The Washington County Fair Board met for their regular monthly meeting in the U. S. National Bank building at 8:00 p.m., with all members present.

Robert Hockersmith was present relative to contract on the race track pertaining to hot-rod racing. After the same was read it was signed by Hockersmith and fair board authorities with the understanding if insurance could be obtained by the fair board with their liability to cover it would be added in the agreement or if it could be obtained at a nominal figure it would also be added and charged to Hockersmith, as it would be a big help to them in paying off the mortgage on the grandstand.

Mr. Abts announced Dr. Soderholm, veterinarian, had offered to donate 5 calves for a calf scramble during the fair. Motion was then made by Abts, seconded by Lindow and passed that we accept this offer of Dr. Soderholm and endeavor to get other calves for the scramble also.

Margaret Sahnow was present presenting the floral schedule and it was agreed by the board that it was accepted and that the three trophies listed would be furnished by the fair.

Motion was then made by Abts, seconded by Lindow and passed that Margaret Sahnow be appointed as supervisor of the floral department and would work on the same basis as other superintendents.

Robert Hockersmith also offered to donate a calf for the calf scramble.

Mr. S. E. West of the Tuelatin Valley Rabbit Breeder's Ass'n was present asking if the fair board would be willing to buy about 200 cups for the cages which they use for their show. He also asked for more coops. Mr. Ball was authorized to buy the cups, but the matter of coops was to be studied further.

Recommendations from Ervin Cowgill, Poultry Supervisor was read and approved. Also, the secretary was instructed to write a letter to Mr. Cowgill with a copy to the Imperial Feed & Grain where he is employed expressing their thanks for the fine cooperation and work done in trying to improve this department.

The matter of premiums in the Swine Department was brought up, and it was moved by Lindow, seconded by Abts and carried that the premiums asked by interested parties in this department be cut in half, or would be as follows:

First - \$2.50; Second - \$2.00; Third - \$1.50; Fourth - \$1.00. Fifth - 50ϕ

to be awarded on the three leading breeds and all other breeds would be listed under one class to compete.

Again the matter of a closing time for the last day of the fair was discussed, and after consideration it was moved by Lindow, seconded by Abts and carried that nothing would be released until 10:00 o'clock p.m. Sunday August 25th.

The following bills upon motion by Abts, second by Lindow and carried, were allowed:

It was also agreed to accept Alvin Haase's offer as swine superintendent, and the secretary was instructed to inform him.
