The Washington County Fair Board met at the U. S. National Bank with all members present.

Also present, representing the Tualatin Rabbit Breeders Association, were Mr. and Mrs. MacDonald and Mr. and Mrs. West, asking for the use of the fair buildings for the annual rabbit show on May 14 and 15. They were granted the use of the buildings.

Discussion was had concerning the loaning of the bleachers to various groups and after discussion it was felt that it was necessary to realize enough rental on them to keep them in repair, therefore, motion was made by Sahnw seconded by Abts and carried that the sum of \$25.00 be charged to any organization using the bleachers.

The matter of paying rental on adding machine for approximately five months of the year was brought up by the Secretary, who reported the Hillsboro Office Supply would allow three months paid as rent (\$7.50)each month, or the sum of \$22.50 to apply on the purchase price of \$90.00 and the balance ~~of~~ after current \$7.50 due (\$60.00) to be paid in 12 monthly installments of \$5.69 each, which would enable the Fair Board to own an adding maching.

Motion was made by Sahnw and seconded by Abts and carried that this be done.

After the meeting movies of previous fairs were shown by Mr. Abts and were very interesting and enjoyed by all.

There being no further business the meeting stood adjourned.




