1. Online Registration/Entry Deadline is May 15, 2026. Please refer to the JLA rules for all dates, policies and procedures that pertain to online entries and fees.
2. Market barrow entries will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations and the Jr. Livestock Division Rules, except where they conflict with the rules of this show, in which case, the Show Rules prevail.
3. Exhibitors in this division may have the opportunity to attend an optional educational program relating to their species. Specific days and subject matter will be advertised prior to the meetings.
4. Only barrows are eligible and must be identified by Washington County Fair Association ear tags, and be on feed and ear tagged on June 6, 2026 from 7:00 to 8:30 a.m. If the barrow is also tagged for a major show (i.e., State Fair of Texas), the state validated tag can be used.
5. Exhibitor may tag in three (3) barrows, or a family may tag three (3) barrows per exhibitor. They do not need to specify which barrow belongs to which exhibitor at tag-in. All barrows must be tagged at the fairgrounds and will remain on trailers for ear tagging.
6. If barrow loses an ear tag, the exhibitor must notify the Fair Office or the committee chairman/vice chairman within seven (7) days. Barrows will be retagged at the fairgrounds. All barrows will be retagged before weigh-in on Tuesday, September 15, 2026.

7. Each exhibitor can enter only one (1) barrow in the show. The barrow must be specified to an exhibitor before they are weighed in at the show and will not be changed under any circumstances.
8. Barrows must weigh between 230 – 290 lbs., and will be given a four (4) lb. margin.
9. At weigh-in, barrows will be weighed one (1) time. Over/underweight barrows will be re-weighed immediately. An exhibitor may weigh a second barrow if their first barrow weighs out (light or heavy) and if they can have it in the barn by the close of weigh-in. Barrows must have ear tags before entering the scale.
10. At the time of weigh-in, if an exhibitor does not agree with the weight of the barrow, they may ask for a re-weigh while the barrow is on the scale. At that time, the barrow will be brought back to the scale, and the scale will be zeroed. The barrow will be re-weighed and the new weight will be the official weight entered.
11. The only scale other than the official scale allowed in the barn will be a courtesy scale supplied by the Fair. However, this scale is not official and should not be considered as such.
12. Barrows will be shown in one (1) division, regardless of breed. Classes will be divided as equitably as possible as determined by the committee prior to judging.
13. No oil, paint, powder or other dressing will be permitted on barrows. Only water will be allowed. Cordless clippers will be allowed on the fairgrounds. No snaring allowed. All clipping must be done by a family member.
14. Only one (1) family member will be allowed behind the holding pens.
15. In the makeup area, only the exhibitor will be allowed.
16. Showmanship divisions will follow JLA rule #24.
17. Pens must be kept clean at all times.
18. Non-sale barrows will be released by the committee members. Barrows must be signed for before being released. Load out will be on Sunday, September 20, 2026 from 7 – 9 a.m.
19. No tack or signage will be allowed until 6 a.m. on Monday, September 14, 2026. Tack must be placed in designated pens.
