Earl Simantel and Alvin Harse were present in the interest of the Swine Breeders and relative to the account on the building of the barn. A complete

listing was ordered given them and it was found some credit was not given them by the T. V. Coop which they would obtain. (A complete accounting was made up) .

Mr. Bill Lormor was present - just interested in attending he said.

Lloyd Koehler, accountant of A. L. Amacher was present explaining various points in the recent audit and impressing the points of receipts on all metters pertaining to transfer of money and contracts on booths showing smount paid, bal, etc. Also he volunteered information relative to correct accounting methods on the racing- suggested the fair board have their own tickets, passes, etc., keeping a check on this part of the adtivities at the fair grounds.
