COUNTRY CREATIONS RULES & REGULATIONS
Washington County Fair Association

1. The Youth Department of the Washington County Fair Country Creations Division is open to any Washington County Youth in Kindergarten through Grade Twelve. Must live or attend school in Washington County.
2. An entry fee PER EXHIBITOR will be assessed and must be paid at time on entry of the Washington County Fair website. The fee for 2021 is **\$10.00**
3. Articles must be made by the exhibitor and completed since the last fair. Articles exhibited at a previous Fair cannot be entered. VIOLATIONS MAY CAUSE THE EXHIBITOR TO FORFEIT ALL RIGHTS TO SHOW IN THE COUNTRY CREATIONS DIVISION.
4. Business cards will not be attached to any articles exhibited.
5. Only clean and undamaged articles will be accepted for exhibition.
6. Exhibits are due on the specified date and time as listed in the Schedule of Events. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.
7. Entry cards should be completed PRIOR to delivering articles to the Country Creations building for exhibition.
8. All articles shall be tagged and tags attached to the articles before being received by the committee in charge of the respective departments.
9. Only one article in each class of each department may be entered unless otherwise specified. Miscellaneous articles shall be items other than those already listed in the department classifications.
10. The committee chairperson has the right to refuse any item.
11. The judges determine the ribbon worthiness of each item shown according to its own guidelines. The judge's critical analysis determines final placement.
12. Ribbons will be awarded to first place (blue), second place (red) and third place (white).
13. After judging a specific department, the judge awards the Grand Champion Rosette to the highest blue-ribbon item in each age group. The Reserve Champion Rosette will be awarded to the second highest blue-ribbon item.
14. Every effort will be made for the security of the exhibitors and others in attendance, but the Association will not be responsible for any articles broken, lost or stolen while on the grounds.
15. The Props committee makes the final decision regarding display of items, taking into consideration the safety and security of the exhibits.
16. No claim for injury to any person or property shall ever be asserted, nor suit instituted or maintained against the Washington County Fair Association or its officers or agents, Washington County, Texas, by or on behalf of any person, firm or corporations, or their agents or representatives, servants or employees, having license or privileges to exhibit on the fairgrounds or occupy space thereon.

17. All protests must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$100.00, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal, and must be delivered to the management of the Washington County Fair Association immediately after the occasion for such protest. Protest will be accepted prior to judging or immediately at the conclusion of judging. Depending on the basis of the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is complete.
18. Entry into Country Creations Division enables the exhibitor to apply for the Washington County Fair Scholarships.
19. NO EARLY REMOVAL OF ITEM. NO EXCEPTIONS.
20. ANY EXHIBITOR NOT ADHERING TO ANY RULE(S) OF THIS DIVISION MAY BE BANNED FROM THE COUNTRY CREATIONS DIVISION.
21. Advertising is not permitted in the building.
22. All exhibits and/or premium money not picked up by 2 PM on the Sunday afternoon following the close of the fair will be forfeited to the Washington County Fair. NO EXCEPTIONS.
23. Only items entered in the Country Store will be sold in the Country Store.

Open to any Washington County Youth in Kindergarten thru 12th Grade. Must live or attend school in Washington County.

The Youth division will be divided into three age groups for judging the above departments.

The three age groups are:

- Kindergarten - 3rd Grade
- 4th - 8th Grade
- 9th - 12th Grade.

ENTRIES MUST BE ENTERED THRU THE WCF WEBSITE.

Entries opens August 1, 2021 and ends September 3, 2021.

Entry Fee: **\$10.00**

NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.

All articles shall be numbered by tag and/or label attached to the articles before being received by the chairperson in charge of the respective departments.

Tags may be picked up at the fair office.

Divisions I & II, all ribbons will have the following premium values:

Blue - \$1.00, Red - \$0.75, White - \$0.50

Grand Champion - \$5.00, Reserve Champion - \$3.00

After judging a specific department, the judge awards the Grand Champion Rosette to the highest blue-ribbon item in each age group. The Reserve Champion Rosette will be awarded to the second highest blue-ribbon item. In case of a tie, the judge determines the winner.

YOUTH DIVISION I

This division will be the division that sells in the Youth Auction. The Grand and Reserve in each group will sell. Individuals may only sell 1 item in the Country Creations sale. If an individual has more than one item to make the sale the item first in the sale order will be sold. If a grand or reserve cannot sell then the next highest placing item will sell.

All items must be home baked. No baked products containing meat, no ice box pies and no decorated cakes (see Confections Department) will be accepted.

Entries will be judged as follows:

Cakes/Pies: Grand & Reserve
Cookies/Candies: Grand & Reserve
Quick breads/Yeast breads: Grand & Reserve

- May enter in each class as desired. The same product cannot be entered in more than one class.
- Unless otherwise specified, only one miscellaneous item per class can be exhibited. The item must be different than those already entered.
- All items must be brought in a disposable container (such as a self-sealing bag and paper or plastic plate).
- All items not in a self-sealing bag must be covered with plastic wrap.
- Glass containers will not be accepted. **NO EXCEPTIONS**
- Complete TWO exhibitor tags for each cake, pie, and bread submitted. In order to expedite processing exhibits, the tags should be completed before bringing items to the Fair.
- Only cakes, pies, and loaves of breads will be returned (between 4:00 - 5:00 p.m., Monday, September 13) to exhibitor after judging with the exception of Grand Champions, Reserve Champions, and other products left for exhibit. Baked products not removed by 5:00 p.m. become the property of the Country Creations Division.

CANNED DEPARTMENT

- All containers must be unadorned standard canning jars.
- Rings or rims must be left on jars.
- Jars with rusted lids will not be accepted.
- Pectin may be used in jellies. No paraffin will be allowed.
- Only clean and unbroken items which are appropriately sealed may be exhibited.
- Most canned products require ½ inch headspace.
- Quality canned items do not have air pockets (bubbles) among the product pieces.
- All canned products must have a good color and the liquid should be clear, not cloudy, suitable for item canned, and must cover the product.
- Canned goods will not be opened or tasted.
- Unless otherwise specified, three miscellaneous items per class can be exhibited. The items must be different than those already entered.

- Design and seams match where possible, characteristic of the print of material.
- Fabric should be suitable for patterns.
- Neatly displayed as characteristic of item.
- Item should be attractive, creative and clean.
- No obvious signs of stretching or distortion of article shape.
- Exhibitors may enter as many entries in each class as desired, but not two of the same entry. The same entry cannot be entered in more than one class.
- Three miscellaneous items per class can be exhibited. The items must be different than those already entered.

Grand and Reserve Champion rosettes will be awarded in each age group.

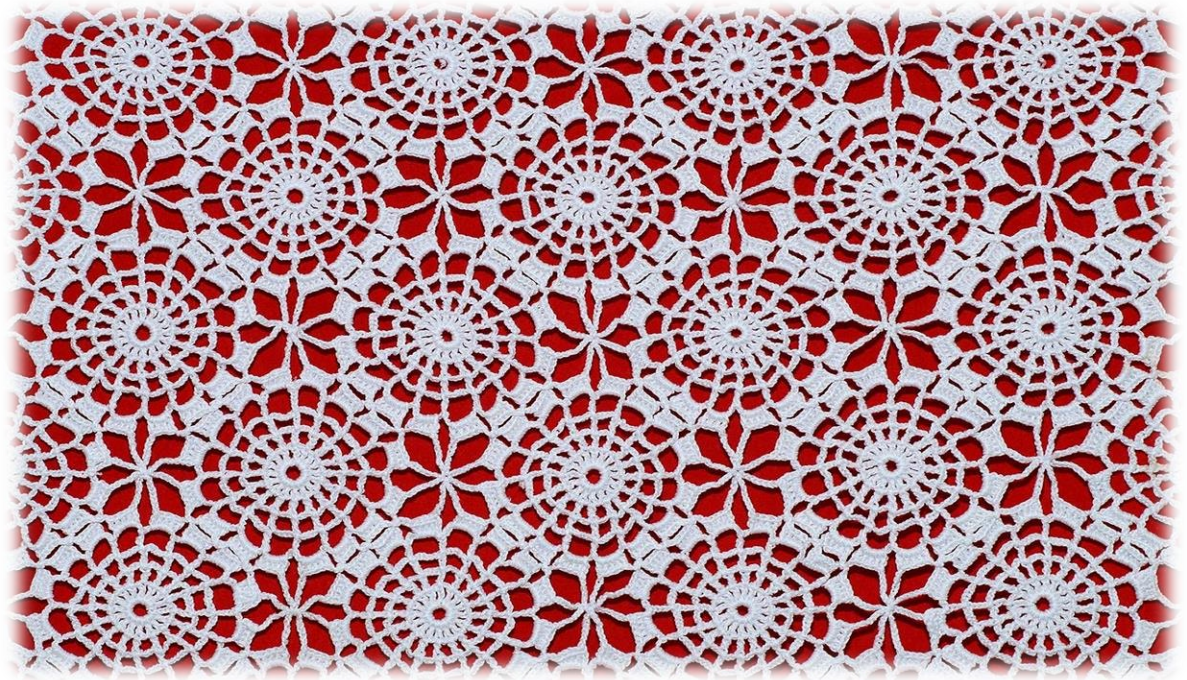

SCHOOL ART PROGRAM

- The purpose of this program is to encourage students in the creation of art that is realistic or abstract in nature with the subject matter being the choice of the student.
- Washington County School students will enter their work through their respective school instructor.
- All entries will be judged and awarded a ribbon. Blue ribbon 90-100 points, Red ribbon 80-89 points and White ribbon 79 points and below.
- **No premium money will be paid for these entries which will be on public display for the duration of the Fair.**

Rosettes will be awarded to the Grand Champion and Reserve Champion entries in the following classes. Only 1 entry per person in each class.

- Entries are to be picked up by a school representative. These entries will not be released to individual students.
- Students may use any medium to produce a two-dimensional work of art.
- All work must be matted or framed with poster board and ready for hanging. Total overall dimensions of matted art work cannot exceed 15x18 inches.
- Unmounted work will not be accepted.
- Teachers will jury their Fair entries at their home campuses. The number of allowable entries will be based on 3% of a school's enrollment or 25 entries, whichever is less.
- An exhibitor number will be assigned to the school, not to the student. Exhibitor numbers will be provided prior to the Fair. A school representative is responsible for completing the exhibitor card and tags prior to checking in art work.
- No double matting allowed.
- Mat size must be minimum of 2 inches on all four sides.
