1. On-line Registration/Entry Deadline is May 15, 2022. Please refer to the JLA rules for all dates, policies and procedures that pertain to online entries and fees.
2. Carcass Hog entries will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations and the Junior Livestock Division Rules except where they conflict with the rules of the show, in which case the Show rules will prevail.
3. Barrows and gilts (No boars. Must be barrows before arrival at weigh-in) are eligible and must be identified by Washington County Fair Association ear tags.
4. Exhibitor may tag in two (2) hogs or a family may tag-in two (2) hogs per exhibitor. They do not need to specify which hog belongs to which exhibitor at tag-in. Each exhibitor can enter only one (1) hog in the carcass hog show. The hogs must be specified to an exhibitor before they are weighed in at the Show and will not be changed under any circumstance.
5. Carcass Hogs will be ear tagged and weighed on June 4, 2022 and must arrive between 7-9 AM. Hogs must be at the fairgrounds for tagging/weighing. No Exceptions.
6. All hogs must be clean upon arrival at both weigh-ins. There will be no washing of hogs on the fairgrounds. Carcass hogs should not be clipped. Carcass Hog must have ear tags before leaving trailer.
7. No Carcass Hogs will be tagged that weigh more than 65 lbs. At the time of weigh in, if an exhibitor does not agree with the weight of the Carcass Hog, they may ask for a re-weigh while the Carcass Hog is on the scale. At that time the

Carcass Hog will be brought back to the scale, scale will be zeroed, Carcass Hog will be re-weighed and the new weight will be the official weight entered.

8. To be eligible for prizes Carcass Hogs:
  - a) Must gain at least 1.70 lbs. per day on test (6/4/22 thru 9/6/22).
  - b) Must have a soundness score of 2 or better. Hogs must be able to walk across the scale without assistance. NOTE: If unable to walk into slaughter facilities on its own it will be condemned by inspector. The WCFA will pay resale bid price for condemned hogs. By law condemned hog cannot be returned to exhibitor.
  - c) ATTENTION: Carcass Hogs with severe skin issues such as, insect bites or sunburn (as determined by the onsite USDA inspector) will not be eligible to show and will be skinned rather than scraped. The Exhibitor will have their carcass returned after the show.
  - d) Minimum Carcass Requirements:
    - i. Last Rib Backfat thickness must be greater than 0.6 inches and less than or equal to 1.5 inches.
    - ii. Carcass muscle score is to be equal to or better than the Intermediate (2.0) pictured in the 2000 "Composition and Quality Assessment Procedures," National Pork Board.
    - iii. Carcass lean quality will be evaluated by a combination of traits including lean muscle color, amount of marbling and lean firmness/wetness. These traits will be evaluated by observing the loin eye as the carcass is ribbed at the 10<sup>th</sup>/11<sup>th</sup> ribs.
    - iv. Loin muscle color score must be greater than 1 and less than 6.
    - v. Loin muscle marbling score must be greater than 1.
    - vi. Loin muscle firmness and wetness score must be greater than 1.
    - vii. Additionally, belly thickness must be at least slightly thick with a minimum of 0.6 inches of thickness at any point.
    - viii. Any carcass failing to meet two or more of the above quality standards will be disqualified.
  - e) Carcasses meeting minimum carcass quality requirements will be ranked on (1) Lean Gain Per Day on Test and (2) Percentage Fat Free Lean ("Composition and Quality Assessment Procedures," National Pork Board). The rankings will be combined with the carcass receiving the best (lowest) total ranking score being considered the winner. In the case of a tie, the carcass judge will visually appraise the carcasses and declare a winner. Final carcass placings will be made at the discretion of the carcass judge.
  - f) Disqualified Carcass Hogs are ineligible for the Junior Livestock Sale.
9. Any exhibitor whose carcass hog does not meet weight gain requirements may weigh their 2nd carcass hog, if they have a 2nd carcass hog. However, if 1st carcass hog meets weight requirement, 2nd carcass hog will not be weighed. The official scale will not be used for practice weighing prior to the official weigh-in.

10. Once the hog steps into the alley leading to the scale, the exhibitors and committee members are the only individuals allowed to assist the hog. Once your hog is called to the scale, you must bring the project at that time. If for any reason the hog cannot walk to the scale, it will be disqualified.
11. The carcass contest is a terminal show. Once weighed, all hogs become property of the WCFA and are sent immediately to a processing facility for harvest and carcass evaluation. The value of each hog will be the resale price per pound multiplied by its live weight. No carcasses will be returned to exhibitors or buyers.
12. A standard kill fee charged by the processing facility will be deducted from the exhibitor's final check.
13. Final placing of carcass hogs will be based on lean gain/day on test.
14. Carcass Hog show schedule:
  - a) Hogs will be weighed September 6, 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.
  - b) Hogs will be slaughtered September 7, 2022.
  - c) Carcass information will be collected on September 8, 2022.
  - d) Placing will be announced at an awards lunch tentatively set for noon on Wednesday, September 14, 2022 in the sales facility.
