The closing hour on Sunday, August 30, for removal of exhibits was discussed. It was decided, after discussion that all livestock exhibits would be permitted to be removed at 4:00 p.m., and exhibits in the exhibit buildings at 8:00 p.m.

Joe VanDyke was present and said the Washington County Riders were working and planning on putting in the fence at the race track, and that the lumber had been donated for the fence. The horse show and racing were discussed, and it was decided that Saturday nite would be the best time for this part of the program, and that on Sunday afternoon would be a fun-afternoon, however, a charge would be made Saturday nite.

Motion was made by Abts, seconded by Sahnaw and carried, that for this year the Washington County Riders take over the management of the horse show and furnish their own help, etc., and that all proceeds go into the Rider's funds for racetrack purposes, and that the admission fee for Saturday nite be 50¢.

It was again decided to designate one day each for Beef and Dairy Cattle, with ribbons as prizes, the exhibits to be as follows:

Wednesday, August 26,	Beef and Dual Purpose
Thursday, " 27,	Guernsey
Friday, " 28,	Holstein
Saturday, " 29,	Jersey

Harry McConnel, Supervisor in the Poultry Department for this year was present and stated that he would like to help to make this department make a better showing this year.

It was decided that the only building left at the old fair grounds which had been used for poultry should be moved to the new grounds and used for that purpose.

Ted Rohwer reported he had contacted the Skyline Bus owner, Mr. McGinn regarding operation of bus to the fair grounds and that he asked \$30.00 per day. Motion was made by Abts and seconded by Sahnaw that we engage the bus for the five days which would amount to \$150.00, and that the charge for bus fares should be 15¢ per person to be collected by driver and turned over to the fair board. Motion carried.

Mrs. Shearer, supervisor of Farm Crops had asked that under Class 6 "Oddities and Monstrosities" - No. 9. be allowed 3 classes, listed -

Most unusual - grain
vegetable
horticulture, each to carry a
prize of .75¢ and .50¢. Motion was made by Sahnaw and seconded by Abts that
this addition be made to the premium book. Motion carried.

There being no further business the meeting stood adjourned.
