## Adult Country Creations

General Rules and Regulations

1. The Adult Department of the Washington County Fair Country Creations Division is open to residents of Washington County.
2. An entry fee PER EXHIBITOR will be assessed and must be paid prior to entering any items for show. The fee for 2024 is $\mathbf{\$ 5 . 0 0}$.
3. Articles must be made by the exhibitor and completed since the last fair. Articles exhibited at a previous Fair cannot be entered. VIOLATIONS MAY CAUSE THE EXHIBITOR TO FORFEIT ALL THE RIGHTS TO SHOW IN THE COUNTRY CREATIONS DIVISION.
4. Business cards may not be attached to any articles exhibited.
5. Only clean and undamaged articles will be accepted for the exhibition.
6. Exhibits are due on the specified date and time as listed in the Schedule of Events. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.
7. Entry cards should be completed PRIOR to delivering articles to the Country Creations building for exhibition.
8. All articles shall be tagged, and tags attached to the articles before being received by the committee in charge of the respective departments.
9. Only one article in each class of each department may be entered unless otherwise specified. Miscellaneous articles shall be items other than those already listed in the department classifications.
10. The committee chairperson has the right to refuse any item.
11. The judges determine the ribbon worthiness of each item according to the department guidelines. The judge's critical analysis determines final placement.
12. Ribbons will be awarded to first place (blue), and second place (red).
13. After judging a specific department, the judge awards the Grand Champion Rosette to the highest blue-ribbon item in each group. The Reserve Champion Rosette will be awarded to the second highest blueribbon item.
14. Premium money is awarded only to the Grand and Reserve Champion winners.
15. Rosettes will have the following premium values: Grand Champion \$5.00; Reserve Champion - \$3.00. NO PREMIUM MONEY WILL BE AWARDED FOR INDIVIDUAL RIBBONS.
16. After judging, the Adult Exhibitor with the highest premium value will receive the Overall High Premium Adult Exhibitor Award and receive an additional prize. An Adult Exhibitor may receive this award only once in five (5) years.
17. Every effort will be made for the security of the exhibitors and others in attendance, but the Association will not be responsible for any articles broken, lost, or stolen while on the grounds.
18. The Display committee makes the final decision regarding the display of items, taking into consideration the safety and security of the exhibits.
19. No claim for injury to any person or property shall ever be asserted, nor suit instituted or maintained against the Washington County Fair Association or its officers or agents, Washington County, Texas, by or on behalf of any person, firm or corporations, or their agents or representatives, servants, or employees, having license or privileges to exhibit on the fairgrounds or occupy space thereon.
20. All protests must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of $\$ 100.00$, which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the management of the Washington County Fair Association immediately after the occasion for such protest. A protest will be accepted prior to judging or immediately at the conclusion of judging. Depending on the basis of the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is complete.
21. No early removal of any item. NO EXCEPTIONS.
22. ANY EXHIBITOR NOT ADHERING TO ANY RULE(S) OF THIS DIVISION MAY BE BANNED FROM THE COUNTRY CREATIONS DIVISION.
23. Advertising is not permitted in the building.
24. All exhibits and/or premium money not picked up by 2:00 p.m. on the Sunday afternoon following the close of the fair will be forfeited to the Washington County Fair. NO EXCEPTIONS.
25. Only items entered in the Country Store will be sold in the Country Store.

## BAKED PRODUCTS DEPARTMENT

All items must be home baked. No baked products containing meat, no refrigerated pies, will be accepted.
Decorated cakes, cookies, cupcakes that will be judged on decoration only, should entry the Decorated Baked Product Classes
All entries must be received between 7:30 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. Monday, September 16.

Entries will be judged as follows:

May enter in each class as desired. The same product cannot be entered in more than one class. A miscellaneous item must be different than those already entered.

- All items must be brought in a disposable container (such as self-sealing bag and paper or plastic plate).
- All items not in self-sealing bags must be covered.
- GLASS CONTAINERS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- Complete TWO exhibitor tags for each cake, pie, and bread submitted. To expedite processing exhibits, the tags should be completed before bringing items to the Fair.
- Only cakes, pies, and loaves of bread will be returned (between 4:30-5:30 p.m., Monday, September 16) to exhibitor after judging except for Grand Champions, Reserve Champions, decorated baked products and sample products left for exhibit. Baked products not removed by 5:30 p.m. become the property of the Country Creations Division.
- All baked goods will be disposed of by committee members at the end of the fair.

## CANNED DEPARTMENT

## Entries will be judged by Groups and each Group will award a Grand and Reserve Champion.

- All containers must be unadorned standard canning jars.

EXAMPLE: Mason, Ball, Kerr, etc.

- Rings or rims must be left on jars.
- Jars with rusted lids will not be accepted.
- Pectin may be used in jellies. No paraffin will be allowed.
- Only clean and unbroken items which are appropriately sealed may be exhibited.
- Most canned products require $1 / 2$ inch headspace.
- Quality canned items do not have air pockets (bubbles) among the product pieces.
- All canned products must have a good color and the liquid should be clear, not cloudy, suitable for item canned, and must cover the product.
- Canned goods will not be opened or tasted.
- No meat or egg products may be entered.
- Unless otherwise specified, one miscellaneous item per class can be exhibited. The item must be different than those already entered.
- Entries will NOT be judged by tasting.
- Entries will be judged on pack, color, and visual inspection.

## RULES \& REGULATIONS

- Open only to residents of Washington County.
- You must have an exhibitor number showing you have entered a competition in the Country Creations Division.
- The rules and regulations of the exhibitors' corresponding department will be followed with special rules for baked products.
- Business Cards cannot be attached to or stamped on articles to be sold.
- ONLY ITEMS ELIGIBLE TO SHOW IN THE COUNTRY CREATIONS DIVISION MAY BE SOLD IN THE COUNTRY STORE. No meat products. Please see the official Fair catalog for items that you can sell. If you have questions, contact a committee person.
- Items entered for sale will not be judged, receive ribbon, or receive premium money.
- Exhibitors will be required to work in the Country Store. Exhibitors will work based on your previous years' Country Store sales amounts.

- Sign-up for hours after your items have been checked in.
- If you cannot work, you may find a substitute to work in your place. If you do not work, you will be unable to sell items in the Country Store the following year.
- See the schedule of events for check-in, check-out, opening and closing times.
- Items must be handmade or homemade.
- Sale items must have a Country Store sales tag attached and listed on a new sales card as it is entered and checked in. Do NOT pre-number your sales card- Only items being checked in should be listed on the Sales Card in numeric ORDER. Please review your sales card for duplicate items, accurate prices and numbering prior to check in. Sales items and Sales Card must correspond. Please write legibly.
- The committee has the option to refuse unacceptable items.
- Because of limited space each exhibitor is limited to $\mathbf{3 0 0}$ non-perishable items.
- The committee will display as much as possible, however because of space, duplicate items will be replaced as they sell.
- Canned products are to have been prepared within the last year, under the same specification as for judging. Only standard canning jars may be used.
- Canned goods are to be labeled on the item as well as the sale tag including the description and preparation date.
- Chipped jars, rusted lids and unsealed jars will not be accepted and/or removed
- No refrigerated or frozen or previously refrigerated or frozen food items will be accepted. Therefore, no items are to be stored in coolers to be set out later. Please bring all fresh items to the Country Store.
- Baked goods and snacks cannot be checked in before the Tuesday of the Fair. See schedule of events for check-in time.
- Any perishable baked goods not sold or picked up may be discarded at the close of the second day of exhibition.
- As baked goods sell you can bring in more items to replace those sold. Check-in begins 1 hour before the store opens each day.
- Minimum Price $\$ 1.50$
- Uniform pricing will be enforced. Items must be tagged and priced in $\$ .50$ increments Example: 1.50, 2.00, 2.50 etc.
- All unsold items must be checked out by a Country Store Committee member.
- $10 \%$ of the exhibitor's total sales will go to the Fair.
- Checks will be mailed on or around November 1st.
- Although all precautions will be taken, the Washington County Fair Assn. will not be responsible for items lost or stolen.
