# 2026 YOUTH COUNTRY CREATIONS RULES & REGULATIONS

## Washington County Fair Association

1. **The Youth Department of the Washington County Fair Country Creations Division is open to any Washington County Youth in Kindergarten through Grade Twelve. Must live or attend school in Washington County.**
2. **ALL YOUTH EXHIBITORS MUST PRE-REGISTER ON THE WASHINGTON COUNTY FAIR WEBSITE.**
3. **An entry fee of \$2.00 PER EXHIBIT** will be assessed and must be paid at time on entry of the Washington County Fair website
4. Articles must be made by the exhibitor and completed since the last fair. Articles exhibited at a previous Fair cannot be entered. VIOLATIONS MAY CAUSE THE EXHIBITOR TO FORFEIT ALL RIGHTS TO SHOW IN THE COUNTRY CREATIONS DIVISION.
5. Business cards will not be attached to any articles exhibited.
6. Only clean and undamaged articles will be accepted for exhibition.
7. Exhibits are due at the specified date and time as listed in the Schedule of Events. **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.**
8. **Miscellaneous articles shall be items other than those already listed in the department classifications.**
9. The judges determine the ribbon worthiness of each item shown according to its own guidelines. The judge's critical analysis determines final placement.
10. Ribbons will be awarded to first place (blue), second place (red) and third place (3) white ribbon.
11. After judging a specific department, the judge awards the Grand Champion Rosette to the highest blue-ribbon item in each age group. The Reserve Champion Rosette will be awarded to the second highest blue-ribbon item.
12. Every effort will be made for the security of the exhibitors and others in attendance, but the Association will not be responsible for any articles broken, lost, or stolen while on the grounds.
13. The Vice-President makes the final decision regarding display of items, taking into consideration the safety and security of the exhibits.
14. No claim for injury to any person or property shall ever be asserted, nor suit instituted or maintained against the Washington County Fair Association or its officers or agents, Washington County, Texas, by or on behalf of any person, firm or corporations, or their agents or representatives, servants, or employees, having license or privileges to exhibit on the fairgrounds or occupy space thereon.
15. All protests must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$100.00, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such a protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the management of the Washington County Fair Association immediately after the occasion for such a protest. Protest will be accepted prior to judging or immediately at the conclusion of judging. Depending based on the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is complete.
16. Entry into Country Creations Division enables the exhibitor to apply for the Washington County Fair Scholarships.
17. **NO EARLY REMOVAL OF ITEM. NO EXCEPTIONS.**

18. **ANY EXHIBITOR NOT ADHERING TO ANY RULE(S) OF THIS DIVISION MAY BE BANNED FROM THE COUNTRY CREATIONS DIVISION.**
19. Advertising is not permitted in the building.
20. All exhibits and/or premium money not picked up by 2 PM on the Sunday afternoon following the closure of the fair will be forfeited to the Washington County Fair. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**
21. Only items entered in the Country Store will be sold in the Country Store.
22. **The Youth division will be divided into four age groups for Subdivisions I and II.**
  - Kindergarten – 2nd Grade**
  - 3rd – 5th Grade**
  - 6th - 8th Grade**
  - 9th - 12th Grade**
22. **SUBDIVISION I: YOUTH AUCTION ELIGIBLE DIVISION**
  - Baked Products, Canned Products, Designer Craftsman, Fine Art, Photograph
23. **SUBDIVISION II: YOUTH NON-SALE DIVISION**
  - Alternative Foods, Creative Arts, Decorated Baked Goods
24. **SUBDIVISION III: SCHOOL FLORAL PROGRAM No entry fee or premium paid.**
  - School Floral Design

## **YOUTH ONLINE REGISTRATION**

Country Creations youth exhibitors must pre-register online using Showworks. A link to Showworks can be found on the Washington County Fair website ([washingtoncofair.com](http://washingtoncofair.com)).

When registering, please verify that the exhibitor's name, address, age group and entries are correct.

**Entries will open on August 10, 2026 and close on September 7, 2026.**

**Please note, entries will close on Labor Day (September 7, 2026) and the Fair Office will not be open for questions.**

Country Creations youth exhibitors are invited to complete their online entries at the Fair Office on September 1, 2 or 3, 2026 from 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. A laptop will be available to complete entries and ask questions.

### **Late Entries**

Late entries will be accepted from September 8 to item check-in. There will be a \$10 per item fee for late registration.

Please refer to the Country Creations Catalog for dates and times for item check-in.

### **Changes/Substitutions**

#### ***Prior to Entry Deadline***

If corrections need to be made after checkout, please notify the Fair Office via email prior to September 7, 2026. Provide a description of error, and how it should be corrected.

#### ***After Entry Deadline***

Any changes made to entries after September 7 will take place at Country Creations Check-In. There will be a \$5 (cash only) fee per corrected/changed item.

Please refer to the Country Creations Catalog for dates and times for item check-in.

**Due to the growth of the Country Creations Division, each department has limited the number of items per department.**

## **YOUTH AWARDS AND PREMIUM**

Ribbons will have the following premium values:

Blue - \$1.00

Grand Champion - \$5.00

Reserve Champion - \$3.00

After judging a specific department, the judge awards:

The Grand Champion Rosette to the highest blue-ribbon item in each age group.

The Reserve Champion Rosette will be awarded the second highest blue-ribbon item in each age group

In the case of a tie, the judge determines the winner.

- **DECORATED BAKED PRODUCTS MUST ENTER THE DECORATED BAKED PRODUCTS DEPARTMENT TO BE JUDGED ONLY ON DECORATION.**
- All entries must be received between 7:30 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. Monday, September 14, 2026
- The same product cannot be entered in more than one class.
- A miscellaneous item must be different than those already entered.
- **All items must be brought in a disposable container (such as a self-sealing bag).**
- **All items , not in self-sealing bags, must be on a paper or plastic plate and covered.**
- Your dishes WILL NOT BE RETURNED.
- **Glass containers will not be accepted. NO EXCEPTIONS.**
- Only cakes, pies, and loaves of bread will be returned (between 4:30 - 5:30 p.m., Monday, September 14) to exhibitor after judging except for Grand Champions, Reserve Champions, and other products left for exhibit. Baked products not removed by 5:30 p.m. become the property of the Country Creations Division.
- **All baked goods will be disposed of by the committee members at the end of the fair.**

Each age group will award a Grand and Reserve rosette within each group.

### Limit of Seven (7) Canned Goods Per Exhibitor

Group 1 - Grand & Reserve: Fruits & Vegetables

Group 2 - Grand & Reserve: Jams, Jellies & Preserves

Group 3 - Grand & Reserve: Pickles & Relishes

- All containers must be unadorned COLORLESS standard canning jars.
  - Example: Mason, Ball, Kerr, etc.
- All items must have been preserved within the last year.
- Rings or rims must be left on jars.
- Jars with rusted lids will not be accepted.
- Pectin may be used in jelly. No paraffin will be allowed.
- Only clean and unbroken items which are appropriately sealed may be exhibited.
- No meat or egg products may be entered.
- A miscellaneous item must be different than those already entered.
- Entries will be judged on pack, color, and visual inspection.
- Jars must be properly filled and sealed by pressure cooker or hot water bath.
- Canned goods will not be opened or tasted.
- Most canned products require  $\frac{1}{4}$  to  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch headspace.
- Quality canned items do not have air pockets (bubbles) among the product pieces.
- All canned products must have a good color, and the liquid should be clear, not cloudy, suitable for canned items, and must cover the product.

- No glass permitted in frame.
- No digital art.
- All entries will be entered at the artist's own risk; however, every precaution will be taken to ensure the safety of each entry.
- No Crayons, No Sharpies, No Markers.

- Items in this division are to be judged on appearance, construction, and originality.
- Neatly displayed as characteristics of item require.
- The items should be attractive, creative, and clean.
- No obvious signs of stretching or distortion of article shape.
- No loose or missing pieces.
- Painted items should be dry, neat, and not smeared.
- Pictures need to be either framed, ready to hang or matted. No larger than 11 X 14.
- Design and seams match where possible, characteristic of the print of material.
- Fabric should be suitable for patterns.
- Stitches should be even, neat and have appropriate tension.
- Knots or thread ends should be hidden and no loose threads.
- **ALL ITEMS IN THIS DEPARTMENT MUST BE HAND MADE**
- The miscellaneous item must be different than those already entered.
