

FAIR BOARD MEETING.

MONDAY NIGHT, APRIL 27, 1936.

The Fair Board met in the Chamber of Commerce rooms Monday night, April 27, with President Hesse presiding, and all members present.

Mr. Moore was present and made the following proposition to the Fair Board: - that he would work as manager of the Fair on a salary of \$150.00 for the first year with a mileage allowance of 5¢ per mile, and as before have the employing of labor and the discharging of the same, and the purchasing, with a three year contract.

It was moved by Banks, seconded by Minton, that a contract be entered into with Mr. Moore as manager for three years, the salary the first year to be \$150.00, and the mileage allowance 5¢ per mile with a limit of \$50.00, and the salary as \$150.00 for each succeeding year with any increase in this salary at the discretion of the Fair Board, the manager to have the power of employing and discharging labor, and to act as purchasing agent. Motion carried.

Discussion regarding appropriation for the Pacific International Live Stock Show. No decision.

On motion the Board adjourned to meet again on Saturday, May 9, at 1:00 P.M.
