FAIR BOARD MEETING.

THURSDAY EVENING, AUGUST 9, 1934.

A meeting of the Fair Board of the Washington County Fair was held at the home of Henry Hesse on the above date, with all members of the board present. After a sumptious Rhode Island chicken dinner the board meeting was called to order by Chairman Banks.

In the absence of the minutes of the previous meeting the reading of the same was deferred until the next meeting.

The manager reported that the Farmers Union had decided to hold a picnic on Friday, and as entertainment would furnish a game of baseball between Cedar Mills and Blooming which would be the championship decision for the second half of the season.

It was ordered that the record book which the secretary had ordered should be paid for on receipt of the same from the revolving fund.

The printing of the catalogue was given to the Argus.

The request of the Future Farmers for the concession in the Grange Building upon a 50-50 basis was granted.

Manager Minton reported in the matter of further concessions that a firm from Portland was figuring on these on a 25% cut of the gross receipts from the same, and it was ordered accepted if proper arrangements were made.

The matter of a band was taken up, and the report that a band made up of Washington County musicians desired to have the dance concession and would furnish the music for the afternoon and evening for the privilege of this concession. The same was accepted by the board.

The manager was instructed to obtain a list of the ribbons needed.

The following Granges had reported as being ready to put on an exhibit: Scholls, Aloha, Cedar Mill, Forest Grove and Hillsboro.

The board unanimously agreed that no beer or spiritous liquors or alcoholic drinks should be allowed upon the grounds.

Mr. Haverstack was reported as being desirous of obtaining the pomy concession upon a 25% payment, which was granted.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
