Chairman Lyle Spiesschaert called the meeting to order at 4:35PM. Spiesschaert then had everyone present introduce themselves.

1.Consent Agenda: Margaret Garza gives the report. Garza reviews comments and explains the Fair Complex financial position for the month of February.

Chairman Lyle Spiesschaert calls for a motion to accept the consent agenda. Rich Vial so moves, Kathy Christy seconds the motion. The motion carries.

Margaret Garza distributes to Fair Board members, the final copies of the Budget.

2.Terry Amato presentation: Margaret Garza give an introduction and brief overview of Amato's involvement with the Fairgrounds. Amato talks about the relationship with the Fair. He mentions that the only client that he does sponsorship for is the Washington County Fair and Rodeo. And this is mainly because of the intensity of the effort in doing event sponsorship "right". Amato's philosophy is ideally to have sponsorship dollars

cover all expenses of the event before the door opens. Covering your "nut" in case of bad weather, or if a performer cancels, or whatever, "insures" the event from potential disaster. Getting to 100% coverage for the Fair is really not possible, but nevertheless is the ultimate goal. Another advantage of sponsorship dollars is that the cost to the fair patron can be lessened at the gate or wherever by the offset of those sponsorship dollars, like not having to go from \$6 to potentially \$8 dollars to attend the fair. Amato asks the question, and then answers, "is it common for events to have sponsors, the answer is no", but is sponsorship common at fairs, suprisingly, no. Only Lane and Washington County have significant sponsorship programs. Amato passes hand out material to the Board Members. To the broader question of whether the floral building needs sponsorship or the cloverleaf, the answer is no. We look at fair "assets" as a whole, and where can we maximize those assets and where can we gain sponsorship dollars. The dollars go into the collective "bucket", not necessarily to the individual buildings or individual programs. Sponsors show a certain confidence in the event in expending dollars and by being willing to have their name associated with the event. And that confidence should be reflected in the attitudes of the public, it should be seen as a "positive", not as a "necessity" to finance or support a failing fair. Sponsorship participation indicates to the Fair patron that the event is "healthy", and worthy of partnership. The drawbacks?, the banners on site, logos, etc. Is it worth it in keeping our prices down? I would think the public would think it is. Spiesschaert voices his concern about having a "title" sponsor. And this concern has been brought by some of our citizens too. That is, I wish it would say that the fair was "presented" by, rather than, "Bi-Mart's" Washington County Fair and Rodeo. It is our facility. It is a public entity. It almost has a heavy private ownership indication that way. It sounds like Bi-Mart has more than a sponsorship interest, it's almost like the event is "theirs". Amato said that the difference between a title sponsor and a presenting sponsor is about half the value. The average person doesn't say "let's go to the Bi-Mart County Fair". Most patrons will say let's go to the Fair". Amato says that "perception" he believes has not trickled into the vernacular as of yet, and probably never will. I think it will always be "The Washington County Fair". That, what you described, is the direct trade-off that you get for a title sponsor. We try to minimize the logo and banners in size so the event name is still booming through. Spiesschaert was surprised that even our letterhead has Bi-Mart on it. Amato said that the contract reads, that in any public communication their name would be associated with the Fair. That means, radio, TV, newspaper, and internal communication like letterhead. Sheila Day asks if this contract with Bi-Mart is standard for the business. Amato said you can design a contract in any way. I fashioned this contract after the "Taste of Beaverton" contract. Day said that Bi-Mart does a lot, but to say they are sponsoring the fair is stretching it in her mind, because of the total cost (in putting on the fair). Amato said that it wouldn't be possible for the title sponsor to cover the entire expense of the event. You probably would not have a title sponsor at any event. Spiesschaert said that Day and I wouldn't expect that, but the public will think they (Bi-Mart) are contributing the major amount of money to

make this happen. Day said it's my opinion that to say it's "their fair" is stretching it. Amato said that he hoped that the general public did not think that Bi-Mart was actually managing the Fair. Day said,. "I don't know, they could". Rich Vial said that he was involved in the Fiesta Bowl and that he was sure that the title sponsor "Netscape" did not pick up the majority of the cost of putting on the bowl game. Also, that in a polling, it was discovered that only 8% of the fans could tell you that it was the "Netscape" Fiesta Bowl after it happened. It really doesn't diminish the identity of the true entity, which in this case is the Washington County Fair and Rodeo. Vial said if anything, I think we are selling ourselves a little bit short at \$21,500. Amato said the actual value is about \$31,000 when you count their advertising. Spiesschaert agreed, and said if it were more like \$100,000 it would be easier for him to buy. Also, that the "Taste of Beaverton" is more private, he thinks, and the Fair is more public. We are trying to base our development on the concept of "public" space and "public" activities, and public ownership. Spiesschaert said that this is a three-year contract and at the end of that time he would like to be involved in revisiting in how we do that. He thinks that if we do a title sponsor again that the Board would like to be involved in that. He thinks that Bi-Mart gets a lot of mileage out of \$22,000. "That's incredible". Ken Leahy asked if there were other title sponsor offers. Amato said no, that Bi-Mart was the only one and he based the amount of \$22,000 on what comparable venues were and are getting in our area. In the industry there is a rough formula commonly shared in terms of advertising value to venue attendance generated that drives the amount of dollars that sponsors are willing to give. Vial then asks the Rodeo representatives as to what they get in sponsorship revenue. Gary Price indicated that NICA and Friberg Electric give in excess of \$17,000 each. Garza mentioned that while attending the Western Fairs Association convention recently, she sat in on a workshop on sponsorship. She said that the consensus was that most fairs were not pursuing sponsorship opportunities for a variety of reasons. But the point was that there are dollars out there to offset costs of running a fair, if fairs are willing to seek them out. Garza thinks this is an issue that the Board needs to wrestle with and then give staff some guidance for a future sponsorship strategy. Vial asks if the vendors, exhibitors, guests have any complaints about the banners or signs. Garza said that she had not heard of any. And in her talking with Eric from the Argus she asked if he had heard of any complaints about our title sponsor or any other Fair sponsor. He said that he had not. Spiesschaert said he had heard of some. In fact, he said that they asked, "why did you choose Bi-Mart"?, that if you're going to have a title sponsor, have someone other than a discount store. Vial said, and one that doesn't appear to be doing that well. Paige Payne said that many times grounds entertainers ask if there is a sponsor that they could tie in to. Vial said he would like to tackle the sponsorship issue as a policy concern. Spiesschaert said again that he would like the Board to be involved in the next process for determining sponsorship, especially in terms of a "title" sponsor. Vial asked Amato if he was "pushing" the limit on sponsorship dollars. Amato said that he is always pushing the limit. But it really gets down to what the market will bare. Spiesschaert asks what

Amato's firm gets for his service in sponsorships. Amato said 15%. Spiesschaert asks if that includes advertising?. Amato said no, that is billed separately.

3.Fair Report: Bill McKinley and Paige Payne give report. McKinley said that all the food concession contracts are out, except for a couple that he has held back. One stand, because of the St. Matthews situation (fire marshal code violations). We met with the St. Matthews people and presented options for them to consider in mitigating their problems. Spiesschaert asks if the option of letting them have the Chuck Wagon was offered. McKinley said, "no", and had no reason to do so given that Juan Cortez has been a good concessionaire and had made many capital improvements to the facility. Spiesschaert explains the St Matthews dilemma to those present. Spiesschaert said that St Matthews had contacted him with their concerns, and it was his impression that the Chuck Wagon was under utilized. I know that this is a sensitive matter, but I want to accommodate St. Matthews if at all possible, they have been a long time concessionaire and have been supportive of the Fair for many years. I don't want to give the impression that we don't want to work with them. They are very, very community based. They have literally hundreds of volunteers. Garza said that I don't think they had that impression when we met. Garza explained the options as being they could buy a concession trailer that we knew was available and give them a prime location on the grounds. Someone in the Parish mentioned that they potentially had a ventilation system that might be donated, but cautioned that whatever they had in mind with the donated system, it had to conform with fire marshal approval. Another option that Garza mentioned was the possibility that St. Matthews could do their preparation just outside the permanent booth as other concessionaires do under a "non-sided" canopy. Ken Leahy asked what are the costs to put in a ventilation system? McKinley said 8-10 thousand dollars. Cody Feinauer mentioned that he had talked to Juan Cortez last year and that from that conversation it was his impression that Cortez may not want to come back this year. McKinley said that from his last discussion with Cortez, that he did want to come back, and with that, issued him a contract for the coming 2000 Fair. Garza said from her conversation with Cortez that he has all intents of being on the Fairgrounds and help in any way we might need him. McKinley said, of all the concessionaires we have, he is one of the most cooperative and helpful we have. McKinley and Garza said that he has made facilities and equipment available to others when in need. McKinley said that the other stand that is being held out at the present is the sub-shop, with its high cost to profit margin and marginal popularity with the fairgoer makes it difficult on a concessionaire. McKinley said he's looking for something Italian in that spot. Entertainment is progressing. We have booked Ty Herndon opening night. Curtis Salgado contracts are in hand for Wednesday. As tradition would have, Johnny Limbo is to perform on Thursday. War is scheduled for Friday and Saturday is still open. Sunday is Hispanic music. McKinley talked about the potential for a hard ticket option. Garza asked what the Board's feeling were about an over budget hard ticket option. Vial asks if a \$25,000 act would pay as a hard ticket option. McKinley

said, "no". Spiesschaert said that he is not excited about hard ticket because as a policy it counters our selling point in that once you pay to enter the grounds, the entertainment and most other activities are free. Vial asked that with a hard ticket sale, of say \$10, does that allow you into the Fair? Garza, "no". McKinley said that a hard ticket option is not his first choice, and that Brittany Spears last year was an anomaly. McKinley said he would prefer a free \$25,000 "known" act that the radio stations can get behind. McKinley mentions the pending sale of EJD Concert Services but assures that Ed Dougherty the president of Concert Services, that he has known for many years, is personally involved in servicing our entertainment needs. Spiesschaert mentioned that he understands that casino acts that bring in old time past performers really pack them in. Amato said the 30-40 thousand-dollar act of that type will not draw at a fair on a Friday night. Spiesschaert asks why? Amato said, people that are casino orientated will not go for "festival seating" (on the grass) Spiesschaert said that made sense. We have met with Metro West ambulance service, Winning Ticket Strategy, Art Berry on security. Professional Service contracts are about to go out. Paige Payne gives her report. The Fair Premium Books will include expanded advertising that will in part compensate for not having the Entertainment Guide published this year. Payne has secured all the Grounds entertainment for this year's event. We have an array of entertainers coming to the Fair. Buck Trout will be returning, as is Doggies of the Wild West. OMSI will also be present. We are doing the talent contest again. Joe Stoddard will also be back. Charlie Brown is a roving juggler and the Wende Bears will be our feature grounds act this year. It will be the first time they have performed in the Northwest. Payne has been working and coordinating with the various Superintendents. They had a meeting last month. We are working on filling some vacancies from retirement from last year. Spiesschaert mentioned that they wanted to express our appreciation and show support to our Superintendents in a special way. One of the ways to do that is having a social gathering with them prior to Fair. Spiesschaert said, I hope we are still planing to do that. Payne said, yes we are, and most probably a May date. Payne said Sandy Baker told her because of favorable scheduling this year there is interest with the 4-H Horse Fair participants in Showcase of Horses throughout the week. Payne said she is working with commercial vendors and has most spaces filled. Vial asks that there is mention in the fair books of our acknowledgement and appreciation of the auction buyers. Payne said she would do so in both of the books and that she has a page dedicated to do that.

4.John Baggott Extension Office: John Baggott comments and update. The next meeting for 4-H horse advisory committee is March 14, 1999 in which the 2001 dates will be an agenda item. The State changed exclusively to "numbers" on their data base system which means that all the numbering on all the classes has to be changed. The next Friends publication comes out in April, and there will be items that relate to the coming Fair in there including information concerning the silent auction. The next publication after that pretty much focuses the bulk of its content on the Fair. Vial asked how many

steers did we weigh in? Baggott said that he didn't have the number off hand. Vial said thirty-four at last count. That's a lot.

5.Rodeo Report: Cody Feinauer gives report. The Queen income for the year, from the Queen coronation, grossed \$3,320 with \$452.13 in expenses, for a net of \$1,867.87. Spiesschaert asked if that money has been turned in. Feinauer said yes, that Melissa Williams has the money. Feinauer mentioned that they also sold \$175 in merchandise. Sponsorship letters are signed and ready to go out the first part of next week. At least the one's that Rodeo handles. I don't know about the others. Friberg is "in". NECA is "in". United Rentals, I'm not sure, and Terry Amato takes care of our title sponsor. Amato said that United Rentals has a proposal. Last year the local owner corralled the other six owners and said "we have to do this". In years past, it was done at the agency level. Now a "central" person at headquarters will "assist" these folks and make the decision. It's in "limbo" right now. Amato said that he is trying to get them to pry loose with a decision. Spiesschaert asks if the United Rentals proposition is in trouble. Amato said the whole advertising "buy" does not have one central person making the decision. We need to make a date certain for them to make a decision. Spiesschaert asked if we have any other options. Feinauer said that Prime Equipment has been involved and interested in the past. Feinauer said that Amato is responsible for the presenting and the title sponsor and that the rodeo committee is responsible for the rest. And that should amount to approximately 30% of the sponsorship dollars. Vial asked, what Rodeo's total budget was. Garza said, \$120,700. Amato mentioned that he does not take a percentage of the title or presenting sponsorship for Rodeo. And that he just charges by the hour for the management of the agreements. Vial mentioned that we're getting 50-60% of the rodeo budget covered by sponsorship dollars and that is great. Spiesschaert said lets use this as "information" at this point with the idea of making policy on sponsorship. Spiesschaert suggested that the staff can contribute in this regard. Feinauer said that these sponsorship numbers would raise considerably if we had more seating. Feinauer said, this year he asked for a little more from sponsors in the letters that went out, but said that eventually this escalation in support is going to run out. Christy asked if the rodeo is looking to provide more exposure for sponsors. Feinauer said we are working with McKinley and Payne on identifying potential new sponsors. Gary Price said that they were working on some internet options. Payne said that the major sponsors will get exposure in the Fair handbooks. Amato suggests that there should be "signage" at the entryway of the Rodeo indicating that the Rodeo is free. Garza asks if Lauri Benton is going to be in charge of the Special Kids Rodeo. Feinauer said at this point, the answer is yes.

6.Maintainence Report: Mike Wold gives report. We have all the lawn equipment ready to go. We are working on the gate system in the auction ring, it should be on line by April. The rototiller is being refurbished. The "Albert's" are doing their thing on set-up and breakdown for shows. We have been trimming trees and planting flowers. We got rid

of most of the brush and trash from the backside. Kelly Goodin mentioned that he had built a couple of wine cases. McKinley said that we had re-established a connection with County Restitution in providing labor to the Fairgrounds thanks to Margaret Garza's intervening efforts. Spiesschaert asks if they provide supervision. McKinley said that we have to do that. Garza said that for the tasks we have, it allows for us to provide supervision and that will not be a burden. We have to be diligent in supervising, and have defined tasks assigned and provide performance reports back to Restitution, plus, our obligation in returning an individual back to Restitution that does not perform or behave as required. Spiesschaert said as a matter of communications that we plan to have a short meeting with staff before each day of the Fair. Garza said that the best time to do that would be very early before Fair opens. Mike Wold agreed, and said we get moving at 6 AM or earlier and we go straight through. Spiesschaert said that we will pick a time that works. Spiesschaert mentioned that it was brought to his attention that the loading chute for the swine barn is going to be moved. Is that something that you guys can do? Wold said he believed that Brian was going to do that. Spiesschaert asked if there was anyone here that could do that, or do we need to have volunteers to do that. It seems like that is something that the maintenance team could do. Wold said that they need to be completely torn down and rebuilt. Wold said that they (Brian) was going to bring in a volunteer crew to do it. Spiesschaert said that he had a bit different take on it and it is something to work out and if the maintenance can do it, lets try to work it out.

<u>7.Policy Resolutions:</u> Rich Vial goes through a review of the various policy issues to be discussed, revised, adopted and/or set aside for future action. Included, are policies # 201, 101, 102 and 401.

Rich Vial moves the adoption of Policy #201, Ken Leahy seconds the motion, and the motion carries.

Rich Vial moves that the Fair Board adjourn to executive session, Sheila Day seconds, the motion carries.

The Fair Board reconvened from executive session.

Kathy Christy moved and was seconded by Rich Vial that the Fair Board instruct Margaret Garza to meet with David Lintz to serve as our representative for the process of obtaining an RFP for program development for a new fair complex. Garza will suggest a cap on the expenditure after her discussion with David Lintz. The motion carries.

8.0ld Business: Margaret Garza reports on **(A) PGE Easement Update.** Garza said that she obtained the numbers from the County (LUT) and the appraiser. The property in

question for the requested easement was 11,520-sq. ft. and based on 10 dollars per square foot. Our asking price was approximately \$28,800. Garza then called PGE and gave them the findings then they checked with the engineering department and they felt that was too much money and they couldn't afford it. Garza said if they change their minds please let her know. (B) Greg Hayes Update. Garza gives a Gregg Hayes update. There has been approximately \$25,000 paid out for his injury. The total reserve allotment will run us about \$55,880, which will provide for a total knee replacement in the future. At this time they have left the account open. Our insurance renewal will go up next year as a result of this claim. Kathy Christy asked if the Rodeo Committee was aware of the cost of this injury. Garza said she didn't think they knew the implications of the injury in terms of cost.

(A) RFP for Programming Development for new Fair Complex. Margaret Garza distributes to the Board copies of the RFP for Programming Development for the new Fair Complex. Garza goes over some key points and timelines contained within the RFP. Discussion. Garza said that she has instructed the staff to contact her pertaining to any major issues that develop during her maternity leave. Garza presents her maternity leave letter to the Board. Minutes of 10-12-1999 were passed out and read by members present. Correction made by Treasurer Al Goldman Time Deposit @ 5.450% is in the amount of \$7, 000.00 for 90 day. And the last note: Next Booster meeting will be 1st Wed. In March @ 7:00 PM in the fair office not February. Minutes were passed with these corrections.

Treasurer Report: Switch of Time Deposit \$7,000.00 to Edward Jones is now earning 6.75% for 2 years. When the \$15,000 came due at USBank, switched it Edward Jones and is now earning 6.9% for 2 years. As long as organization has a plan or goal to use this money, it can lock it up in CD's. Should make approx. \$400.00 more by moving money to Edward Jones. \$26,952.34, there was description of the difference between the amounts at bottom of report. New Business:

Goals for this money: Money was historically set up to help the fair board pass a bond measure, save the fairgrounds and establishing funding. Administrative Resolution No. 101

Creation and Use of Resolutions

RECITALS

- A. WHEREAS, the Washington County Fair Board is vested with authority from the Washington County Board of Commissioners to administer the affairs and set policy for the Washington County Fair Complex;
- B. In order to exercise its powers and duties as efficiently and effectively as possible, a systematic procedure to reach, record, promulgate, maintain and administer far reaching, precedent-setting actions and decisions is needed; and
- C. The Fair Board desires that these procedures be fully open and the decisions readily available to all members of the public, staff and other interested parties.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Board of Directors shall establish a process of creating and adopting Resolutions as follows:

When it deems appropriate, the Board of Directors shall create one or both of the following types of Resolutions in a format that conforms to the Model Resolution provided in Exhibit A attached hereto:

POLICY RESOLUTIONS which specifically relate to the operation of the Fair Complex, including but not limited to, actions affecting the public rights of enjoyment, conduct of users of the Fair Complex, and the protection of the Fair Complex property, or

ADMINISTRATIVE RESOLUTIONS which deal with the internal structure and operation of the Board, including but not limited to, responsibilities of committees, financial procedures, and administration of policies and rules.

- 2. When a need is identified, the Board of Directors shall cause a "draft" Resolution to be created, which shall be circulated to Board members for review and comment.
- 3. Unless an emergency is declared, the Board shall cause a reasonable period of time to lapse between the creation of a draft policy and its adoption. The purpose of this delay is to allow all interested parties, including but not limited to staff, Board members and the public to review the proposed resolution.
- 4. Once the Resolution is in a "final" form, the Board of Directors shall vote to either approve or disapprove it. If it is approved, the Resolution shall be "enforceable" by the Board of Directors within the mandate of its powers and duties to administer the Fair Complex.

Policy Resolution 401

Establishment and Operation of Rodeo Committee

RECITALS

- A. WHEREAS, the Washington County Fair and Rodeo has, for many years, relied on the production of a professional quality rodeo as part of its offering to the public;
- B. WHEREAS, the Fair Board desires that the rodeo operation be conducted by those members of the community with specific interest in rodeo;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Washington County Fair Board shall annually appoint a seven Directors to direct the activities of a group to be called the Washington County Rodeo Committee.
- 2. The purpose of the Rodeo Committee shall be to produce and manage a four day rodeo each year for the Fair.
- 3. The Washington County Fair Board shall appoint such Committee members as in its discretion it believes would benefit the Rodeo and the Fair generally, but shall solicit recommendations from the existing Rodeo Committee prior to any such appointment.
- The appointment of Rodeo Committee members shall be made annually at the January meeting of the Washington County Fair Board.
- 5. The Rodeo Committee shall follow the following operating procedures in carrying out the responsibilities established hereunder:
- a. Provide to the Fair Board on or before the first fair board meeting of each calendar year a budget for the upcoming year rodeo.
- b. Be responsible for the selection and oversight of the annual Rodeo and Fair Queen, who shall also serve as an ambassador for the County Fair.
- c. Solicit and collect sponsorship dollars equal to at least 30% of the proposed rodeo budget, not including title and presenting sponsors.
- d. Seek preapproval on all expenditures in excess of \$50 through the use of a purchase order or other appropriate documentation as may be established by Fair staff.
- e. Respond in a timely fashion to all requests of the Board for information regarding Rodeo operations.
 - 6. The members of the Rodeo Committee shall be entitled to the following benefits

in recognition of their service:

- a. Free admission to the County Fair and Rodeo for all Committee members and associate members and volunteers according to the rules developed by the Rodeo Committee.
- b. Payment for expenses to be used among all members of the Rodeo Committee for attendance at the National Rodeo Finals and Conference held annually in Las Vegas, Nevada.
- 7. The Rodeo Committee shall be authorized to conduct independent fundraisers for purposes consistent with this Resolution, provided, however, that any fundraiser or fundraising activity shall be subject to prior written approval of the Fair Board and Fair staff. All such funds shall be deposited into the Fair accounts to be credited against a budget line item.

Dear Terri:

I discussed with Margaret Garza, Fair Executive Director, the concerns that you raised in your letter of March 1, 2000. She informed me that the Board is aware of the executive session statutes and that, when they convene an executive session, they actually cite to the specific statute that permits the session. This did not get transferred to the minutes but Ms Garza said she will make sure that the minutes reflect this in the future. The Board is also aware that they can only discuss items in executive session that are allowed by the specific exemptions. All other discussions are in open session. Ms Garza stated that most of the discussions about the Fair redevelopment are in open session.

You mentioned Goal 1 citizen involvement for the Fair redevelopment. Beyond the open meeting laws, I do not believe that Goal 1 is implicated at this point. Certainly, if any development application is made, there will be citizen involvement through the land use permitting process. Ms Garza stated the public is welcome at all Fair Board meetings and any public interest in Fair redevelopment is appreciated.

We appreciate the letter that you sent to us in December regarding the Chamber's position about the

Unfortunately, now we are requesting your help.

Because the airshow and the Washington County 4-H Horse fair cannot be held simultaneously, the 4-H program has been forced to change the dates of the horse fair to July 14-18.

The horse leadership had considered moving Horse Fair to after regular fair- unfortunately this conflicts with state horse fair and many family vacations so the earlier dates are the only way that horse fair can happen this year.

The effects of this decision have rippled through our program:

- 1) The 4-H wagon train has historically been scheduled to allow the participants to also compete at horse fair, this year will not be the case. the Wagon train and Horse fair will have to be held at the same timeforcing our kids to choose between the two complementary events.
- 2) The 4-H camping program has been changed to July 8-12 to allow those kids to participate at horse camp. However, the horses going to camp usually get more than 2 days to get their energy back before fair.
- 3) The weather in Western Oregon (as you well know) is often still very moist into the first weeks of July; making the main arena at the fairgrounds unusable. This would necessitate a change of venue for the horse fair.
- 4) Moving the dates of Horse Fair has also impacted the organizational members of horse fair. The volunteer that was going to be the Horse Fair Superintendent- Linda VanFleet- now has a scheduling conflict with horse fair, and won't be able to attend. The 4-H Horse program is now scrambling to find another persons(s) to take this leadership role.

Here is where your assistance is needed:

The horse advisory board will need funds to secure and pay for another facility in the event that the Main arena is unusable due to weather. The only local facility that is large enough to handle the number of horse members is McKay Creek Farms. Mt Hood Equestrian Center and the Yamhill County Fairgrounds are two other facilities in the greater Portland area that also meet the needs of the 4-H Fair Program.

If the weather is favorable- the funds that you donate to the 4-H horse program for the wet weather facility change would then be used to purchase more stalls for the fair. The Fair Grounds is still about 30 stalls short of the number needed to safely house the 4-H horse program horses...
