Chairman Lyle Spiesschaert calls the meeting to order with the standard welcome to the audience.

1.Consent Agenda: Margaret Garza gives report. Garza goes over the financial position of February, 1999.

Housekeeping notes: (A) Garza mentions letter addressed to Cal Wade authorizing him to continue consulting on the future development planning. Rich Vial suggests that the Board discuss the matter in executive session. (B) "Indirect" figures wrong for a couple of years, Loni Reising will be giving us a \$27,000 credit for the last two years. (C) Local government pool account that the Fair Complex has enjoyed was cited in the 1997 County Audit to be in conflict with state statute Investment. County would like the Fair to transfer our LGIP account to the County. Garza makes a strong appeal that we need to keep our LGIP account. We have an opinion back from County Counsel Allen Rappleyea recommending that Garza meets with finance (Loni Reising and Jim Croft) to devise a way for us to get to our money in a timely manner. (D) Spiesschaert received a

letter of support in reference to future development from the Hillsboro Chamber of Commerce. (E) The bucking bull incident. Lloyds of London, the insurer of record for the bucking bull are responsible for the coverage, not the County or Fair Complex (F) The plaque for David Lintz; Garza contacted Lintz and said he'd prefer to receive it at a board meeting, so Garza suggested at the Next Fair Board meeting on April 7th to make the presentation.

- 2. Correction to the minutes: Page 15 in the marketing report, replace "tack" wagons with "taco" wagons.
- 3. 4-H Horse Fair: Sandy Baker gives report. There was a tack sale on the 20th of February and was one of the most successful sales they've had. There had been several requests for early use of the arena. Garza said that we are pretty much subject to the weather and that the targeted time to work the arena is in May. 4-H Horse would like to borrow the rodeo office again this year for their event, Feinauer, the Rodeo Board president sees no problem in 4-H using the premises.
- 4. Rodeo Report: Cody Feinauer. Sent out letters for commitment for sponsorship, so far we have received about \$29,500 in sponsorship commitment, not including the NECA bull fights who have said previously they were in, which is another \$10,000. United Rentals is one store away from being in again, which represents another \$15,000, which will double what we already have. We should be back up there where we were last year. We will know by the 1st of April who is on board and who is not for this next year. National Rodeo publication features the Washington County Special Kids Rodeo in a picture and comment. There is going to be a "poker" ride at Flying "M" Ranch to raise money for the Rodeo, Lori Benton is organizing the event. Feinauer asks what we decided on the budget? Garza says we have left the budget pretty much as it was from last year. Feinauer, inquires, "by me, or by you". Garza, states, "by me". Feinauer, states that the figure is \$126,200", Garza, states she thinks that's correct. Feinauer states which means that we are over budget. ". Spiesscheart asks a related budget question, where is the Rodeo Board with the double booking of the clowns, Feinauer explains the difficulty in canceling one of the clown acts, says that it will affect the credibility of their show, if needs be, "I will pay for the extra clown out of my own pocket". Vial says maybe we can cover a portion of the expense, say for example, \$1,000 if one clown or the other finds another show, this as an incentive to find another show. Feinauer will float that idea. Garza says

that Feinauer has done a nice job of explaining the expenditure side of the budget, what about the sponsorship side? Feinauer says, "I don't know until we get back all our sponsorship letters of intent. Garza says that at some point in time the sponsorship dollars coming in should be getting closer and closer to the expenses going out, Feinauer agrees. Garza says that the sponsorship dollars should be more in that the Rodeo Board made a commitment to help the Fair on Sunday in dollars due to a request, by the Rodeo Board, to make a scheduling change that would excluded a Sunday Rodeo performance. Spiesschaert asks if the figures will be much closer by next Fair Board meeting. Feinauer says, "yes", and that by April 1st he will have all these letters of intent back. Feinauer says that the main difference between Garza's budget and his is the added clown expenditure. Feinauer cites, contract by contract that costs are up, and is most concerned about line item #312 and it will be going over and it's going to be \$24,208, and that's higher than Garza's line item figure. Sheila Day asks if this is accurate, Feinauer reiterates the figure \$24,208. Garza comments that we need to be careful in over committing ourselves. Vial says that the ultimate goal is to make the Rodeo self-sufficient. Spiesschaert says that may be the goal, but realistically do not expect the Rodeo will be self-sufficient.

5. Booster's Report: Fred Scheller gives report. Speaks for the need to have written policies in dealing with work projects on the Fairgrounds. The Boosters Board of Directors have come up with a document, and would like to point out a couple of points. From now on the Boosters would like Fairgrounds personnel to contact only the president or treasurer to authorize any club function on the Fairgrounds, and to make Lisa Dupre' aware of the function. Main thing is how the Boosters use the personnel we have. They want to be sure that they have adequate staff while at the same time be able to make money with their projects. With the changes that are taking place at the Fairgrounds (increased interim usage) they will be limiting themselves in the number of events where they serve food. They are going to emphasis "service, promotion, and support" of the Fairgrounds, like in areas of distributing premium books, selling tickets at the airshow, providing food service at the Fair, and publicity. Within the organization they will assign one person to chair the event and one person to make purchases, and this will help avoid any misunderstanding like they have had in the past. They are now actively working on the airshow and have committed themselves to the distribution of the premium book.

Spiesschaert comments that he and the Board are very appreciative of the ongoing efforts of the Boosters.

6. Fair Report: Bill McKinley gives report. McKinley has talked to Terry Amato about the beer sponsorship and feels confident about us getting Coors Light and Corona for this year. Amato mentioned that he would try to expedite a decision. McKinley comments on the many people at the Rodeo meeting, and the enthusiasm that he found there. Food concession contracts are coming in. One major fall out is the bar-b-que stand. Howard will not be coming back, looking at several options to fill the space. Kathy Christy mentions that she may have a possible replacement. Fred Sheller also refers to a possible replacement resource. Professional Services contracts go out in the next few weeks. McKinley refers to the superintendents meeting attended by Garza and Day, and Paige Payne. Day gave her impressions of that meeting. Felt there was some progress and also some reluctance to experiment with new ideas in exhibiting in the Main Exhibit Building. Spiesschaert mention that we need to work with these superintendents and be sensitive to their concerns. He also mentioned the superintendents work shop that took place in Medford just a week ago as a good forum for new ideas. Garza mentioned that we were willing to provide the tools or whatever to assist the superintendents in being creative,. Lloyd Baron mentioned the beautiful color coordination after the exhibits had been shown and taken apart at the Alaska State Fair. Garza said those at the superintendents meeting were for the most part upbeat. McKinley mentioned that he and Garza attended the Area meeting (#1) at Clatsop County Fairgrounds in Astoria. Both of us were impressed with the quality and forethought that went into creating the new "multi-purpose" Fairgrounds. McKinley refers to the Power Rents accident involving Mary Eldred at last year's Fair. County Risk Management's Bob Osip denied her claim, but Eldred wanted to present her position in writing and she is going to present a clean copy for me to forward to Risk Management for further review.

7. Marketing Report: Lisa DuPre' gives report. DuPre' reviews the proposed rate increase, and the coordination in folding those increases into the existing ongoing schedule. There has not been a rate increase at the Fair Complex in the last six years. DuPre' has done a comparative of other facilities and found that our rates have been significantly below other facilities of similar size and scope, and that these other facilities are in the process of raising their rates right now. Even with a rate increase here, we will still be below other facilities. The Fair Complex will explain that this

reflects the increases in our cost of doing business. the cost of doing business. Garza said that it is time to bring our facilities rental rates to a comparable with other facilities given the ambiguous nature of the Fairgrounds development plan. We need to enforce our 4-hour minimum use rule, as other facilities do. We are going to meet soon with other facilities to network on rates and rental policies at the State Fair.

Chairman Lyle Spiesschaert calls for a motion to adopt the proposed rate increase table. Rich Vial moves that the Fair Board adopt the facility rate increases effective July 1, 1999 as proposed. Kathy Christy seconds, the motion carries.

DuPre' mentions that she is working on advertising for the Entertainment Guide with a date of getting it out by June 1st, also with target dates of April 1st as our reservation deadline, with copy in by April 15, and go to press by mid- May. Kathy Christy asks what the cost of an add is, she suggests some alternatives in soliciting selective adds as with a one liner with a persons name in the Guide. Staff says that they will into that suggestion.

- 8. Maintenance Report: Jim Jordan gives report. The painting in the ME and Cloverleaf building is just about wrapped up. Mike Wold has gotten in all the bids for the trimming of the trees. We have been addressing several bad drain problems. Two major drainage problems are in front of our most publicly used buildings. From the looks of Lisa's schedule, it appears that our set-up team is going to be very busy. Jordan has been maintaining and repairing electrical services in the facilities.
- 9. Old Business: _(A) AOC/OFA proposed legislative bill update. McKinley says that the bill has not been given a reading yet. Garza mentions being at a meeting of Hillsboro public schools with Charles Starr, Bruce Star and Jim Hill. They briefed her that the funding for fairs will probably be authorized. The issue is at what level the monies will be available. The low figure is \$44,000 for all fairs or \$50,000. Cal Wade mentioned a discussion with Denny Holmes in which he told him that the Linn County initiative was dropped from the bill with AOC and OFA agreeing to delete that portion. (B) Garza mentions the meeting she had in gathering preliminary information from "Western World" personnel concerning the Crop trailer controversy. Also that she has to have a couple more meetings in which to draw this issue and it's elements all together.

10. New Business: (A) Marty Rowe presentation: makes a presentation of marketing logos, jingles and other fair identifiers in marketing for the Fair. This in response to the Bob Friedman report suggestion of invigorating our image. Fair Board makes comments and suggestions and is positive about what they see and hear. Discussion about sponsorship and the possibility of Pepsi putting up an electronic sign for advertising space and signage. Discussion about the jingle, logo, colors and design and it's application in letterhead, graphics, and communication of all kinds that represents the Fair and accentuates the "identity" of the Fair Complex, not just a Fairgrounds.(B) Mission statement; Kathy Christy revises for correction in making an addition to commitment, to; "life long learning, , with a special emphasis on youth" also, "provide a welcoming environment for all volunteers". Garza asks for those additions and corrections in writing. Garza mentions that she has given a copy of the mission statement draft to all staff members (and Rodeo) but the Boosters she had not, but will tonight. Further corrections and modifications made. (C) Upgrade of the ME building, Garza gives an analysis, mentions letter received by the architects indicating that with an earthquake there would be substantial damage. Garza to gather additional information and identify the costs to mitigate or lessen the liability in upgrading the facility, estimates over \$150.000. Garza inquires whether the Fair Board wants to make further repairs to this building or not given the anticipated expense, or do we wait for the/a development plan to be implemented. Spiesschaert want to know if we are within code on this building. Vial refers to language that shows that we are, but asks if the building were to fail, is there any reference to just "how" it will fail? A catastrophic failure would be viewed much differently than a gradual degrading of the building in case of an earthquake or emergency. Cal Wade mentions a scenario that has the walls going out first. (D) 4-H stall update. Garza mentions concerns brought forward by Sandy Baker at our request. Sandy Baker give analysis of what interested parties including the horse advisory committee, brought forward in their suggestions on what the stalls should be like. Would like whatever, the new scheme to be in place for this year, given that we have not ordered portable stalls for this year. Will have 125 horses here this year. Portable stalls were extremely hot and we refunded monies last year for those who did not want their animals exposed to those conditions. Panels and plywood "box stalls" are a compromise solution. Spiesschaert stress the need for multi-use with any proposed stalls, and the fronts be visible to the public. Baker explains the delivery schedule of the various companies that would provide these stalls, and the difficulty in meeting the demands of those exhibitors in the 4-H horse advisory committee. Spiesschaert asks if Baker would leave her gathered information. There are several questions to be answered, such as storage

for these new stalls. Spiesschaert asks that staff come back with a proposal as to what we do at the next Board meeting. Vial sees multi-use possibilities but cautions as to safety being implemented in that varied use. General discussion.

Spiesschaert mentions the scheduled joint meeting on the Fair Complex project development. He advises that we, along with the City of Hillsboro, present a joint press release relating the status of the project, and indicating what is next to come.

Chairman Lyle Spiesschaert adjourns the meeting by acclamation at 6:50 PM

Dear Ms. Garza:

Over a period of years, I have been involved in investigating options for upgrading the strength of and inspecting the Exhibit Hall Building at the Washington County Fairplex. This letter is intended to provide an overview of what has been done to date, our opinions as to the seismic weaknesses of the Exhibit Hall structure, and some suggestions and rough cost estimates for upgrade or replacement of the building. Prior to writing this letter, I visited the building again on March 19th and met with Earl Bemis. We walked the interior and exterior perimeters of the building and looked at the condition of the concrete masonry unit (CMU) walls, paying particular attention to areas where we had inspected earlier cracks and where Earl had previously installed crack monitors.

Our walk-thru of the building did not reveal any significant changes from previous conditions which were observed. There does appear to be continuing movement of the building, most likely due to continued settlement in certain areas of the structure. Since the exterior walls of the building do not contain any steel reinforcement, settlement of the soils under the foundations result in visible cracks in the masonry walls. Reinforcement is now always provided in masonry and concrete walls since those walls are very weak in tension capacity, and the reinforcement will hold the masonry together when it is subjected to tension stresses (such as differential settlements in different locations along the length of a wall). The Exhibit Hall structure CMU is typically cracked near the top at all outside corners of the building. Those cracks have been in place for quite some time, along with vertical cracks in the walls at varying locations around the building. We believe that the only reinforced masonry in the building is contained in bond beams (reinforced and grouted masonry sections above openings) above the overhead door openings.

The masonry is cracked at the ends of those reinforced bond beams where the reinforced section meets the unreinforced wall. None of the cracks observed suggest that a structural failure is imminent in the building, unless the building is subjected to severe ground shaking from a significant earthquake in this area. The cracks <u>do</u> weaken the structure from its original constructed strength, and the original design of the structure was not adequate for current seismic codes. Unreinforced masonry is no longer allowed in the building code.

In 1995, when working at VLMK Engineers, I prepared a set of calculations and drawings for reinforcement of the exterior and interior walls of the Exhibit Hall Building. That reinforcement primarily consisted of installing new Simpson steel straps in the roof structure to provide crossties between the exterior walls of the building at the roof level; strengthening interior and exterior masonry walls against seismic failure out-of-plane (perpendicular to the face of the wall); bracing the tops of the walls where they meet upper framed walls in the roof structure and a "hinge" is present in the wall; and constructing new shear (bracing in-plane) walls at the interior crosswalls (which would be sheathed with plywood). The reinforcement of the exterior walls was to be constructed on the interior face of the building, and we understand that you are also interested in options for reinforcement which would be applied from the exterior of the building. Advantages of that system would be less disruption to events inside the structure, and reduced loss of interior leaseable floor space, since the crosswalls would be the only walls requiring interior reinforcement work.

The 1994 building code which was in effect in 1995 when the previous design was made, has been replaced with a 1997 version. That 1997 code was adopted by Oregon in October of 1998. The current code would require an increase of approximately 60% in the design forces for the masonry walls out-of-plane, and a corresponding increase in the forces required to attach the walls to the roof structure.

Our previous design for the Exhibit Hall reinforcement did not include strengthening of the roof diaphragm (horizontal element, typically plywood, that spans between bracing walls and carries horizontal loads from the roof into those walls). Although the Exhibit Hall roof diaphragm is inadequate for current codes, that is typically not one of the critical failure areas that has been observed in recent earthquakes. Therefore, strengthening diaphragms is usually a lower priority than unreinforced walls and bracing/attachments of those walls. The work required to make the Exhibit Hall completely compliant with current codes would be very extensive, and would involve installing a cross bracing system in the ceiling space or adding plywood sheathing on the majority of the roof structure, as well as providing new structural systems at all unreinforced masonry walls (which would replace the function of the masonry walls as lateral load resisting elements and reinforce them to prevent failure out-of-plane or in-plane).

Prior to preparing the drawings and engineering that were done in 1995, we had provided a letter in April of 1995 that listed several options for reinforcing the walls for out-of-plane forces. We understand that several contractors looked at that letter and provided rough estimates for the cost of reinforcing the building per those systems. The first option listed was adding interior/exterior steel tubes or wide flange columns at 4'-0" on center; the second was reinforcing the existing walls by cutting open the CMU and installing reinforcement, then grouting them; the third was installing an external steel stud wall which would be attached to the CMU and covered with a siding; and the fourth would be providing external reinforcing bars and anchors and spraying a Shotcrete skin onto the CMU. The second and fourth options were not preferred by any of the contractors, and based on comments, we prepared the drawings using Option 3 (on the interior face of the building). An additional method, which I discussed with Earl at the site last week, could be to install a steel framework on the exterior which is provided by a metal building manufacturer, with connections between the metal building framing and the existing CMU, and a metal siding on the exterior.

Based on increased design loads and inflation, the estimates received from contractors in 1995 could be expected to be 75 to 100% higher for a similar design upgraded to current code. Based on a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) December, 1994 Publication on Typical Costs for Seismic Rehabilitation of Existing Buildings, the cost for a full upgrade to current code for this building, including roof structure, could be as high as \$15.00 or more per square foot. For a limited upgrade such as that previously detailed, assume between \$5.00 and \$10.00 per square foot. We spoke with a representative of Engineered Structures, Inc., a contractor and supplier for Butler Metal Buildings, and were given a square foot cost of approximately \$12.00 for a new rigid frame metal building of similar size. Since this building's floor area is approximately 25,000 square feet, upgrade costs to the existing building range from approximately \$125,000 to \$375,000. The cost of a new building shell with a slab would be approximately \$312,000. Cost of tenant improvements, such as bathrooms, kitchen, interior lighting and HVAC, finishes, etc., would add to that cost.

I would be glad to meet with you and/or the Fairplex Board to discuss the condition of the Exhibit Hall and available options for strengthening or replacing the building. Please call if you have any questions or if you would like me to attend the Board Meeting.

Thank you for meeting with me on Monday to discuss the Finance Division's cash management and investment services and the impact of closing your State of Oregon Local Government Investment Pool account as discussed in a February 9, 1999 memo to you from Alan Rappleyea (attached).

All funds entrusted with the County Treasurer are deposited immediately and invested in accordance with the County Investment Policy, the primary objective of which is the preservation of capital and the protection of investment principal. Additionally, the policy requires the all funds be invested in a manner to earn appropriate yields with minimum risk, meet the liquidity needs of the County and other agencies, and comply with Oregon law.


We use the LGIP published earnings rate to benchmark the performance of the County's investment portfolio. The County's portfolio yield is very close to that of the LGIP. A three year historical comparison shows the County portfolio to have consistently yielded within plus or minus 15 basis points of the LGIP.


The County's cash management practices are designed to provide flexibility over the withdrawal and disbursements of funds. Our standard accounts payable procedures result in checks issued within three days of submission of a payment request. In addition, we have the ability to issue same day manual checks when normal processing cannot accommodate a legal or emergency need as defined in the County's Fiscal Administration Manual.


As an alternative to the standard accounts payable process, disbursements may also be made by electronic funds transfer when requested and accompanied by appropriate authorization and documentation.






