, an exhibitor who wins a division (Jr., Int., Sr.) will not be eligible until they reach the next age division but can show in the master swine showmanship class. Exhibitor may show in **ONLY** one showmanship class.
- 11. An Exhibitor may compete in any, and all, Showmanship classes, i.e., Beef, Swine, Sheep, Dairy, Horses, Goats, etc., in which they have exhibited an eligible animal during the current fair and meet all other requirements of that division.

Show Day:

- Superintendents will be wearing a blue Superintendents Shirt and will be around to help if you need it or have any questions.
- All Exhibitors will wear the official Warren County Fair exhibitor t-shirt tucked in, and in its original form while exhibiting.
- Swine Show will be held in the main, big showring This will require all pigs to be able to walk to the show ring and back for the show.
- Pig classes will be called to come to the showring exhibitors will walk their pig from the hog barn through the west end of barn 3 and to the showring where they will be staged in pens.
- There will be pens that the superintendents will put the exhibitor and their pig in when it is time to show... the judge will motion for you to enter the showring. Only one exhibitor and their pig will enter the showring at a time. A Superintendent will be there to help with this process.
- The judge will place the pigs and you will go back into a pen once placed.
- The judge will release the pigs from the pens as he talks about each one, you will then take your pig back to the barn.
- Remember to watch the judge, smile and have fun.
- Remember good sportsmanship and public perception are important.


***This is a new process and procedure. We will be having 2 clinic/ workshops to help you with this process... April 24th and June 26th at 9:30 AM at the Fairgrounds in the big, main showring.

Warren County Produced (WCP):

- Warren County Produced class winners will be represented in the final drive of their respected division.
- The Warren County Produced class winner will be the highest placing pig in the class that is designated as a Warren County Produced Pig.
- The Warren County Produced Affidavit must have been filled out, signed and turned in by the deadline in order to be designated and eligible to be shown as a Warren County Produced Pig.
- Warren County Produced class winners will be handed a yellow card (showing they are eligible for WCP Champion) with their pigs tag# on it as they leave the showring. Bring this card back with you to the Championship Drive.

Example1:

In the purebred market class, I am showing my pig #53 and it is eligible for Warren County Produced. I place 4th in my class. The first, second and third place winners are **not** eligible for Warren County Produced, so I am the first place Warren County Produced winner in my class. I will receive a Yellow card with tag# 53 wrote on it and I am now eligible to compete in the Warren County Produced Champion Drive.


Swine Auction

Monday, August 2

- The Swine Show is a non-terminal Show Market Animals do not have to be sold.
- Each Exhibitor may sell up to 3 Market Pigs
- Breeding Gilts will **not** sell.
- Pig must have been shown in the swine show to be eligible to sell at the auction.
- Swine Auction will be held in the main, big show ring This will require all pigs to be able to walk to the show ring and back.
- Note to your buyers, that there will be only 1 buyer/bidder number per animal when it sells- you will have to do splits on your own if more than one buyer is buying the animal.
- Feel free to decorate your pens showcasing your last year buyers, the producer, etc.
- Pigs will be sold individually and one at a time You will **NOT** bring all your pigs to the show ring to sell at the same time
- When you are called to the show ring for the sale, you will bring your pig from the pig barn, through the west end of barn 3 and to the show ring (the same way as you did on show day) There will be pens at the show ring to stage the pigs until it is your turn to sell. When you get to the show ring you will be given a card with the tag # of the pig you are selling. When you it is your turn to sell your pig, a superintendent or volunteer will take the card from you.
- After your animal is sold, you will walk your pig to the red podium which will be close to the exit gate there your pig will be given a paint marking according to who bought the pig. The exhibitor will be given back the card with their tag # and it will also have a marking on it that represents where the pig is going. After the pig is marked and the exhibitor has there card, the exhibitor will take the pig to the west end of pig barn 2 to be loaded out... The card the exhibitor has **MUST** be given to the loadout guys.
- Remember to Thank your buyers at the Sale and by also mailing a "Thank You" Card.
- Clean out your pens



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Iowa 4-H Code of Conduct For Youth and Families

Updated August 2019

The Iowa 4-H Code of Conduct applies and will be enforced with 4-H youth, 4-H parents/guardians, and 4-H families.

- While participating in or attending a 4-H sponsored program (e.g. club meeting, project meeting, activity, event, learning opportunity).
- While participating in or attending a 4-H event or while on premises used for 4-H purposes (e.g. County Fair, State Fair, show ring, exhibit building, barn, food stand).
- While representing Iowa 4-H to the public.
- · Additional programs, events, or opportunities may have additional rules and expectations.
- At all times throughout a 4-H youth's participation when behavior outside of the Iowa 4-H puts youth at risk or has the potential to put youth at risk.

The opportunity to participate in and/or volunteer with Iowa 4-H is a privilege and honor, not a right. All youth participants and parents/guardians supporting their child's participation in 4-H are expected to review and agree to abide by the Iowa 4-H Code of Conduct before becoming involved with Iowa 4-H.

1. I understand that the Iowa 4-H Youth Development program is a non-formal education program in which I have a choice to participate. I accept my responsibility

to engage in program activities and to excuse myself from this program if it does not meet my personal learning objectives. I recognize the organization has the responsibility to authority to remove youth who are disruptive to the 4-H Youth Development program,

violate the Iowa 4-H Code of Conduct, the standards of the 4-H Pledge and Motto or federal, state, or local laws.

- 2. I accept my responsibility to represent the Iowa State University extension and Outreach 4-H Youth development program by holding myself to the standards of the 4-H pledge and motto. I will refrain from behavior that negatively represents myself, my family, my community, 4-H, or Iowa State University. I will act in a respectful and responsible manner during all 4-H programs.
- 3. I acknowledge that the 4-H program utilizes competition related to project work as a tool for learning. I will ensure that my project exhibits are appropriate and respectful. I will demonstrate good sportsmanship, encourage this behavior in others, and not allow this behavior to detract from the learning experience. I will not let my personal desire to win overshadow the needs of the group.
- 4. I accept my personal responsibility to be informed and follow the policies, rules, and deadlines established by Iowa 4-H. I will not cheat, lie, knowingly furnish false information, deceive, or otherwise engage in dishonest, unethical, or illegal behaviors. I will not encourage others to disregard or intentionally violate conditions of Iowa 4-H participation.
- 5. I will comply with directions of 4-H officials acting in the performance of their duties. I will not obstruct or disrupt any 4-H program or encourage others to engage in such conduct. I understand that a judge's decision is final.
- 6. I will strive to be a positive role model. I will treat youth, parents, volunteers, extension and outreach staff, judges and others with respect, courtesy, and consideration.
- I will communicate (oral, written, and electronic) in an open, honest, respectful manner in all situations involving the 4-H program. I will refrain from communication that is negative, offensive, destructive
- or hurtful to others. I will refrain from sharing private matters in a public group setting.
- 8. I will promote a spirit of inclusion and welcome participation of individuals from all backgrounds. I will not engage in or tolerate harassment in any form. (For example, bullying, slander, put-downs, insults, taunting, name calling, yelling, profane language, sexual innuendos and other comments or hostile behaviors likely to offend, hurt or set a bad example.)
- 9. I will ensure a safe environment for myself and others by not carelessly or intentionally harming youth or adults in any way; emotionally, mentally, physically, socially, verbally, or non-verbally.
- 10. I will not possess, offer, or use tobacco, electronic smoking devices (including but not limited to e-cigs, vapes, joules), alcohol or illegal substances. I will not attend 4-H programs under the influence of alcohol or any illegal substance.

11. I will respect the property of others. I will not use, abuse, or take another individual's personal belongings. I will not damage facilities. Infractions to the Iowa 4-H Code of Conduct will be addressed by the Iowa 4-H Program, the local County Extension district, or their appointed representatives. Infractions to the Iowa 4-H Cod of Conduct will result in consequences. The consequences may range from a verbal warning to the loss of privileges (e.g. participation at the event or future events, forfeiture of awards or other forms of recognition, forfeiture of positions of leadership, limitation on volunteer responsibilities) to full removal from the Iowa 4-H Program.

FFA Good Conduct Policy and Code of Show Ring Ethics

Good Conduct Policy

All FFA exhibitors are expected to conduct themselves in a cooperative and courteous manner while participating in FFA events at the Warren County Fair. FFA members who wish to have the privilege of participating in FFA activities at the Warren County Fair must conduct themselves in accordance with the Good Conduct Policy. Use or possession of alcoholic beverages, tobacco or illegal drugs by any FFA member, regardless of age, on the Warren County Fairgrounds (barns, exhibiting facilities, campgrounds, etc.) will result in the following:

- If the violation occurs before or during exhibiting, the member is ineligible to participate in FFA activities at the Warren County Fair and must remove his/her exhibit(s) from the Fairgrounds.
- If the violation occurs after exhibiting, the member forfeits his/her premium money, prize money, trophies/ banners, and/or sale of champions money, and must remove his/her exhibit(s) from the Fairgrounds.
- The violation will be reported to the exhibitor's school for further action under the school district's good conduct policy.
- A meeting of the member, parent and advisor with FFA and Warren County Fair officials will be held to determine future member eligibility.

Code of Show Ring Ethics

FFA members participating in the FFA division of the Warren County Fair will be obligated to understand and abide by the *Code of Ethics described as follows:*

Youth are expected to be sincere, honest and act in sportsmanlike ways at all times. Youth represent the entire program and their behavior reflects on their parents, leaders, school and the entire youth program. All adults involved with the youth program, leaders as well as parents, are expected to set positive examples and serve as positive role

models by what they say and do. Any youth who breaks the Code of Ethics or allows another person (adult or peer) to talk the into violating the Code of Ethics agrees to forfeit all prizes, awards and premiums. The youth may also be prohibited from exhibiting at this and future exhibitions including the Warren County Fair and other county, state or regional exhibitions.

Youth agree to follow these guidelines:

- 11. I will do my own work, appropriate for my age and physical and mental development. This includes research and writing of exhibit explanations, preparing exhibits (building, refinishing, etc.) care and grooming of animals, etc. Adult assistance should help guide and support me, not do it for me.
- 12. All exhibits will be true representations of my work. Any attempt to take credit for other's work, after the conformation of animals, or alter their performance is prohibited. Copyright violation or allowing others to complete my exhibit is considered misrepresentation and is prohibited.
- 13. I will treat all people and animals with respect. I will provide appropriate care for animals.
- 14. I will present exhibits that are safe for consumption. All exhibits will be safe for judges to evaluate and for exhibition.
- 15. All food animals that may be harvested immediately following the show shall be safe for consumers, and shall have met all withdrawal times for all medications and be free of violative drug residue.
- 16. If any animal requires medical treatment while at the Fair, only an official Warren County Fair Veterinarian may administer the treatment. All medications that are administered shall be done according to the label instructions of the medication used.
- 17.My animal's appearance or performance shall not be altered by any means, including medications, external applications and surgical procedures. Any animal that is found to have changed its appearance or its performance shall be disqualified from the show and have penalties assessed against me, my parent(s) and/or guardian by the Management of the Warren County Fair.
- 18.I will follow all ownership and possession rules and, if requested, will provide the necessary documentation.
- 19. I will follow all livestock health requirements for the Warren County Fair, according to the state health requirements as printed in the Premium Book. I will provide animal health certificates from a licensed veterinarian upon request for the Management of the Warren County Fair.
- 20. By my entering an animal in this Fair, I am giving consent to the Management of the Warren County Fair to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. If the laboratory report on the analysis of any sample indicates a presence of forbidden drugs, this shall be evidence such substance has been administered to the animal(s) either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample tested by the laboratory to which it is sent is

the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on me, my parent(s) and/or guardian to prove otherwise.

- I am responsible for my exhibit and I will not allow others to iolate this Code on my behalf. By my entering an exhibit in this Fair I will accept any disciplinary action taken by the Management of the Warren County Fair for any violation of this Code of Ethics and any other rules of competition of the Fair without recourse against the Warren County Fair.
- I want my exhibit to be an example of how to accept what life has to offer, both good and not so good, and how to live with and learn from the outcome.
- I will not be involved in any illegal activities while participating in FFA events, including but not limited to alcohol, tobacco or drug use.

I agree to conduct myself in an honest, ethical and upstanding manner; and I understand that disciplinary actions will result if these rules are violated. I understand that I am expected to represent the program in a positive manner. I have read, understand and agree to follow this Code of Ethics and any other rules of competition of the Warren County Fair as printed in its Premium Book and other exhibitor material.

Iowa Youth Code of Ethics

Youth are expected to be sincere, honest and act in sportsmanlike ways at all times. Youth represent the entire program and their behavior reflects on their parents, leaders, club and the entire youth program. All adults involved with the youth program, leaders as well as parents, are expected to set positive examples and serve as positive role models by what they say and do. Any youth who breaks the code of ethics or allows another person (adult or peer) to talk them into violating the code of ethics agrees to forfeit all prizes, awards and premiums. The youth may also be prohibited from exhibiting at this and future exhibitions including the Iowa State Fair and other county, state or regional exhibitions.

Youth agree to follow these guidelines:

- I will do my own work, appropriate for my age and physical and mental development. This includes research and writing of exhibit explanations, preparing exhibits (such as sewing, cooking, refinishing, etc.), care and grooming of animals, etc. Adult assistance should help guide and support me, not do it for me.

a presence of forbidden drugs, this shall be evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either resumed that the sample tested by the laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken om the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the exhibitor, parent and/or guardian to prove otherwise.

I agree to conduct myself in an honest, ethical, and upstanding manner and I understand that disciplinary actions will result if these rules are violated. I understand that I am expected to represent the program in a positive manner. I have read, understand, and agree to follow this the rules of competition of the

fair or exhibition as printed in its premium book.

• I am responsible for my exhibit and I will not allow others to violate this code on my behalf. By my entering an exhibit in this fair or exhibition I will accept any disciplinary action taken by the management of this fair or exhibition for

any violation of this code of ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or exhibition without recourse against the fair or exhibition.

- I want my exhibit to be an example of how to accept what life has to offer both, good and not so good, and how to live with and learn from the outcome.
- I will not be involved in any illegal activities while participating in 4-H and FFA events, including but not limited to alcohol, tobacco or drug use.

IAFE (International Association of Fairs and Expositions) National Code of Show Ring Ethics*

Exhibitors of animals at livestock show shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics", fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be

so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in

accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

- All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
- Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
- Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
- Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/ or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminated with the animal entering the food chain shall not be

administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and

provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statues, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal

either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received form the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

• Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications

of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole

purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.

- The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
- Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or the exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the

competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no personal shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

• No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible personal shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.

- The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
- The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of

consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in many publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.

• The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statues, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

*This Code of Ethics was adopted at the Association of Iowa Fairs, Inc. Convention in December 2002, and revised in December of 2003. We, as members of the association, are printing it in our Fair book as a Guideline for conduct. All rules and decisions, whether General and County Fair take precedence.
