Chairman Lyle Spiesschaert called the meeting to order at 4:30pm. He welcomed everyone and called for additions to the agenda.

1) <u>Consent Agenda:</u> Barbara Lawrence requested Entertainment under New Business be advanced in the agenda to accommodate the guests.

Barbara was introduced as the Interim Manager. She spoke briefly about her experience and stated she was excited to be part of the fair. An introduction of attendees was made.

Chairman Spiesschaert asked Barbara to explain the entertainment request. She acknowledged both Lisa Du Pre', staff and Terry Amato, the fair's advertising and sponsorship agent and explained their roles in the entertainment at the fair. The question before the Fair Board is whether to bring recognized entertainers into the lineup. Barbara spoke of the theory of reaching the people that probably would not attend the fair ordinarily but would come to a concert to see these acts. The costs of these acts are more that the budgeted amount and an additional fee would have to be charged. Lisa explained about the demographics and the fact the ages of 14 through 20 were the target group for the HIP-HOP concert. They are used to spending a great deal more that the \$5 to \$10 that was being suggested. Lisa also explained with the additional ticket fee the concert

would be paid for, the major benefit to the fair would be the money spent at the carnival and with on-site vendors. The second show that would require ticketing would be a Contemporary Christian rock group. That music has a very large following with the young adults. Both types of entertainers would be new to the fair. Terry spoke about the willingness of the radio station Jammin' 95 to sponsor the HIP HOP group but even with that help we would still need to make it a ticketed event. The HIP HOP would be scheduled for Wednesday; normally a slow day and the Christian group would be either Friday or Saturday depending what we can arrange. Terry also told the Board country/western was not as popular as it had been in the past and KUPL's free country concert was on our weekend and it would be useless to compete with their line up of country entertainers. Questions were asked and answered. Rich would like to see Johnny Limbo and the Lug Nuts do something a little different than they have for the past 20 years. He also felt a ticketed concert was feasible for the Sunday entertainment. It was agreed to develop that idea. Barbara will pursue that and report back on the entertainment and ticketing possibility.

Rich moved and Kathy seconded the fair spend up to and additional \$25,000 to secure the HIP HOP and Contemporary Christian groups. Motion passed.

As a footnote Rich explained \$4000 of that was for Hispanic entertainment if it could be ticketed.

Budget Overview:

Rich Vial moved and Kathy Christy seconded to accept the consent agenda, the budget report and to pay the bills as submitted. Motion carried.

Maintenance Report: Barbara reported there had been several meetings and the crew had been very helpful bringing her up to speed. JJ, the electrician is scheduled to retire on April 27<sup>th</sup>. We will not replace him until after the fair and the crew understands that. They have been going over fair schedules and seasonal help. The current project is removing the manure (last year's) and spreading it on the rodeo pasture in preparation for reseeding. She reported Mike had had surgery and had been off for a week or so. The events have also kept them busy.

Fair Organization's Report: Barbara advised the office staff was working hard to keep ahead but she was behind getting vendors information. Her major concern was judges. It appears only some of the judges have been sent contracts, tracking the information has been very difficult. Both Lyle and Kathy asked how they could help. Barbara stated she and Melissa would be interviewing for the new position on Monday March 12<sup>th</sup> and would hopefully have someone right away. If the new person will not be available a person from a temp service will be called in. Cody volunteered his wife to answer phones. Bill Burden asked about the delivery of the Fair Books and was told the book would be put on the website however, sections would be printed to send to last year's exhibitors and would be available for anyone that requested them. Sheila suggested



posters be put at the sites the books had been available in past years. The Boosters would deliver the posters but would not have to be responsible for Fair Books.

Rodeo Report: Cody reported the contracts had all been sent (except two) and were coming back. The committees were in the planning process and everything was moving along as scheduled. He advised the Board the Rodeo Directors and Committee was working on policy and creating a handbook that would give all the information anyone needed to know about the rodeo. Cody invited everyone to the Poker Ride to be held at the Flying M Ranch on May 19<sup>th</sup>.

Fair Manager's Report: Barbara announced PGE had accepted the Boards offer on the easement conditions and fees. The check of \$3744.00 has arrived, and the recorded copies of the agreement are to follow. She announced the change of fair dates has caused a problem for the carnival. They do not close in Olympia until midnight on Sunday. They tear down, transport and have to setup by Tuesday. Because of the huge safety risk some where along the way their staff needs to sleep. Barbara was informed the carnival had told previous fair staff they (carnival) would not be open until 5:00PM Tuesday the opening day of fair. She stressed the importance of safety and that the carnival could not open until they were satisfied that every safety check had been made. A plan of action was explained to move Senior Day to Tuesday as that group did not normally frequent the rides and the delay in the carnival will not make a difference to them. Wednesday the HIP HOP entertainment would not be a particularly good mix with the seniors. The change of days was an effective way to solve the challenge. Advertisement will be crucial. Rich asked if the carnival had enough room? Barbara said yes, for now but there was some question about the Steak Fry and the room it took. It was agreed the tables did not have to be spread out so far.

Fair Boosters: Bill Duerden reported the Boosters had been asked to do the parking for Happy Days and the Air Show. It would require a commitment of 5 days and the members felt that was too much just before fair. They could help for 2 days. Barbara said she felt she could answer for Happy Days and they would want their crew to work the duration of the event. Bill said the Boosters would be greatly relieved to hear that and asked Barbara to pass on their regrets to Tracy Burback of Happy Days.

<u>4-H Report:</u> John Baggott advised his staff was concerned about the fair book and would be contacting Barbara about working on that. He reported the sign ups for the wagon train had resulted in a good number of enthusiastic people.

3.Old Business: (A) Lyle spoke about the Fair Complex Development and Development Task Force, saying the County Commissioners with the Fair Board were assigning members. The Commissioners had hired a facilitator and the funding for the project looked very good at this time. He handed out a resume on the facilitator and explained the information that had been included in the Fair Board's meeting packet. Discussion followed.



(B) The Mid-Year Review worksheet and Year-End projections and Assumptions were
discussed. Lyle presented the projected year end budget and explained the changes in
Salaries and OPE. Although the County projected the information it did not appear to
have the new temporary position included and that will raise the figures some. A
discussion followed concerning the loss of revenues in some areas and the larger
expenditures in others. Rich questioned the Capital Outlay line item that projected less
than half of the budgeted amount being used. He was concerned that some projects
scheduled were being sacrificed in an attempt to balance the budget. Barbara said she
would look into the original budgeted capital expenditures.

- (4. New Business: (A) Election of Officers: Tabled until the next Board meeting.
- **(B) Fair Complex Budget-for 2001/2002:** Tabled, a special meeting will be called to approve the budget within two weeks from this date.
- (C) Outstanding Citizen Awards: Kathy Christy explained the concept of her proposal to honor each incorporated city's out standing citizen. She felt it would be a good way to have interaction between the Fair and the different parts of the County. Discussion took place with a unanimous consensus for her to pursue it. Barbara will help with the on site honors for the outstanding citizen.

### **Rodeo Committee Policy #177**

### A. Criteria and Election of Committee Directors to be recommended to the Fair Board for appointment:

#### 1. Criteria:

- a. Applicants must live in Washington county
- b. Applicants must be at least twenty-one (21) years of age

#### 2. Election:

- a. All associate members in good standing are eligible to one (1) vote per director position available.
- b. Applicants shall not be present at the "discussion" portion of election.
- c. Openings for Rodeo Director must be advertised in local newspaper for thirty (30) days prior to election.
- d. Director elections shall be held the first regular committee meeting in the month of November.
- e. Election shall be by closed ballet, unless otherwise specified.
- f. If a Member in Good Standing is unable to be present at November meeting, Member must have ballot to Chairperson no later than 5 pm on the date of election.
- g. Ballots will be mailed to all Members in Good Standing with their October minutes on or before October 15<sup>th</sup>.

h. If a director is unable to complete his/her term, Chairperson shall appoint a replacement for the position to be retained until the next election. If possible, chairperson must choose replacement from previous election's director applications.

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### Rodeo Committee Policy #201

### A. Associate Member in Good Standing Criteria

- 1. An associate member in good standing must adhere to the following criteria:
  - a. Associate member must attend 50% of monthly meetings unless excused by committee director.
  - b. Associate member must attend 50% of work parties unless excused by committee director.
  - c. Associate member must be active in at least one (1) sub-committee.
  - d. Associate member must be current with annual dues.
  - e. Associate member must demonstrate appropriate conduct at all times while representing the fair and rodeo.
- 2. Washington County Fair & Rodeo Gold Card members are exempt from the above criteria and are always considered Members in Good Standing.
- 3. All rodeo directors and associate members in good standing shall pay tax-deductible annual dues of (\$10) each. Annual dues shall be paid to the Treasurer by the first regularly scheduled meeting in October. Members who have not paid by this time will not be eligible to vote at the election in November.
  - a. Annual dues shall be earmarked "Rodeo Proceeds" and deposited in the Fair's general fund.

- 4. When dues are paid, the member in good standing can expect to receive:
  - a. Copy of the Washington County Rodeo Handbook Policies
  - b. Monthly copy of meeting minutes
  - c. Voting rights
  - d. Free fair admission during rodeo.

Subject: Fair Funding

I had a pleasant but somewhat disturbing conversation with Sen. Hannon this afternoon. As co?chairman of the Ways and Means Committee he has a big influence over what happens with fair funding.

Sen. Hannon told me that AOC did not have fair funding on any of their priorities. In addition a poll of the Senate Republican caucus indicated that no one included fair funding as a priority.

This tells me we still have a lot of work to do.

He felt that with the pressure existing to use lottery funds and lottery backed revenue bonds for rural infrastructure projects, that there would be no money left for what we wanted to do with lottery funds.

We need to make sure that all legislators hear from us and all fair supporters about the importance of funding county fairs. We especially need to make sure that the strong fair supporters among the Senate Republicans explain to Sen. Hannon that funding of county fairs is of critical importance to them. I will start making those requests and encourage OFA members to ask their senators to promote fair funding to Sen. Hannon.
